### *Generation No. 1*

1. JOSIAS<sup>1</sup> CORK was born Abt. 1759 in prob. England, and died Bef. March 09, 1802 in Parish of Eggbuckland, Devon, England. He married JOAN [?] STAR June 10, 1779 in Uptontery, Devon, England<sup>1</sup>. She was born Abt. 1760 in prob. England, and died 1807 in Parish of Eggbuckland, Devon, England.

#### Notes for JOSIAS CORK:

The Cork family lived in the southwestern part of Devon, England during the 18th and 19th centuries. Josiah married in Uptontery, which had a population of 795 in 1801, and it was 940 by 1861. By 1901, the population had fallen to 666. Just south of Uptontery is Cotleigh, where one of Josiah's children was born. Cotleigh is in Branscombe Parish, Colyton Hundred, Devon and its population was 214 in 1801 and in 1850, it had grown to 269. The record shows that his other children were born in Berry Pomeroy, and in Totnes. Berry Pomeroy (population in 1801 was 1124) is further east in Devon and Totnes is across the bay from Berry Pomeroy. Totnes is located on the west bank of the River Dart. Revell (2002) believes Josiah and Sarah moved to Berry Pomeroy in South Devon by 1782, since Elizabeth was born that year, and they lived in Berry Pomeroy for at least 2 years. By 1787, the family had moved back to Totnes when Susanna Starr Cork was born, and they were still there in 1792. Josias wrote his will on 16 Oct 1801, and it was proved on 9 March 1802.

By the permission of God, Josias Cork of Efford in the Parish of Eggbuckland in the County of Devon yeoman being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in [the] manner following (that is to say) first I give and bequeath unto John Revell and Sampson Revell both of the Parish of Eggbuckland aforesaid gentleman the sum of two thousand and six hundred pounds to be paid and transferred to them within six month[s] next after my death upon the trusts and for the intents and purposes hereinafter mentioned expressed and declared of and concerning the same (that is to say) as to the sum of five hundred pounds (part of the two thousand six hundred pounds[in trust for John Star (son of my wife Joan formerly called Star] now living with me and as to the sum of five hundred pounds more [an]other part of the said sum of two thousand six hundred pounds] in trust to pay the interest thereof to my daughter Elizabeth Sherrill wife of John Sherrill of Eggbuckland aforesaid yeoman for and during her natural life to and for her sole and separate use benefit and disposal whose receipt for the same shall from time to time be a sufficient discharge and from and after her decease then as to the said sum of five hundred pounds last mentioned in trust for all and every the child and children equally to be divided between them in share and share alike if more than one and as to the sum of five hundred pounds more (other part of the said two thousand six hundred pounds) in trust for my daughter Susanna Cork ... (Transcription by Alastair Revell, 28 June 2006).

Josias Cork of Awliscombe & Margaret Morris married 2 Apr 1719. Could this be our Josias Cork's grandfather???

Notes for JOAN [?] STAR: Joan's will was written 9th June 1806, proved at the Prerogative Court of Canterbury (source: Alastair Revell).

2. WILLIAM<sup>2</sup> CORK (*JOSIAS*<sup>1</sup>) was born May 14, 1780 in Cotleigh, Devonshire, England, and died 1844 in Great Woodford Farm, England, buried at Plympton, St. Mary's Churchyard, Devon, England<sup>2</sup>. He married SARAH SANDERS January 20, 1803 in Plympton St. Mary, England. She was born 1782 in Egg Buckland, England, and died 1866 in Plymouth, Devonshire, England age 84.

Notes for WILLIAM CORK:

William was baptized on May 17, 1780 in Cotleigh, Devonshire, England.

William and Sarah were married in Plympton St. Mary, England which consists of about 32,000 acres and had a population of 10,722 in 1841. One of their children was born in the Parish of Egguckland, which is now located in Plymouth. Egg Buckland was first mentioned in the Domesday Book in 1086. The Church at Egg Buckland was built in about 1430. A document from the Devon Record Office states, "The Cork family spent some years as tenants in Great Woodford Farm." In the Egguckland Baptism Register, William is described as a "gentleman" in both 1813 and 1816 when his sons were christened.

