He married ELIZABETH ZELWAY May 27, 1753 in Awliscombe, Devonshire, England<sup>1</sup>. She was born Abt. 1725 in England, and died November 1806 in Awliscombe, Devon, England, age 80, interred St. Michael and All Angels Churchyard.

Notes for JOSIAS CORK: Christened 3 October 1726 in Awliscombe, Devonshire, England. Father's name was Josias and mother's name was Margaret.

2. JOSIAS<sup>3</sup> CORK (*JOSIAS*<sup>2</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>1</sup>) was born Abt. 1756 in Devon, England, and died 1802 in Parish of Eggbuckland, Devon, England, interred St. Mary's Church Cemetery, Plympton, Devon, England<sup>2</sup>. He married JOAN [?] STAR June 10, 1779 in Uptontery, Devon, England<sup>3</sup>. She was born Abt. 1760 in prob. England, and died January 1807 in Parish of Eggbuckland, Devon, England, interred Brixton Churchyard, Devon, England<sup>4</sup>.

Notes for JOSIAS CORK: Josias was christened 18 January 1756 in Awliscombe, Devonshire, England ("England Births and Christenings, 1538-1975," index, FamilySearch (<https://familysearch.org/pal:/MM9.1.1/J79J-G89> : accessed 13 June 2015), Josiah Corke in entry for Josiah Corke, 23 Apr 1784; citing BERRY POMEROY,DEVON,ENGLAND, reference ; FHL microfilm 916,810).

The Cork family lived in the southwestern part of Devon, England during the 18th and 19th centuries. Josiah married in Uptontery, which had a population of 795 in 1801; by 1861 the population had gone down to 940 and by 1901, the population had fallen to 666. Just south of Uptontery is Cotleigh, where one of Josiah's children was born. Cotleigh is in Branscombe Parish, Colyton Hundred, Devon and its population was 214 in 1801 and in 1850, it had grown to 269. The record shows that his other children were born in Berry Pomeroy, and in Totnes. Berry Pomeroy (population in 1801 was 1124) is further east in Devon and Totnes is across the bay from Berry Pomeroy. Totnes is located on the west bank of the River Dart. Revell (2002) believes Josiah and Joan moved to Berry Pomeroy in South Devon by 1782, since Elizabeth was born that year, and they lived in Berry Pomeroy for at least 2 years. By 1787, the family had moved back to Totnes when Susanna Starr Cork was born, and they were still there in 1792.

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"By the permission of God, Josias Cork of Efford in the Parish of Egg Buckland in the County of Devon yeoman being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in [the] manner following (that is to say) first I give and bequeath unto John Revell and Sampson Revell both of the Parish of Egg Buckland aforesaid gentleman the sum of two thousand and six hundred pounds to be paid and transferred to them within six month[s] next after my death upon the trusts and for the intents and purposes hereinafter mentioned expressed and declared of and concerning the same (that is to say) as to the sum of five hundred pounds (part of the two thousand six hundred pounds[in trust for John Star (son of my wife Joan formerly called Star] now living with me and as to the sum of five hundred pounds more [an]other part of the said sum of two thousand six hundred pounds] in trust to pay the interest thereof to my daughter Elizabeth Sherrill wife of John Sherrill of Egg Buckland aforesaid yeoman for and during her natural life to and for her sole and separate use benefit and disposal whose receipt for the same shall from time to time be a sufficient discharge and from and after her decease then as to the said sum of five hundred pounds last mentioned in trust for all and every the child and children equally to be divided between them in share and share alike if more than one and as to the sum of five hundred pounds more (other part of the said two thousand six hundred pounds) in trust for my daughter Susanna Cork ... " (Transcription by Alastair Revell, 28 June 2006).

Notes for JOAN [?] STAR: Joan's will was written 9th June 1806, proved at the Prerogative Court of Canterbury (source: Alastair Revell). When I visited the burial site of her husband, the man in charge of the cemetery had a list of death dates. Her date was given but not her burial site. Her name was not on the vault of her husband. Burial was on Jan. 23, 1807.

