Generation No. 1

1. FREDERICK¹ BYER, SR.¹ was born December 20, 1732 in Germany², and died February 19, 1801 in Antrim Twp, Franklin Co, PA, aged 68y 1m 30d, (just north of Frederick Co, MD, interred Byer Cemetery, Antrim, Franklin Co, PA². He married (1) MARGARET HOCHLANDER. He married (2) ANNA MARGARET MOYER Abt. 1756 in prob. PA. She was born February 22, 1738/39, and died September 24, 1812 in Antrim, Franklin Co, PA, aged 73y 7m, 2d, interred Byer Cemetery, Antrim, Franklin Co, PA.

Notes for FREDERICK BYER, SR.: The surname Byer is also seen as Byers, Bayer, Baier, Boyer, and Beyer. I am still sorting out all of these families. It appears, however, that in the written documents available online, my ancestors are consistently listed as Byer or Byers, except in the DAR index it is spelled Boyer.

Frederick was born in Germany and came to America in 1740 with his mother and father (perhaps Philip Byer), who died during the voyage (Bell, 1898). Franklin Co, PA (formed 1784 from Cumberland) is located just north of Frederick Co, MD. The Scots-Irish were the first settlers in the area, but they were followed by a wave of German Settlers. The French and Indian War began in 1755, and all settlements in Washington Co. MD came under attack from Indians. I have not been able to find out about the effects of the war in Frederick Co. located right next to Washington Co. Frederick Byer was in Maryland in 1758 (source needed). In 1753, war broke out in the Cumberland Valley (Franklin Co. located there). Was this why they left PA for Maryland? He was in Pennsylvania by 1786, when he, and his son, appeared on a list of taxables in Franklin Co, PA.

Frederick served as a Private under Capt. John Jack and Col. James Johnston in American Revolution between 1780 and 1782 (source: *American Revolutionary Soldiers of Franklin Co, PA*). Papers are housed in the Pennsylvania Archives, 5th Ser. Vol. 6, p. 75, 114, 130, 540. I also reviewed the records for the four descendants who are DAR members through Frederick Boyer, Sr., Ancestor #A013114.

1790 US Census, no surnames of Byer, Byers or Byars appear, however, a Frederick Birse is shown in Franklin County. This, could also be Frederick I, his father, as the family is large and 4 males 16 and over are tallied (Frederick II is 32; Frederick I is 58).

1800 census, Greencastle, Franklin Co, PA: Frederick Byer (age 45+) with 1 boy (under 10), 1 male (10-15), 2 males (16-25), 1 male (45+); 1 girl (under 10), 1 girl (10-15), 1 female (16-25), 1 woman (45+).

The following from Ancestry.com, Wilhelm Family Tree by Ijwilhelm: Frederick II (and I) served in the Cumberland County Militia during the Revolutionary War, under Captains John Jack and Thomas Johnston. Both Frederick II and Frederick I have Revolutionary War Military Abstract Cards listing them in the Company of Capt. John Jack in the spring of 1779.

Frederick Byers, Jr. (and Sr.) is listed in the 1786 Taxables list for Franklin County, PA, Antrim Township.

Frederick II married (before 1798), Rosena Elizabeth Lantz, second child, and only daughter, of Christian and Elizabeth Lantz, born in 1760. Frederick II and Rosena witnessed the will of John Hauk, blacksmith, of Antrim Township in November 1798.

In the 1800 US Census a Fredr Byer is listed in Green Castle, Franklin County, the family includes 3 males 26-44 (Frederick II is 42), 1 female 26-44 (Rosena is 40), 2 females under 10 (daughter, Rosena is 2). A number of other children are not identified.

Upon the death of his father in October 1800, Frederick II received as his inheritance the plantation on which he then lived, joining lands of John Gearhart and others. Sometime after 1800, Frederick II moved to Bedford County, PA. In the 1810 US Census, a Frederick Byers is shown in Antrim, Franklin County, again with a large family. A male 45 and over could be Frederick II, and a female 45 and over could be Rosena, his wife, but no female 10-15 is tallied, so his daughter, Rosena (12) is not accounted for. Also in 1810, a Frederick Bugers (the original census form could be interpreted as Buyers) is listed in Providence, Bedford County, PA. This family includes a male 45 and over, a female 45 and over, and a female 10-15. Others tallied are not identified.

Rosena Elizabeth (Lantz) Byer died in 1818, aged 57. Her burial place has not been located.

In 1819, Frederick Byer and Jacob Hill are named in a Bedford County Court Record (judgment for a debt). This establishes Frederick II in Bedford County and links him with Jacob Hill, the husband of his daughter, Rosena Elizabeth (Byer).

In the 1820 US Census, a Frederick Boyers is listed in Napier, Bedford County, PA. The small family includes 2 males 45 and over (Frederick is 62) and others not identified.

Will of Frederick Byer Sr.

Frederick Byer Sr. of Antrim Twp. dated October 15, 1800, proved March 19, 1801. Wife Margaret one-third of all moveable property and one hundred sixty-five pounds: son Frederick the plantation wheron he now lives joining lands of John Gearhart and others: daughter Catherine, who is married to Tobias Steaman, four hundred fifty pounds and one-half of a plantation in Westmoreland County: daughter Elizabeth, who is married to Gabriel Carpenter, four hundred fifty pounds and one -half of a certain plantation in Westmoreland County; sons Jacob and John; Frederick Fehl, who was married to daughter Eve, five shillings; George Hochlander, who was married to my daughter Margaret and who died without issue, five shillings; Godlip Yeider, who was married to my daughter Feronica and who died without issue, five shillings; the plantation on which I now live, joining lands of John Irwin, Andrew Snively, Esq. and others to son Jacob; Plantation lying in the Great Cove, joining lands of John Smith, William Hunter and others to son John; grandson Andrew Fehl, only child of daughter Eve, three hundred pounds.

Frederick is buried in Byers-Hoke Graveyard, Antrim Twp, Franklin Co, PA (source: *American Revolutionary Soldiers of Franklin Co, PA*, p. 253, Call Number 974.844, page photocopied by Mary H. West; Author - Hatcher (1987). *Graves of Revolutionary War Patriots, Vol. 1 A-D*, p. 143, Call Number 973.34, page photocopied by Mary H. West). Also verified by Ann Library, Kittochtinny Historical Society, 8 Nov 2003.

The Kittochtinny Historical Society sent me information about his burial in the Byers-Hoke graveyard; they show his wife as Anna Margaretta - no last name given. This could be Margaret Hochlander. Theory: The following families that intermarried lived in Lancaster Co, PA and Washington Co, MD: Byer, Hochlander, Zeigler, and Lantz. Were they also neighbors in Germany? Frederick could be the son of Phillip Byers, who arrived from Rotterdam in America on 1738 on the ship, "Winter Galley," along with Jan Jacob Beyer, Heinrich Fehl, and Hans Michael Hochlander.