More About SARAH SANDERS: Residence: 1851, Living with daughter, Jane Lake Cork in Plymouth

Notes for MATILDA CORK: Although she never married, she raised four children of her brother Manley and lived in Plymouth, England. In 1851, she was living with her sister, Jane Lake Cork. On the 1881 census, living with her are nieces Ann Cork, aged 27, and Jane Cork, aged 22, both born Plympton St. Mary, Devon. The address was Pennycross, Devon. In 1889, she was living with her niece, Sarah, in Worcester and was 80 years old.

Notes for JANE LAKE CORK: Philip's occupation was Wine merchant clerk. In 1851, Jane resided at 56 South Side St, Plymouth, England.

3. JOAN<sup>2</sup> CORK (*JOSIAS*<sup>1</sup>) was born 1792 in Totnes, Devon, England<sup>3</sup>, and died January 31, 1867 in Brixton, Devon England. She married MATTHEW REVELL October 20, 1814 in Egg Buckland, Devon, England, son of JOHN REVELL and ANNA RENNESON. He was born Abt. 1788 in [of Plymstock] England, and died November 27, 1841 in Devon, England<sup>4</sup>.

Notes for MATTHEW REVELL:

Matthew was baptised on November 14, 1788 in Eggbuckland, Devon, England.

"In 1815, Matthew was described as a yeoman living at Pomphlett Mills in Plymstock." He was a miller in 1818 and by 1821, a flour trader. By 1822, they had moved to West Sherford in the Parish of Brixton, and they lived on a farm owned by Sir Drake Trayton (source: Alastair Revell, 2004). Matthew and Joan are buried in Brixton Churchyard, Devon, England.

4. REV. WILLIAM<sup>3</sup> CORK (*WILLIAM<sup>2</sup>, JOSIAS<sup>1</sup>*)<sup>5</sup> was born February 23, 1804 in Devonshire, England<sup>6</sup>, and died February 03, 1889 in Rossville, Vermilion Co, IL at his home. He married (1) JEMIMAH MILLER August 27, 1836 in Pickaway Co, OH<sup>6</sup>. She was born Abt. 1806 in Virginia, and died November 02, 1866 in Vermilion Co, IL, buried in Mann's Chapel Cemetery, Vermilion Co, IL. He married (2) ROSEANNA HAAS December 25, 1870 in Vermilion Co, IL, daughter of JACOB HAAS and ROSANNA BYERLY. She was born February 20, 1834 in Shamokin Twp, Northumberland Co, PA<sup>7</sup>, and died October 09, 1897 in Vermilion Co, IL.

Notes for REV. WILLIAM CORK: William left Plymouth, England on 1 April 1834 and arrived in New York on 28 April 1834 at age 30. In that year, England passed a law making it more difficult to own land (source: Alistair Revell). It is not known why he went to Ohio after arriving in America. William Cork was a minister in the United Brethren Church, and he conducted marriages, but was probably not ordained. According to the 1840 census, William was in Deer Creek, Pickaway Co, Ohio, which was established in 1810 from four other counties. He brought his family to Illinois in about 1848 and he bought land on 17 Apr 1849 in Vermilion Co, Twp 22N. He took out land patents from the U.S. Government on 1 June 1850 on 160 acres of land in Sec 21, Twp 22, R12W. The original Warrant was cancelled and another one issued later because of "an error in the name of the Patentee" (source: USA Land Patent #519427). The original Warrant from the General Land Office was issued to Septor J. Holley, private, Captain Cummins; Company, Tenth Regiment, United States Infantry, numbered 35464, for 160 acres. William Cork was said to be the Assignee of Septor J. Holley. According to the Illinois Public Domain Land Tract Sales Database (US GenWeb Vermilion Co, IL) he bought three more tracts of land in Twp 22N on 8 Nov 1852. William's naturalization papers are dated 27 Oct 1856 (he was age 52) and he signed with his signature.