WILLIAM<sup>4</sup> CORK (*JOSIAS*<sup>3</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>2</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>1</sup>) was born May 14, 1780 in Cotleigh, Devonshire, England<sup>7</sup>, and died July 1844 in Great Woodford Farm, Devon, England, interred Oak Ridge Cemetery, Plympton Saint Mary's Churchyard, Devon, England<sup>8</sup>. He married SARAH SANDERS January 20, 1803 in Plympton St. Mary, Devon, England. She was born 1782 in Plympton St. Mary, Devon, England, and died July 21, 1866 in Great Woodford, Devon, England age 84, interred Plympton, St. Mary's Churchyard, Devon, England<sup>9</sup>.

Notes for WILLIAM CORK: William was baptized on May 17, 1780 in Cotleigh, Devonshire, England. William and Sarah were married in Plympton St. Mary, England which consists of about 32,000 acres and had a population of 10,722 in 1841. The marriage record shows William was of the Parish of Egg Buckland and Sarah was "of this Parish." The minister's name looks like Tho. Culme. William and Sarah each signed their names on the record. The last line says "In the Presence of John Pearse Enleigh and Philip Ya \_\_\_\_\_ (not legible) (The page showing the marriage is p. 53 and their marriage was No. 208. There were four marriages recorded on the page for the Year 1802-03. Original source is not recorded). They are both buried in the graveyard of that same church which I visited

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in 2012. It is still an active church, and I attended the Sunday morning worship service, so I did not take pictures of the inside.

One of their children was born in the Parish of Egg Buckland, which is now located in Plymouth. Egg Buckland was first mentioned in the Domesday Book in 1086. The Church at Egg Buckland was built in about 1430. A document from the Devon Record Office states, "The Cork family spent some years as tenants in Great Woodford Farm." In the Egg Buckland Baptism Register, William is described as a "gentleman" in both 1813 and 1816 when his sons were christened.

Notes for SARAH SANDERS: In 1851, she lived with daughter, Jane Lake Cork in Plymouth, England. Her estate was probated 27 Aug 1866 in Devon, England by the oath of daughter Matilda Cork (England & Wales, National Probate Calendar (Index of Wills and Administrations), 1858-1966, 1973-1995).

Notes for MATILDA CORK: Although she never married, she raised four children of her brother Manley and lived in Plymouth, England. In 1851, she lived with her sister, Jane Lake Cork. On the 1881 census, living with her are nieces Ann Cork, aged 27, and Jane Cork, aged 22, both born Plympton St. Mary, Devon. The address was Pennycross, Devon. In 1889, she lived with her niece, Sarah, in Worcester and was 80 years old.

Notes for JANE LAKE CORK: In 1851, Jane resided at 56 South Side St, Plymouth, England. Philip's occupation was Wine merchant clerk. Jane's sister, Matilda (21) lived with the family.

JOAN<sup>4</sup> CORK (*JOSIAS*<sup>3</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>2</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>1</sup>) was born 1792 in Totnes, Devon, England<sup>11</sup>, and died January 31, 1867 in Brixton, Devon England, interred Brixton Churchyard, Devon, England. She married MATTHEW REVELL October 20, 1814 in St. Edward's Church, Egg Buckland, Devon, England<sup>12</sup>, son of JOHN REVELL and ANNA RENNESON. He was born 1788 in [of Plymstock] England, and died November 27, 1841 in Devon, England, interred Brixton Churchyard, Devon, England<sup>13</sup>.

Notes for MATTHEW REVELL: Matthew was baptized on November 14, 1788 in Egg Buckland, Devon, England. "In 1815, Matthew was described as a yeoman living at Pomphlett Mills in Plymstock." He was a miller in 1818 and by 1821, a flour trader. By 1822, they had moved to West Sherford in the Parish of Brixton, and they lived on a farm owned by Sir Drake Trayton (source: Alastair Revell, 2004).