2. FREDERICK² BYER, JR. (*FREDERICK*¹) was born February 11, 1758 in Frederick Co, MD, and died January 1823 in PA, prob. Napier Twp, Bedford County. He married ROSENA ELIZABETH LANTZ Abt. 1785 in prob. MD, daughter of CHRISTIAN LANTZ and ELIZABETH. She was born August 13, 1760 in Lancaster Co, PA?, and died 1818 in Antrim, Franklin Co, PA, age 57.

Notes for FREDERICK BYER, JR.: Frederick was born in Frederick Co, MD which was created in 1748 from Prince Georges and Baltimore Counties (need source). This implies that his father was one of the earliest settlers in Frederick Co. In March 1723, a Maryland Proclamation announced special land prices for settlers. He may be the Frederick Byers, Jr. who served under Col. James Johnston, 1780 - 1782. Frederick Byer, Jr. is listed on the 1786 taxables list for Franklin Co, PA. He was of Antrim Twp, Franklin Co, PA and was probably a blacksmith, like his father. Need to discover when and why he moved to Bedford Co, Pennsylvania. Did he receive western PA land in return for his service? Frederick and Rosanna Byers served as witnesses for the will of John Hauk of Antrim Twp, blacksmith on 26 Nov 1798 (source: Wills: Abstract and Letters of Administration, Franklin Co, PA, on USGenWeb Archives, 2002, by Carolyn K. Shearer). This indicates they moved to western PA after 1798.

Bedford County, PA Court Record #05578 , Photocopied by M.L. Cook, June 2009, Transcribed by M.L. Cook on 31 July 2010

To all people to whom these presents shall come I George Mullin Esquire High Sheriff of the county of Bedford in the commonwealth of Pennsylvania send greetings. Whereas Isabella Reed for the use of Solomon Sparks, lately in the County Court of Common Pleas, holden at Bedford for the County of Bedford before the Judges of the same court, to wit, on the ninth day of February in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and nineteen upon the report of arbitrators obtained judgment against **Jacob Hill and Frederick Byer** as well for a certain debt of one hundred and four dollars and sixty five cents, as forty two dollars and sixty cents which was adjudged in the same court to the said Isabella for her costs sustained by occasion of the detension of that debt and whereas Robert _____ for the use of George Henry lately in the County Court of Common Pleas holden at Bedford for the County of Bedford before the judges of the same court to wit at November term in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty one by the judges of the same court did recover against Abraham Devebaugh executor of John Devebaugh deceased as well a certain debt of sixty six dollars ninety one and a half cents as also eight dollars and sixty three cents which to the said Robert were adjudged in the same court for his costs _____.

And whereas the President and Managers of the Chambersburg and Bedford Turnpike Road Company lately in the County Court of Common Pleas held at Bedford for the County of Bedford before the judges of the same court to wit at April term in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty one by the Judgment of the same court did recover against Ann Snively and William Hartley Executors of the last will of Jacob Snively deceased as well a certain debt of three hundred and sixty seven dollars and two cents as also four dollars and seventy seven and three fourths cents which to the said Company were adjudged for its costs. And whereas afterwards by a court of the Commonwealth afore said officer fascias issued out of the Court of Common Pleas aforesaid _____ the tenth day of Novemia Anno Domine one thousand eight hundred and twenty one and to George W. Barker Esquire then high sheriff of the said County of Bedford directed he was commanded that of the goods and chattels lands and _____ents of **Jacob Hill and Frederick Byer** the defendants in the first above recited judgment, in his bailiwick he should caused to be made a hired as well the said debt of one hundred and four dollars and sixty five cents as the said forty two dollars and sixty cents of costs which the said Isabella Reed for the use of Solomon Sparks had recovered against the said **Jacob Hill and Frederick Byer** as aforesaid and that he should have that money Before the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas aforesaid on the first Monday of January then next to render the said Solomon Sparks in the said writ named and the said writ. To which the said Sheriff _____ in the said court that by virtue of the said writ to him directed he had seized and taken in execution all the right title and interest of **Frederick Byer** of in and to one tract of land situate in Providence Township in snake spring valley containing sixty one acres and three fourths of an acre be the same more or less adjoining land Dewalt Syinger Simon Stooky and _____

ML Note: This is the first document I've found that links Frederick Byer and Jacob Hill. Frederick's daughter Rosena Elizabeth Byer married Jacob Hill. This also documents that Frederick Byer, Jr. was in Bedford Co, PA at least by 9 Feb 1819. Land records need to be searched for Frederick.

1810 census, Antrim, Franklin, Pennsylvania: 1 male (age 10-15); 1 male - Frederick (age 26-44); 1 female (age 10-15); 1 female - Rosena (age 26-44).

1820 census, Antrim, Franklin, Pennsylvania: 2 males (aged 10-15); 1 male (age 16-18); 1 male - (age 26-44); 1 male (age 45+); 1 female (age 16-25). Note that Frederick's wife does not appear to be listed so she is presumed dead before 1820.

Frederick Byer of Napier Twp. - Will mentions: daughter, Rosina Hill; the children of daughter Rosina; grandson Frederick Byer Hill; nephew John Boyer (son of his brother, John); friend John Baird; 400 acre tract in Indiana Co. to brother, John; all demands due from the estate of Jacob Snively. The executors were friends John Smith of Napier Twp. and George Burd, Esq. of Bedford. Witnesses were James Williams and Elijah Adams. The will was dated Jan. 21, 1823 and proved Feb. 6, 1823 (Source: Bedford County, Pa. Will Book #2, p. 86).

Frederick II died in January 1823, aged 64. His will shows him to be of Napier, Bedford County, PA and is dated January 21, 1823, proved February 6, 1823. No information about his burial location has been found.

Notes for ROSENA ELIZABETH LANTZ: *History of Leitersburg* by Bell (1898) shows that Rosanna married Frederick Boyer (could be Beyer). Her death date is estimated from census records.

4. ELIZABETH² BYER (*FREDERICK*¹) was born July 10, 1762 in PA, and died November 18, 1806 in Franklin Co, PA, age 44y 4m, interred Byer (Hokes) Cemetery near Greencastle, PA. She married GABRIEL CARPENTER 1783 in Franklin Co, PA, son of DANIEL CARPENTER and MARY HERR. He was born 1757 in Lancaster Co, PA⁴, and died April 1808 in PA, interred Byer Cemetery near Greencastle, Franklin Co, PA.