1850 census - not yet found but he should be in Danville, IL, age 46, since a daughter was born there in 1850.

1860 census, Ross, Vermilion Co, IL: William Cork (56), Jemima Cork (54), and their children William (22), John (21), Henry M.C. (16), R.P. (14), and Ann (10). Their real estate was valued at \$8,400 and personal property at \$1,000.

1870 census, Rossville PO, Ross Twp, Vermilion Co, IL (11 Aug): William Cork (66), Joseph Haas (28), Ann Haas (20), William C. Haas (1), Henry Cork (24), George Young (23). William Cork was listed as United Brethren Minister with property valued at \$18,000 and personal property valued at \$2,000. Two of his sons, Robert and John, lived on either side of him.

1880 census: he was listed on the census as a retired farmer with real estate valued at \$8,400 and personal property worth \$1,000.

William's unmarried sister, Matilda, who lived in Plymouth, England wrote to Elizabeth Puzey, Jr. on 12 May 1871, "If William is at all like he used to be - pleasant, agreeable, good company, and very gentlemanly when he liked, I am not surprised at a person younger than himself marrying him." In 1873, a United Brethren Church was built in Ross Twp, and Cork preached there (Beckwith's History of Vermilion County, IL, p. 663). By 1910, all of the original Cork land had been sold to other families. William Cork's obituary appeared in the Danville Commercial News on 4 February 1889, page 4. It read, in part, "The deceased was an Englishman by birth and a highly honored and esteemed citizen. He was a local United Brethren preacher and a farmer by occupation. He was a pioneer settler in Ross township, locating there when the Indians roamed at will over our beautiful prairies. The funeral service will be held tomorrow at 2 p.m. at Mann's Chapel, conducted by Rev. Mr. Sherrill." He was buried on February 05, 1889 in Mann's Chapel Cemetery, Tree Stump Stone, Section A, Row 7.

Notes for HENRY M. C. CORK: Henry lived with his father until he died, then lived with his brother, Robert, in St. Marie, Jasper Co, IL until 1909 when he died. Russ Puzey wrote, "He had been adjudged by court action to be a legally distracted person. His father willed him 110 acres of land which Henry C. Cork retained until his death." His heirs sold the land soon after the inheritance. Henry's sister's son received 1/3; his brother Robert received 1/3; and the other 1/3 was divided between the 8 children of his brother John.

5. REV. JOSIAS<sup>3</sup> CORK (*WILLIAM*<sup>2</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>1</sup>) was born August 20, 1813 in Woodford, Plympton, Plymouth, Devon, England<sup>9</sup>, and died September 26, 1892 in Jamaica at St. Ann's Bay age 80, buried in the Sacred Area, Parish Church Cemetery, St. Ann's Bay Church, Jamaica<sup>9</sup>. He married (1) PAULINA SHEPHERD March 12, 1839. She was born March 1811 in England, and died September 09, 1854 in Jamaica, buried in St. Ann's Bay Parish Church Cemetery<sup>9</sup>. He married (2) ANN ELIZA BENNETT September 20, 1855 in Jamaica<sup>9</sup>. She was born 1819 in England, and died April 04, 1874 in The Rectory, St. Anns, Jamaica<sup>9</sup>. He married (3) JEAN BRUCE GORDON Aft. 1875. She died Aft. 1891.

Notes for REV. JOSIAS CORK: Josias was christened on July 11, 1819 at Frant, Sussex, England. He emigrated about 1837 from England to the Island of Jamaica. He is mentioned on the web site of the Jamaica National Building Society. Members of his congregation benefited by the founding in 1874 of the St. James Benefit Building Society. According to the same web site, Rev. Cork founded the St. Ann Benefit Building Society in 1874.