5. REV. WILLIAM<sup>5</sup> CORK (*WILLIAM<sup>4</sup>, JOSIAS<sup>3</sup>, JOSIAS<sup>2</sup>, JOSIAS<sup>1</sup>*)<sup>19</sup> was born February 23, 1804 in Devonshire, England<sup>20</sup>, and died February 3, 1889 in Rossville, Vermilion Co, IL at his home, interred Mann's Chapel Cemetery, Vermilion Co, IL. He married (1) ELIZABETH Abt. 1827 in prob. Devon, England. She was born Abt. 1806 in Prob. Devon, England, and died Abt. 1835 in Prob. Pickaway Co, OH. He married (2) JEMIMA MILLER August 27, 1836 in Pickaway Co, OH<sup>20</sup>, daughter of DANIEL MILLER and ELIZABETH. She was born Abt. 1803 in Devonshire, England<sup>21</sup>, and died November 2, 1866 in Vermilion Co, IL, age 60, interred Mann's Chapel Cemetery, Vermilion Co, IL. He married (3) ROSEANNA HAAS December 25, 1870 in Vermilion Co, IL, daughter of JACOB HAAS and ROSANNA BYERLY. She was born February 20, 1834 in Shamokin Twp, Northumberland Co, PA<sup>22</sup>, and died October 9, 1897 in Vermilion Co, IL, interred Mann's Chapel.

Notes for REV. WILLIAM CORK: Baptism 22 Mar 1804 at Egg Buckland, Devon, England (England, Devon Bishop's Transcripts, 1558-1887). William left Plymouth, England on 1 April 1834 on the ship Barque Mary Bulmer, and arrived in New York on 14 April 1834 at age 30. With him was a presumed wife, Elis. (28). In that year, England passed a law making it more difficult to own land (source: Alistair Revell). It is not known why he went to Ohio after arriving in America. Deer Creek, Pickaway Co, Ohio was established in 1810 from four other counties. I visited Pickaway County, OH in 2007 but no records for William Cork were found.

William took his family to Illinois in about 1848 and he bought land on 17 Apr 1849 in Vermilion Co, Twp 22N. He took out land patents from the U.S. Government on 1 June 1850 on 160 acres of land in Sec 21, Twp 22, R12W.

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The original Warrant was cancelled and another one issued later because of "an error in the name of the Patentee" (source: USA Land Patent #519427). The original Warrant from the General Land Office was issued to Septor J. Holley, private, Captain Cummins; Company, Tenth Regiment, United States Infantry, numbered 35464, for 160 acres. William Cork was said to be the Assignee of Septor J. Holley. According to the Illinois Public Domain Land Tract Sales Database (US GenWeb Vermilion Co, IL) he bought three more tracts of land in Twp 22N on 8 Nov 1852. William's naturalization papers are dated 27 Oct 1856 (he was age 52) and he signed with his signature. "About 1848, several families belonging to the United Brethren denomination settled in the western part of Ross and along Bean creek. William Cork ... and others of that faith, were anxious for preaching there" (Beckwith, 1879, p. 663). A minister was appointed there in 1851 and a class was organized. In 1873, a church was built with a belfry. A little later a church was formed at Rossville and a circuit was established in the area where Cork and others preached. William Cork was a minister in the United Brethren Church, and he conducted marriages, but was probably not ordained.

William's unmarried sister, Matilda, who lived in Plymouth, England wrote to Elizabeth Puzey, Jr. on 12 May 1871, "If William is at all like he used to be - pleasant, agreeable, good company, and very gentlemanly when he liked, I am not surprised at a person younger than himself marrying him." In 1873, a United Brethren Church was built in Ross Twp, and Cork preached there (Beckwith's History of Vermilion County, IL, p. 663). By 1910, all of the original Cork land had been sold to other families.

William Cork's obituary appeared in the Danville Commercial News on 4 February 1889, page 4. It read, in part, "The deceased was an Englishman by birth and a highly honored and esteemed citizen. He was a local United Brethren preacher and a farmer by occupation. He was a pioneer settler in Ross township, locating there when the Indians roamed at will over our beautiful prairies. The funeral service will be held tomorrow at 2 p.m. at Mann's Chapel, conducted by Rev. Mr. Sherrill." He was buried on February 05, 1889 in Mann's Chapel Cemetery, Tree Stump Stone, Section A, Row 7.