Notes for GABRIEL CARPENTER: His father Daniel died intestate when Gabriel was quite young. His mother Mary Herr then married Peter Good and the family moved to Franklin Co.(Cumberland Co.) Gabriel was a Revolutionary War Vet, who served as a private under Captains John Jack, Thomas Johnston, and James Poe 1778-80-81-82. In Engle's Notes he is listed on Roll of 3rd Co., 8th Battalion, Cumberland Co. Militia, James Poe, Captain-in service latter part of 1777 to at least 1778, suffering severe losses. Gabriel was the only child of Daniel Carpenter and Mary Herr and inherited his father's property. A deed in 1783 shows Gabriel Carpenter and his wife Elizabeth, of Antrim Twp, Cumberland Co. selling 340 acres in Earl Twp., Lancaster Co. to a John Kurtz. Franklin became a county 9-9-1784 from Cumberland. According to the 1800 Federal Census, Elizabeth and Gabriel had 7 children. In the Hoke/Byer cemetery in Greencastle PA, there is a Government stone erected thru efforts of Franklin County Chapter D.A.R. "In memory of Elizabeth Byer, consort of Gabriel Carpenter, who departed this life 17th Nov,1806, aged 44 years 4 months." (source: Stewart Eshleman, 2003). They are both buried in Hoke/Byer Cemetery, Greencastle, Franklin Co, PA (source: Stewart, Ruth, Rootsweb Message - Carpenter/Byer, 10 June 2002).

5. EVE² BYER (*FREDERICK*¹) was born Abt. 1767, and died October 1794 in Conestoga, Lancaster, PA. She married FREDERICK FEHL. He was born Abt. 1766, and died Aft. 1820.

Notes for FREDERICK FEHL: Frederick is probably the son of Henrich Fehl, who came to America in 1738 on the ship, "Winter Galley," as did Phillip Beyers. He could also be the son of Andreas Fehl who was born about 1730.

Notes for JACOB BYER: The Jacob Byer line is from the DAR Records for Frederick Boyer, Sr., Ancestor #A013114. 1800 census, Green Castle, Franklin, Pennsylvania

He married (1) CATHERINE STUDY 1803 in Washington Co, MD, daughter of CHRISTIAN STUDY and MARY LONG. She was born Abt. 1784, and died Abt. 1807. He married (2) ELIZABETH LANTZ August 24, 1809 in Washington Co, MD⁷, daughter of CHRISTIAN LANTZ and ELIZABETH. She was born Abt. 1785 in Leitersburg District, MD, and died January 27, 1841 in MD, age 51, interred St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church Cemetery⁸.

Notes for JOHN BYER, CAPTAIN: There is a record in the Maryland State Archives, Chancery Papers for 16 June 1824, the case of Williard vs Lantz, concerning the Estate of Jacob Rit. John served as a Captain of Militia during the War of 1812.

"Captain John Byer was born in Lancaster County, Pa., January 31, 1777, the son of Frederick and Anna Margaret (Moyer) Byer. Frederick Byer was born in Germany, December 20, 1732, and came to America in 1740 with his mother, his father having died on the voyage. He died on the 19th of February, 1801. Captain Byer probably became a resident of Washington County about the year 1800. In 1803 he married Catharine Study, and two children were born to them: Anna Margaret, who married William E. Doyle, and Frederick. Their mother having died, he married in 1809 Elizabeth, daughter of Christian Lantz, who inherited from her father the mill property near Leitersburg subsequently owned by Fowler & Ziegler. Here Captain Byer engaged extensively in milling and distilling; he also operated a tannery and other industries. In the local militia he held the rank of captain, and in the War of 1812 marched as far as Boonsboro with his company. After disposing of his property at Leitersburg he removed to Hagerstown, where he owned the Antietam House, a hotel that occupied the present site of the Hotel Hamilton. He died in that city on the 12th of February, 1859. Captain Byer was a member of the Lutheran Church (Bell, 1898, p. 274).

1850 census, Hagerstown, Washington Co, MD: Capt. Byers (68) lived with his daughter, Margaret and her husband, William E. Doyle. Occupation was "none" and he had property worth \$2000.

He was born March 17, 1781 in Bedford Co, PA, and died July 25, 1845 in Bedford Co, PA, age 65, buried in Trinity Reformed Cemetery, Glade Pike Rd, Juniata Twp, Bedford Co, PA.

Notes for ROSENA ELIZABETH BYER:

1850 census - not yet found.

Rosena's 3 youngest children lived with their older brother John L. in 1850. Rosena was probably living with one of her children in Iowa when she died, but it is not known when she moved to Iowa.

Notes for FREDERICK CHARLES DOYLE, M.D.: "Dr. Frederick Charles Doyle, for seventeen years a practicing physician in Clear Spring and vicinity, was born near Hagerstown, Nov. 24, 1839. His paternal ancestors were among the pioneers of that section of Pennsylvania known as Path Valley, and, according to tradition, were more than once compelled to abandon their homes for the shelter of Fort Carlisle, by reason of Indian incursions into the settlement. Dr. Doyle's great-great-grandfather was a captain under Gen. Braddock, and assisted in founding the pioneer Catholic Church of Path Valley. His maternal grandfather, John Byer, was a captain in the war of 1812. The Byers came from Prussia at an early day, and located in Lancaster County, Pa., where the family became widely prominent. Their two surviving sons are Dr. Doyle, of Clear Spring, and John E. Doyle, of California. Dr. Doyle received his early education at Mount St. Mary's College, attended a course of medical lectures at the University of Maryland, and graduated at that institution in March, 1859. His first field of practice was Bradford County, Pa., where he remained from 1860 to 1865, when he changed his location to Clear Springs, where he has been in active practice ever since. His circuit in Pennsylvania was a large one, and embraced portions of Bedford and Fulton Counties. Journeys of from sixty to seventy-five miles were frequent experiences in his early professional career. By unflagging energy and skill in his profession Dr. Doyle has risen to a conspicuous place among the physicians of Washington County. He was married, April 19, 1871, to Laura, daughter of Henry McLaughlin, of Franklin County. He has never held a public office and has never aspired to one, his professional duties engaging all his time and attention" (Scharf, 1882, pp. 1244-1245).

During his residence in Lecompton of thirty three years, he was a constant friend of Lane University and was, for many years, a member of the board of trustees. He was also called upon to fill numerous offices in the city and county governments." Frederick B. Hill is listed as a postmaster in Lecompton in 1865.

Notes for JOHN LANTZ HILL: John and Susan were members of the Cherry Mound United Brethren Church. John left PA and settled in Anderson Co, KS in about 1857, according to Juanita Kellerman.