His newspaper obituary appeared in "The Daily Gleaner" on Monday, October 3, 1892. Headline: "The Late Rev. Josias Cork of St. Anns Bay"

"After thirty five years of faithful service in Jamaica, the Rev. Josias Cork, late Rector of St. Anns Bay passed away to his rest at noon on Sunday the twenty sixth September in his 80th year. In sorrowful tones many were heard to say, 'our good old Rector is gone, he was a good useful man.'" The obituary goes on to mention his 22 years at the Episcopal Church in St. Anns Bay and his skill as an Engineer and mathematician. He laid out many of the country roads in that area. He died of bronchitis.

Notes for JEAN BRUCE GORDON: She was living in a lunatic asylum, Kingston, Jamaica (codicil in Josias' will dated 1891).

Notes for PAULINA CORK:

Paulina's death notice appeared in the Kingston, Jamaica newspaper, The Gleaner, on Monday 22 Feb. 1926. She died after several months of painful illness, which was not specified in the article. Her service at the Parish Church was extolled including her post as Secretary of the St. Ann Benefit Building Society over 40 years, over 50 years with the Parish Church Sunday School, and more than 20 years as church organist.

She was born May 04, 1819 in England<sup>12</sup>, and died Abt. 1848. He married (2) SARAH JANE McVICKAR WATSON<sup>12</sup> September 09, 1850 in Oakwood Twp, Vermilion Co, IL<sup>13</sup>. She was born February 13, 1813, and died March 02, 1852 in Vermilion Co, IL. He married (3) TENCY ANN OUTTEN October 03, 1852 in Vermilion Co, IL<sup>13</sup>. She was born Abt. 1816 in Delaware, and died February 14, 1870 in IL. He married (4) BARBARA FUNK<sup>14</sup> February 20, 1871 in Vermilion Co, IL<sup>15</sup>. She was born April 02, 1832 in PA, and died May 08, 1889.

Notes for JOHN MILTON CORK:

After marriage, John and Mary went to live in St. Germans in Cornwall. They emigrated to America in 1847 (source: Christine Knott, Rabbidge descendant). According to Debbie Ammons, he was a sea captain.

She was born August 14, 1881 in Akers, Tangipahoa Co, LA, and died April 21, 1947 in New Orleans, LA in Charity Hospital.

Notes for ORA "ORY" CORK/COOK:

Ora was the 7th child and youngest son of John and Margaret Cork. Nothing is known about his childhood in northern Illinois. In July 1899, Ora Cork was bound over to the grand jury for participating in a "white cap" outrage in Rossville, IL, and he was released on a \$300 bond. About a dozen men went to James Briley's house, called him outside, whipped, then covered him with tar (Daily Commercial Newspaper, Danville, IL, July 11, 1899 issue), reportedly because Briley had not taken care of his family. The men were accompanied by Henry German, brother of Briley's wife's. In a newspaper article, Ora was called a "Saloon Loafer" and was described as having a "lantern-jawed face" and an unforgettable chin" (Danville Daily News, 12 July, 1899). On the 1900 census, he was listed as Ora Cook, and was living with his sister, Nora Huffer. Had he skipped out on his bail and changed his name to evade the law? Soon after the "white capper" incident, his parents moved to Mississippi. Did he skip out of town before his trial? His father's obituary in 1905 indicated that Ora was living in Ridgeland, Mississippi. By 1907 he had gone to

Louisiana, possibly because he was working as a Pile Driver Engineer and Assistant Bridges Foreman for Illinois Central Railroad. His 1907 marriage license lists Ora's real last name as Cork. In 1910, Ora sold his inheritance from his Uncle Henry, and family tradition is that he and Mamie went to Rossville or Danville about that time. According to his daughter-in-law, Ora and his wife had a car in Hammond before his death - perhaps he bought the car with his inheritance from his uncle Henry C. Cork who died in 1909. His WWI draft registration listed his height as medium and his build as stout, and he had gray eyes and brown hair. Ora died suddenly at the age of 49 of a skull fracture, and his son Roy always told his family that a load of lumber was dropped on him. In fact, Ora was working at a company that made strawberry boxes when he was killed by a fall from a scaffold. Ora did not die immediately, and he was taken to Presbyterian Hospital in New Orleans where he died the next day. His body was returned to Hammond, LA via the Illinois Railroad on 14 Jul 1927 at 3pm.