1850 census, Harrison, Bedford Co, PA: John L. (25) and Susan (21) Hill with children Irwin (3), and Mary E. (5 mos). Three of John's younger siblings lived with him in 1850: Ann Marie Hill (12), Sophia (10), and Daniel M. (16). Where was his mother?

1860 census, Reeder, Anderson Co, Kansas: John Hill (35), Susan (31), Erwin (13), May (11), Dorathy (9), James (7), Amanda (3).

1870 census, Garnett PO, Reeder, Anderson Co, KS: Jn. S. Hill (46), wife Susan (42) and son Irwin (25). Property was valued at \$5,000 and \$3350. Why was Irwin's wife and children listed next door with Mary Ellen McGahey's family? John's property was valued at \$5000 and \$3350. Next door: Mary E. McGahey (20) with Frankie (20) and Hill children: Dorothy (15), Jas. H. (15), Amanda (12), Sarah (6), Augustus (3), and Esther (21). Mary E. had property valued at \$3000 and \$1140.

Green, who did historical work in Osage County, Kansas for the Kansas State Historical Society. He wrote this about Lewis Kellerman: "he tells how he was postillion on a horse railway from Baltimore to Frederick City, Md., later the Baltimore & Ohio railroad; was also a freighter on the United States national road, from Cumberland to Indianapolis. This talk was in 1901, shortly before his death, at the age of eighty-nine."

Note: A little over a month after this census was taken, Mary Ellen Hill Halferty married James B. Tipton, who lived in the Dry Ridge area of Londonderry Twp, which touches on Harrison Twp to the north. I was not able to identify the exact location of Dry Ridge but was told it was near West End, which is in Juniata Twp very near the border with Somerset Co, PA. Did Ellen and James Tipton attend the same church? Her father was buried at Trinity Reformed Church on Glade Pike, in Juniata Twp, so it's reasonable to assume she also attended church there.

Notes for CORNELIUS DANIEL HELFERTY: According to a family history, Daniel's occupation was Mattress Maker. He died of Tuberculosis.

Notes for JAMES B. "JIM" TIPTON: In her "Hill Family History," Hazel Keim Warner wrote, Jim's father was a farmer, and the "advantages of schooling were meager for all of the youth of their day. They attended a log school house with a huge fireplace in one end. The seats were made from logs split in two parts with holes bored for legs. The terms were from two and half to three months. They studied arithmetic, spelling, writing, and used the Bible as textbook for reading. The teacher's wages were from 9 - 10 dollars per month. The teacher was congenial enough to board around among his patrons most of the time. To these same rude structures used for instruction of the children, the people would gather to hear the earnest circuit rider preach the word of God." Jim and Ellen set up housekeeping at the Beckonire place (Hyndman, PA?). They built a house that stood along the road, that is now gone. "Grandfather [James B] Tipton moved to Hyndman, Bedford County, PA when he was a young man (about 1845) and lived there for 16 years before bringing his family overland in a covered wagon with two teams and effects to Northern Illinois in 1863. Family legend holds that before they left Bedford County, he told his sons to put their ears to the ground to hear the guns of Gettysburg. He sold property on February 10, 1860 in Harrison Twp, Bedford Co, PA for \$1300.00 (source: Bedford County PA Courthouse Records, Records Office, Deed located in 1973 by Helen Tipton Ritchey). They moved west to avoid the fighting of the Civil War, and they moved on to Anderson County, Kansas in 1865. It is said that Jim was the first settler in Westphalia (source: Jeane Tipton). The year 1874 is known in Kansas as the "grasshopper year" and many settlers' crops were ruined. The Tiptons were members of the Brethren Church, which was instrumental in obtaining aid for Kansas farmers. It's interesting that the church in Cherry Grove, IL (where James' mother attended) gave the largest amount of relief money. It's also interesting that James' daughter, Anna Tipton, would later marry a relative of C.L. Keim, the "general treasurer of the Relief Society of the Church of the Brethren for the whole grasshopper district in Western Kansas..." (Craik, 1922, p. 30). It should also be noted that James' sister, Gemima, had married a Studebaker. Several of his Studebaker cousins were prominent in the Brethren church of Kansas and northern Illinois.

The farm homestead in Kansas was three and a half miles north and a half mile west of Westphalia " (source: Hazel Keim Warner) and it was still standing in 2006 with the name Corley on the fence in front. Jim's will was probated in August 1896 in Anderson Co, KS. His cause of death was "Dropsy."

1850 census, Londonderry Twp, Bedford Co, PA: James (23) was living with his parents and siblings.

1860 census, Dry Ridge PO, Londonderry Twp, Bedford Co, PA: James B. Tipton (34), wife Mary E. (33), Mary A. Tipton (Helverty) (11), Francis E (7), Wm. (5), Noah A. (3), Ann A. (1). James was a farmer and they had property worth \$500 and \$200. Next door were Jim's parents and two siblings.

1870 US census (July 06), Garnett, Reeder Twp, Anderson Co, KS: Jas Tipton (44), Mary E. Tipton (43), and children James (16), Wm B. (14), Samuel (12), Anna (10), Sybert (8), Wright (6), and Johnny (1). James was a farmer and they had property worth \$2000 and \$1750.

1880 census, South Reeder, Anderson Co, KS, near the Kellerman, Studebaker, and Corley families: James Tipton (53), wife Ellen (52), and children William (25), Anna (21), Sybert (18), Charles (15), Edith (14), John (11).

Seybert Tipton as he was called, was of pronounced convictions and followed what he believed to be right. He was born Sept 3, 1861 in Bedford Co., Pa and when a mere child his parents moved to Illinois and later to Westphalia, Anderson Co KS which has been the family home since 1865. His remains were brought here for burial in the family lot at Cherry Mound Cemetery" (Newspaper Obituary, Aug 27, 1896).

Notes for JOHN X. TIPTON: "In Memorium"

"It has been often said, that death leaves a shining mark. This saying has been verified in the death of our young friend and brother, John X. Tipton, who passed peacefully away the morning of Oct. 21st, 1891. The deceased was born at Cherry Mound, Kansas, January 31st, 1869, and was therefore just entering upon the stage of active manhood. His death is sadly regretted by a wide circle of friends, who believed that he possessed capabilities of great usefulness, and that his future would be productive of good results. Having kindred and friends in our city, he came in the early autumn to establish himself among us in business, and in his brief stay he drew many persons very warmly unto his friendship and fellowship. A little over four weeks ago he became ill, and while all possible effort was exerted to restore him to health again, yet death triumphed, and Brother Tipton passed away, not however without leaving behind a good testimony of his preparation to depart and be with the Lord. He died in the home of his brother-in-law, Mr. Geo. W. Smith, where he received the most careful attention. Converted a few years ago, he had unfortunately wandered away from the Savior but upon his ___tion in our city, he again began seeking the favor of the Lord, and finally gave assurance of his personal acceptance with the face of Christ. Brief funeral services were ___ on the afternoon of the 21st ___ today his body is borne by the relatives to the family burying ___ near Westphalia, Kansas where his Mother lies buried. His last word was "Mother," and at her side he will be placed to await the resurrection of the just." J. H. Snyder

William's newspaper obituary appeared in the *Bedford Gazette* (Friday, January 15, 1909), and it states that he married Margaret Fisher in October 1853. The name passed down to me from Hazel Keim Warner was Margaret Wagner. More investigation needs to be done to prove Margaret's maiden surname, but I've changed it to Fisher in this working file.

Daniel sold his farm in Cherry Mound in 1869 due to his wife's illness, and they "moved to Lecompton Township, 2 miles south of the city of Lecompton. He ran a fruit farm and raised sheep and cattle. He left that place and lived in Jefferson County for a period, but soon returned to Lecompton Township to purchase 200 acres near Big Springs where he lived for many years."

"DANIEL MARK HILL owns and occupies a farm of two hundred acres at Big Springs, one of the most delightful locations, not only of Douglas County, but of eastern Kansas as well. On the land are thirty-one mineral springs possessing health-restoring mineral properties that will at some future day without doubt make the place a noted health resort. Nor is the presence of the springs the only claim which the place has to public notice. Those interested in the early history of the state regard it as an historic landmark, for it was the site of the first territorial convention and served as the headquarters of "Jim" Lane during the exciting days of border ruffian warfare.

Mark Hill (for by his middle name our subject is best known) was born in Bedford County, Pa., August 4, 1836, a son of Jacob and Rosina R. (Byer) Hill. He was one of eleven children, five now living, viz.: Margaret, wife of Louis Kellerman, a retired stockman of Burlington, Kans.; William, who is with the Pennsylvania Railroad Company and resides at Bard (Bend?), Pa., where he is an extensive holder of farming lands; Daniel Mark; Anna, wife of Ellis Miner, who is engaged in the wholesale dry-goods business at Heppner, Ore.; and Kate, wife of Samuel Zike, who is engaged in the hotel and livery business in Nebraska. Jacob Hill was born in Bedford County, Pa., where he early became prominent in political life, although he was educated for the Lutheran ministry. He was a power in his party and filled many offices in his section of the country.

When our subject was nine years of age his father died and he was taken into the home of an older brother, a farmer and business man of Bedford County, who owned a farm of four hundred acres, also a sawmill, blacksmith's and shoemaker's shop. He was fourteen when he began teaming for his brother and became so expert in his work that he could drive six horses with a single line; his skill as a driver caused his associates to say: "Show Hill a knot hole and he will drive the team through." In 1854 he married Miss Delilah, daughter of John Boone, who was a great-nephew of Daniel Boone. After his marriage he continued teaming and also engaged in farming. In 1862 he left the business in the care of his brother and visited Iowa with a view to locating there. After a year he came to Kansas and spent some months, then returned to Iowa. His brother sold out in the east and located in Anderson, while our subject, settling at Weston, Iowa, became the leading business man of the town, where he operated a brick yard, a shoe store, a meat market and a general contracting business. In 1867 he disposed of his business there and came to Kansas, settling at Cherry Mound, Anderson County, where he embarked in farming and the stock business. On account of his wife's ill health he came to Douglas County in 1869 and settled in Lecompton Township, two miles south of the village of Lecompton, where he planted and carried on a fruit farm, also engaged in raising sheep and cattle. Some ten years later he removed to Jefferson County and for four years was foreman of the Elliott farm of nine hundred and sixty acres, meantime clearing the farm of mortgage. From there he returned to Douglas County and bought his present farm in Lecompton Township.

By his marriage Mr. Hill had seven children, namely: William, a prominent business man of Oklahoma City; Charles, who is with the Poehler Mercantile Company in Lawrence; George, a rising young business man of Kelso, Wash.; Jesse B., who is a partner of his brother in Kelso; Frederick, who is in the Klondike; Anna, wife of C.T. Spencer, a farmer of Douglas County; and Lulu, who married E.M. Duncan and resides upon a farm in this county. The wife and mother died in July, 1897. She was an earnest worker in the United Brethren Church and was highly esteemed by all who knew her. Mr. Hill has contributed to the support of the church and also to other worthy movements. He is a supporter of the Republican party and, had he so desired, might have been elected to any of the local offices, but he prefers to devote himself to his private interests" (pp.249-250).

According to the Lecompton, Kansas Historical Society newsletter, "Bald Eagle" (Winter 1987), Delilah Boone was the daughter of a great-nephew of Daniel Boone.

CHARLES E. WAYS

"The death of Charles E. Ways, the Nestor of American railway officials, removed from the scene of human action one of the historic landmarks of the nation. To the younger generation it seems incredible that there was living in their midst, so recently as 1914, the man who opened the first telegraph office in the capital of our nation and who prior to that was operator at Harper's Ferry during the John Brown raid. But those were some of the interesting facts in Mr. Ways' life and he was not a boy when he linked his career with those most dramatic events. From 1855 until about six months before his death he was continuously in the employ of the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad Company, rose to important position, and was one of the oldest if not the oldest railroad official in the United States in point of years of service, witnessing and aiding in the development of the Baltimore & Ohio from a short single track line to a great modern railroad system. During his last years he received from the management, in appreciation of his long service, a perpetual pass made of silver in card form, designed and authorized by President W Tiliard and Vice-President Randolph, the only one of its kind ever issued by the road. He held personal as well as business relations with former

presidents of the Baltimore & Ohio John W. Garrett, Samuel Spencer and John K. Cowan. The old veteran was a thorough railroad man and loved his work; in fact, when obliged to retire from active service, the great interest of his life departed, and he only survived his retirement six months. He was a boy of thirteen when he entered telegraph employ as a messenger boy, a year older when he came to the Baltimore & Ohio Company, a man of seventy-five when he retired as assistant general freight traffic manager. His railroad career linked him with some of the dramatic events of the anti-Civil War period. He was at Harper's Ferry when John Brown made his famous but insane raid into Virginia, and when troops, under Robert E. Lee, then a colonel in the United States army, stormed the old armory and captured the Abolition leader, Mr. Ways sent the message to the world announcing that event. When in 1861 it was necessary for the protection of President Lincoln on his journey from Springfield, Illinois, to Washington, D. C., that a telegraph office be opened in Washington, Mr. Ways was selected to open and operate it, the first in the city, his choice for the honor testifying to the confidence reposed in his ability, loyalty and faithfulness.