On 27 Aug 1927, Mamie, a widow, bought property in Hammond, LA, probably with the inheritance from her husband's estate. Less than two years later, on 8 Apr 1929, a Sheriff's sale of that property was held. Most likely, she lost the property because she could not pay the taxes. Mamie then moved with her family to a rooming house, where she worked cleaning rooms. Family tradition is that she was part Indian. Roy Lee told his family that he was raised Catholic, so it is assumed that Mamie was Catholic. In 1946, the last time her daughter-in-law saw her, she wore her hair in a bun. The informant on Mamie's death certificate was her daughter, Mrs. Charles B. Archer (either Violet or Helen). Her address at death was 107 E. Morris St., Hammond, LA, and cause of death was Gastro-intestinal hemorrhage due to carcinoma of Cecum. Ora and Mamie are buried in Ponchatoula Cemetery, Hammond, LA.

1900 census, Danville Twp, Vermilion Co, IL: Ora Cook (20) was living with his sister Dora and brother-in-law John Huffer. Note: The fact that he is clearly listed in 1900 as "Cook" might mean that he was eluding the law by using his mother's maiden name.

1910 census, Ponchatoula, Tangipahoa Parish, LA: Ora Cook (29), Mayme (27), and son Ora Alfred (15 mos). Ora's occupation was listed as Assistant Foreman Bridges. The family lived on Beech Street and rented their home.

1920 (Jan) census, Hammond, Tangipahoa Parish, LA: Ory Cook (40), his wife Mamie (38), and children Ory Jr. (10), William (8), Charles (4), and Helen L. (22 mos). Mamie's mother, Margaret Tilson (68) was also living with the family. It appears that they lived on S. Church St. with the Timmon family. Ora's occupation looks like Laborer, Railway.

1930 census, 100 Morris Ave, Hammond, LA: Mamie Cook (48), Ory, 21, Charles, 15, Helen, 12, Violet, 9, Roy Lee, 7 years old. Roomers were Jack Jells, Virginia, and his wife Ruth. Mamie was proprietor of the rooming house where rooms rented for \$25.00 per month.

Notes for ORA ALFRED COOK, JR.: After his mother died in 1947, it is not known how or where Ory lived, but on 17 Oct 1949 he was committed to the East Louisiana State Hospital, probably because of his epilepsy. He was also diagnosed with mild psychosis. On 25 May 1973 he was transferred to the Hillhaven Nursing Home #3 in Gonzales, LA where he later died.

Newspaper story: Hammond Vindicator, 18 Nov 1949

"Several have contacted me concerning the sad plight of Ory Cook, who was recently transferred from the hospital at Independence to the Institution at Jackson. Many say that Ory should not be in Jackson, but right here in Hammond where he handled the Times-Picayune for many years, and where his services are missed. It is said that no one cared to accept Ory as a boarder and lodger, hence authorities deemed it wise to let him remain in Jackson. One friend of the boy said that he would donate \$10 toward building Ory a small place in which he could sleep and get his meals at one of the numerous restaurants and cafes. Maybe the Times-Picayune would feel inclined to assist in getting Ory a place to lay his head. He certainly was faithful to the paper over a period of many years."

Another article appeared in the same paper on 2 Dec 1949 indicating that Ory Cook was a "well known newsboy here for many years and who is missed by the citizens in general." This article states that a letter was received stating that Ory was transferred from the East Louisiana Hospital of Jackson. The letter states that Ory was receiving "the best of food, a good place to sleep, and is where he will receive