Charles E. Ways was born in 1839, died January 2, 1914. His parents lived in Frederick during his boyhood and there he went to school, and at the age of thirteen became messenger boy in the commercial telegraph office. He picked up a knowledge of telegraphy at the same time and when shortly afterward his parents moved to Ellicott City he was so expert that he took the place of the regular operator for a month, while he was away on a vacation, and received the regular salary. That was his first introduction to railroad telegraphic work and the beginning of his sixty years connection with the Baltimore & Ohio. Shortly after the regular operator returned to his duties, a vacancy occurred at Frederick Junction, and the young operator, then fifteen years of age, was offered the place. His mother objected to his leaving home on account of his youth, but finally gave way, and the position was accepted. The little office and bedroom at a lonely junction told on the boy's nerves and his first night there was a sleepless one. In the morning his feelings were not soothed by learning that a man had died of cholera in the bed the morning before he occupied it at night. But he stuck to his post and performed his duty well, as he stuck to every post and performed every duty required of him until he laid down for final rest. From Frederick Junction he was sent to Martinsburg. In 1859 he was made payroll clerk at Cumberland; in 1861 was placed in charge and opened the first telegraph office in Washington; in 1863 was made chief telegraph operator of the Baltimore & Ohio, with headquarters at Baltimore; in 1867 was promoted general agent at Hagerstown; was promoted division freight agent in 1878; assistant general freight agent in 1888. He was appointed in 1897 to the position he held until his retirement six months prior to his death, assistant general freight traffic manager. This record of service brought him into intimate relation with two of the important departments of the Baltimore & Ohio -telegraph and freight. Beginning at the bottom, he thoroughly mastered every detail and developed quick decision, sound judgment, wisdom, initiative and ready resource. The way of the Baltimore & Ohio official was not a smooth, easy one in the early years of his connection, but he overcame every discouraging circumstance and became one of the men whom the management of the road trusted implicitly with weighty responsibilities and were never at fault in so doing.

Fortunately Mr. Ways was induced to write a very complete account of his early experiences and so valuable is the story from both a historical and human interest view that it is here reproduced in part: I was operator at Martinsburg, West Virginia, at the time John Brown captured the Government armory at Harper's Ferry. Having nothing to do after the wires were cut I went with the Martinsburg militia to the scene of action. The second day after the arrival there, I was instructed to open an office, which I did in a one-story brick building located alongside the Winchester Branch track and directly facing the engine house, or fort as it was called, in which Brown and his men were barricaded.

My selection of a location for the instrument table was in the middle of the room, and the door being open all the time, I had a full view of the Brown fort, and it appears he had a full view of me and my instruments, for it was not more than twenty minutes after I had gotten to work before two Sharp's rifle balls in quick succession passed within six inches of my head and buried themselves in the wall back of me. I can recall very vividly the whistle of the balls as they passed my head, and it did not take me very long to move my instruments to a safe place. Brown had portholes on all sides of the building and his men shot anything that came in sight.

It was this recklessness that caused the death of old Mr. Beckham, the agent at Harper's Ferry at that time. He walked out of his office up the platform and put his head out to look at the fort when a Sharp's rifle ball put an end to his life in a moment. He was a well beloved old gentleman and his death caused much greater ill-feeling toward Brown and his men. From a point on the platform near where Mr. Beckham was killed I witnessed the storming of the fort by the United States troops commanded by General Robert E. Lee, then a colonel, and the capture of Brown after he and his men had fired half a dozen volleys through the doors of the fort into the troops, only one of them was killed, as I recall it, though I saw several fall wounded and carried away. The old man looked the picture of misery as he was dragged out to a spot under the Star-Spangled Banner which floated from a pole in the middle of the armory yard.

I witnessed a curious incident in connection with the John Brown raid. He had imprisoned some of the citizens of Harper's Ferry in the western part of the engine house, and among them was "Daddy Malloy," a simple-minded native of Harper's Ferry, who had been run over by trains and had fallen off the bridge wall into the Potomac without being hurt, besides having other narrow escapes at various times. He saw an opportunity to get out of one of the windows and escape, which he took advantage of. That side of the engine house was in full view of the steep road or street that led up to Bolivar, and the side of the road toward the engine house was lined with armed militia and citizens, all looking toward the engine house. All of them saw Malloy getting out of the window and mistaking him for one of Brown's men, probably three hundred shots were fired at him without one of them taking effect. This would seem to verify the saying that it takes half a ton of lead to kill one soldier in battle.

I opened the first telegraph office at Washington, D. C, which was for the protection of Mr. Lincoln's train when he was brought to Washington to be inaugurated. My instruments were set up in a watchman's house about one hundred yards outside the shed of the old depot. This was one of the precautions taken by the Baltimore & Ohio Company to insure safety to the train on account of the rumors that it would be attacked.

When the Civil War broke out I was at Harper's Ferry and witnessed the massing of the Confederate soldiers getting ready to march up the valley. When the Confederate flag was hoisted, to the tune of "Dixie" on the same flagpole from which had waved the Star-Spangled Banner at John Brown's capture, the enthusiasm was beyond description. After the Confederates abandoned the armory building and moved up the Valley, the United States troops occupied the place for a time, but later abandoned it and blew up all the armory buildings.

Having had notice of this movement I was detailed to go with the general supervisor of trains to open an office in his car at Sandy Hook, if necessary. He went over to Harper's Ferry and left me alone in the car. At about eight o'clock at night I was startled by a terrific noise of explosions like thousands of cartridges, and looking in the direction of Harper's Ferry I saw the light from the burning buildings. Just then a man whom I did not know opened the door and calling me by name, said: "If you attempt to cut the wires here you will be killed." With the delivery of that pleasant message he disappeared. Perhaps it is because I did not have to cut the wires that I am enabled to write this.

While at Martinsburg, West Virginia, during the Civil War, the railroad officials had advance notice from Winchester of Banks' retreat from the Valley and instructions were given to remove all the engines and equipment to Cumberland. One engine was held on the track in front of my office for the master mechanic, supervisor of engines and myself to go on as soon as everything had been started away, which had been accomplished just as the troops began coming into town. I notified Camden Station and the other offices, disconnecting my instruments, carrying them away with me, and started the engine for Hancock, where we were to cross the Potomac river, the engine going to Cumberland. We went from Hancock to Hagerstown in a wagon, and the same night went to Williamsport and saw Banks' army retreating across the Potomac river into Maryland.

Mr. Ways was president of the Baltimore & Ohio Relief Association; a member of the Masonic order, the Independent Order of Odd Fellows; the Royal Arcanum and the Maryland Club, being one of the oldest members of the last named. He was a man of warm human sympathies and the number of his friends was "legion." He married Elizabeth Virginia, daughter of Dr. Frederick Byer, of Leitersburg, who bore him two sons and a daughter: Thomas F. Ways; Max Ways, well known as one of the Democratic leaders in Baltimore; and Margaret E. Ways.

Also a United Brethren church (she attended & a long time member) that was close by the school with a cemetery, north, across the road where she, my father, grandparents Mr. & Mrs. James Tipton, uncles, aunts & our only brother who was 6 mos. old when he died of whooping cough. My mother was about 4-5 years old when her parents older brothers & sisters came by covered wagon from Penns. when they crossed the river at St. Louis by barge. She & her older brother Will were in back of wagon where they could see out when they were pointing their fingers at the first black man they had ever seen. When he spied them he said something to them. They were scared & got back in wagon where he couldn't see them. When she was a young woman her father sent her to Rich Hill, MO [in 1880] to attend a school for dressmakers. After she finished the course there she came back to Westphalia and she had a shop where she did dressmaking and the friend [Amelia] had a millinery store. She & my father were married on Christmas Eve at my grandparents home. Before marriage she had taken care of a half sister Mary Halferty who died of consumption [1880], which in our time has been called tuberculosis. When my sister Madge was 6 weeks old, April 1887, she took her on a train to Western Kans. where my father had gone some time before and took up land (claim it was called), built a sod house. This was in Logan County" (Handwritten by Opal Keim Haymaker, March 1977).

Family legend is that during the Civil War, when Anna was only about 4 years old, the family moved to northern Illinois to get away from the fighting. Two years later, in 1865, they moved on to Anderson Co. Kansas to a farm about 3 miles north of Westphalia. Anna had 2 older brothers and an older sister, as well as 3 younger brothers and a younger sister. Anna's granddaughter Mary told this story: When Hazel was a baby, the family lived in a sod house in western Kansas. Anna entered the sod house only to find a snake crawling on the ceiling, right above baby Hazel's cradle. Opal told her granddaughter, Mary Lou, that Anna was an extraordinary dressmaker, and that Anna could look at a dress in the store, and then go home and replicate the dress without a pattern. The family of Mary L. Haymaker (Opal Keim's daughter) still has a pink and white quilt made by Anna.

It is interesting to consider the early life of Anna Tipton because she actually went to school and took up an occupation before marriage after age 26, which was fairly late for those times. I wonder if she thought she would not marry. Earlier, Anna had nursed her older half-sister, Mary Halverty, who died of consumption (tuberculosis), and Anna began to show symptoms of the disease. She had her share of other losses as her mother died in March 1885, the year she married, and her father died the next year. Anna had begun to show signs of consumption, so she took the train to western Kansas, Logan Co. near Russell Springs when her daughter Madge was 6 weeks old. The move to Kansas was thought to be advantageous for TB (called consumption at that time). She and her family lived at the Tipton homestead in Westphalia, KS for several years after her father died, and they were still there when the 1900 census was taken. By 1910, they had moved to Iola as her husband made a change from farming to hotel operation. Anna had a good singing voice, according to Gen Warner - friends would say "strike up a tune Annie."

After her husband died, she stayed for a while with Minnie Tipton, widow of Sam Tipton. She also spent time at all of her daughters' homes, but seemed to prefer the Warner Farm, just outside Goshen IN, probably because there was always work to be done there.

Notes for JOHN CRIBE KEIM: John's family moved from Holmes Co, OH to Elkhart Co, Indiana in 1846, and John was born on a farm near Goshen. That farm is across the road from the current Warner farm, owned by his descendants. He and his twin brother were the 7th and 8th children in a large family. John's parents spoke German in the home, and he learned English only after he attended school. He had a twin brother named Sam, but as adults they were not close, since Sam lived in Dannebrog, Nebraska. John attended Valparaiso College, a teachers college, for a year. Afterwards, he taught for several years in Millersburg, IN (near Goshen). The 1880 census shows that he was age 23, still living with his parents, and teaching school. If we assume he taught in Millersburg from about 1876 - 1880, we are left with a period of time from 1881 - 1885 when nothing is known about his life, but it's likely he was teaching and farming. A

note in the handwriting of Mary H. West shows that he moved to Kansas in 1884, but it is not known why he left Indiana. I wonder if he moved with a relative or friend? His uncle, Jacob S. Keim (brother of Tobias Keim) was in Westphalia in 1900 as were several other Keim families.

After marriage in 1885, at age 28, he taught and farmed in Kansas. John C. Keim moved to western Kansas (Logan Co) with his wife Anna Amelia Tipton in about 1888. They lived in a sod house in Western Kansas for a time, and the two youngest children were born there. John was a member of the United Brethren Church. The family moved back to eastern Kansas, Westphalia, in 1896 after Anna's father died, and they lived on the Tipton homestead until the early 1900's. Did Mrs. McConnaghy Tipton live with them after James B. Tipton died?

1900 census, Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS: John C. Keim (43), farmer, Anna A. Keim (40), and their daughters Madge (12), Opal (8), and Hazel (6). They also had a border named Theodore Woodsworth living in the house. The family moved to Chanute in Neosho Co, KS after 1900. For a time John lived in Iola, Kansas and sold insurance. 1910 census, [Iola?] Allen Co, Kansas: J.C. Keim (53) real estate, Anna Keim (51), Opal Keim (18), doing housework in office, Hazel Keim (16), hotel waitress. There were three borders listed with the family including Opal's future husband, Harry Haymaker (19). They lived one block off the main street in a house that is still standing. 1920 US census, Iola, Allen Co, KS: J.C. Keim (62) and Anna Keim (59) and one male "roomer" (T625_522, p. 1404). In 1912, at age 55, John was proprietor of the Manhattan Hotel in Iola (source: Allen Co. sections of the Polk's Kansas State Gazetteer and Business Directory, Vol XII, 1912). According to his obituary, John was a member of the I.O.O.F. (Odd Fellows) in Iola and of the Modern Woodsmen (a fraternal organization) for many years.

From a newspaper article following his death: Near the end of his life, John and Anna moved to Gravois Mills, MO and bought a small farm. He also took on duties as an overseer of land adjoining his. John had been selling timber for crossties to William B. Moore, but there had been disputes between the two. Moore, with a gun in his pocket, came to the site of the lumber and found the gate locked with a note posting no entrance. Moore went through the gate, in spite of Keim's warnings. The 70 year old Keim threw some rocks at Moore, who shot him once just above the left eye, killing him instantly. Moore was released on bail but a handwritten note on the copy of the newspaper clipping stated that Moore was found "not guilty" (Versailles, MO, "Statesman", 23 June 1927).

John's granddaughter, Mary, remembers her mother traveling by train, with sister Elsa and brother Harry "Bud," to John Keim's funeral in 1927. He is buried at Cherry Mound Cemetery, north of Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS. John is 5779 in the book DJH and 13884 in DBH & CS.

In the crowds at receptions to meet the well-dressed visitors were local journalists -- sturdy, broad-faced Max Ways, a popular editor at the Baltimore Herald, who that year was breaking in a cub reporter, H. L. Mencken

In 1909 he lost an election for Clerk of the Circuit Court to Republican, Carson (*The Afro-American Ledger*, Nov. 6, 1909).

"The defeat of Max Ways was a particularly unfortunate one from the Democratic standpoint. "WILLIAM R. SMITH. One of the fine buildings bordering the State Capitol grounds at Topeka is the Kansas State Printing plant. That is the official headquarters of William R. Smith, state printer, and also secretary of the State Printing Commission and chairman of the School Book Commission of the state. Doubtless any citizen, and particularly a printer, would deem it an honor to be at the head of an establishment which experts pronounce to be the equal in mechanical equipment and operating efficiency of any commercial printing establishment in the country.

When Mr. Smith went into office on July 1, 1915, he brought with him a ripe experience, including an extensive service in all the grades of the printing business, years of editorial and newspaper publishing work, and perhaps best of all an inheritance and training in the progressive Kansas spirit.

When the advancement of the welfare of the state is concerned, W. R. Smith can always be found in the ranks of the workers and usually among the leaders. The influence for good he has exercised as an editor in various sections of the state can hardly be over estimated.

While his life has been distinctive in more than one particular, he is in every sense a typical Kansan. He was born at the old land office and capital, Lecompton, March 21, 1872. His grandparents, William L. and America C. (Barton) Smith were Kentucky people who moved west in 1854, the year the Kansas-Nebraska bill was passed through Congress, and they located at Lecompton, the historic capital of Kansas Territory. Both grandparents died in Lecompton. George W. Smith, father of the state printer, was a native of Kentucky and was a lad when he arrived in Kansas Territory in the spring of 1854. He afterwards went to Lawrence and learned the wagonmaker's trade, and while there passed through and was one of the survivors of Quantrell's raid. He never applied himself much to his trade, but for the greater part of his active career was engaged in merchandising. At Lecompton he married Frances Tipton, and there he and his wife spent their lives and died in old age. Their three sons are still living: William R.; Dr. Roy O. Smith of Rifle, Colorado; and Dr. J. C. Smith of Beloit, Wisconsin.

Reared in Lecompton, William R. Smith attended the public schools and Lane University, and as a boy he learned the printer's trade on the old Lecompton Monitor and the Lawrence Daily Democrat.

He had not yet reached his majority when he was first called to public service. Grover Cleveland in 1893 appointed him postmaster at Lecompton, but he held back the commission until he passed his twenty-first birthday and then qualified. He was postmaster at Lecompton more than four years. In the meantime he had founded the Lecompton Sun, and continued its editorial management while postmaster, and altogether conducted it for about nine years. At the spring election immediately following his twenty-first birthday he was also elected mayor of Lecompton, an office he filled with credit for two terms.

After leaving Lecompton Mr. Smith was for two years foreman for the Mail and Breeze of Topeka, was editor and publisher of the Manhattan Republic two years, for another year was editor of the Fraternal Aid at Lawrence, and he then bought the Garnett Plaindealer and the Garnett Eagle, both republican papers, and consolidating them as the Eagle-

Plaindealer continued the publication of this republican paper for about five years. His next venture in journalism was at Ottawa, where with others he was associated in the operation of the Ottawa Herald. Later for about five years he was owner and editor of the Fort Scott Republican, and while at Fort Scott was appointed United States census enumerator for the Second Kansas Congressional District. His last newspaper work was as editor and owner of the Columbus Advocate, which he conducted for five years.

Then in 1914 he was elected state printer and took charge of the splendid plant at Topeka in July of the following year. He went into office at a critical time in the history of the state printing plant. Its capacity was taxed to the utmost, and there was a contract to deliver over 140,000 schoolbooks within six weeks. The full force of the plant was put in operation night and day, and in thirty days the book presses turned out over 2,000,000 impressions. Other departments were operated at similar speed, and the textbooks were all delivered on time.

The Kansas State Printing Plant is an institution worthy of some special record. It is the largest printing plant between Chicago and Sacramento, and its equipment and methods of operation have been taken as a model for other states. It has on its payroll 120 employees, and during the ten years of its operation has saved about \$75,000 annually on the state's printing. It is now producing schoolbooks at 60 per cent of the prices formerly charged by Eastern book companies. Perhaps the highest praise of the institution has been spoken by Governor Capper, who is himself a printer and publisher of national prominence. He has declared that Kansas has a plant equipped with machinery equal to that of any commercial printing concern in the country and that the standard of efficiency and service is very high. His opinion as a publisher is that the mechanical work on the textbooks issued from the state plant is equal to that of any printing establishment in the United States.

Kansas has been operating its own printing plant since July 1, 1905. The Legislature of 1913 appropriated \$150,000 to purchase additional grounds, enlarge the plant, and install equipment necessary for schoolbook making. The wise expenditure of this fund has made the plant second to none in point of efficiency and equipment in the Middle West. While the printing of state documents has thus been done for a number of years, the introduction of a department for the printing and publishing of school textbooks is comparatively recent. It was T. A. McNeal, former state printer, who paved the way for state publication, and his successor, W. C. Austin, installed the bookmaking machinery and produced the first Kansas books.

Mr. Smith is affiliated with the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, the Knights of Pythias, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, and some insurance organizations. In 1904 he married Miss Bertha J. Spohr. They have one daughter, Louise. Before her marriage Mrs. Smith was teacher of domestic science in the Bradley Polytechnic Institute at Peoria, Illinois."

His first job was as a reporter for The Baltimore Sun in 1926. He spent 10 years at The Philadelphia Record as a reporter and editor, leaving in 1942.

During World War II, he was a senior analyst in the Foreign Economics Administration in Washington, overseeing studies of German and Japanese war production for the armed services.

In 1945, Mr. Ways joined Time magazine's international section, becoming chief of the London bureau in 1956. He transferred to Fortune in 1959 and became associate managing editor in 1964.

Mr. Ways is survived by his wife, the former Constance St. Onge; two sons, Peter and John; a daughter, Brigid Marcuse; a sister, Mary Wilson; seven grandchildren, and one great-grandchild.