1840 census, Deer Creek, Pickaway, Ohio: William Cork [indexed as Cock] (age 30-39) with 2 males (under 5), 1 female (30-39). Total of 4 persons

1850 census - not yet found but he should be in Rossville or Danville, IL, age 46, since a daughter was born there in 1850.

1850, Dec. 21, Federal Census Non-Population Schedule, District 21, Vermilion Co, IL: William Cork is listed with 50 acres improved land, 110 acres unimproved; cash value of farm was \$100, value of implements and machinery was \$75. H had 6 horses, 3 milk cows, 14 other cattle, no sheep, 6 swine for a total value of \$400 plus \$100 in bushels of oats.

1860 census, Ross, Vermilion Co, IL: William Cork [indexed as Cosh] (56), Jemima Cork (54), and their children William (22), John (21), Henry M.C. (16), R.P. (14), and Ann (10). Their real estate was valued at \$8,400 and personal property at \$1,000. No occupation was listed.

1870 census, Rossville PO, Ross Twp, Vermilion Co, IL (11 Aug): William Cork (66), Joseph Haas (28), Ann Haas (20), William C. Haas (1), Henry Cork (24), George Young (23). William Cork was listed as United Brethren Minister with property valued at \$18,000 and personal property valued at \$2,000. Two of his sons, Robert and John, lived on either side of him.

1880 census, Rossville, Vermilion, IL: William was listed on the census as a retired farmer with real estate valued at \$8,400 and personal property worth \$1,000. In his household was wife Roseann (47), Henry (36), and Rose Spellman (11). wife's sister's child.

Notes for JEMIMA MILLER: Christened 27 July 1803 at St. David, Exeter, Devon, England (FamilySearch.org). She was the daughter of Daniel and Elizabeth Miller. Her parents' names are listed but no other proof has been found for the identity of her parents. The 1860 census shows her being born in Virginia.

Notes for HENRY M. C. CORK: Henry lived with his father until he died, then lived with his brother, Robert, in St. Marie, Jasper Co, IL until 1909 when he died. Russ Puzey wrote, "He had been adjudged by court action to be a legally distracted person. His father willed him 110 acres of land which Henry C. Cork retained until his death." His heirs sold the land soon after the inheritance. Henry's sister's son received 1/3; his brother Robert received 1/3; and the other 1/3 was divided between the 8 children of his brother John.

(*WILLIAM*<sup>4</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>3</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>2</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>1</sup>) was born August 20, 1813 in Woodford, Plympton, Plymouth, Devon, England<sup>24</sup>, and died September 26, 1892 in Jamaica at St. Ann's Bay, age 80, interred the Sacred Area, Parish Church Cemetery, St. Ann's Bay Church, Jamaica<sup>24</sup>. He married (1) PAULINA SHEPHERD March 12, 1839. She was born March 1811 in England, and died September 9, 1854 in Jamaica, interred St. Ann's Bay Parish Church Cemetery<sup>24</sup>. He married (2) ANN ELIZA BENNETT September 20, 1855 in Jamaica<sup>24</sup>. She was born 1819 in England, and died April 4, 1874 in The Rectory, St. Anns, Jamaica<sup>24</sup>. He married (3) JEAN BRUCE GORDON HOGG May 17, 1882 in Jamaica, W.I., daughter of ANDREW GORDON HOGG. She died Aft. 1891.

Notes for REV. JOSIAS CORK, REV.: Josias was christened on July 11, 1819 at Frant, Sussex, England. He emigrated about 1837 from England to the Island of Jamaica. He is mentioned on the web site of the Jamaica National Building Society. Members of his congregation benefited by the founding in 1874 of the St. James Benefit Building Society. According to the same web site, Rev. Cork founded the St. Ann Benefit Building Society in 1874.

The 1860, 1861, and 1862 Jamaica Almanacs (which provide information for 1859, 1860 and 1861) show Josiah Cork as the Curate for Chapelton, Clarendon, at a salary of £340 per annum.

The 1864 and 1865 Almanacs (providing information for 1863 and 1864) show him as the Rector of Savannalamar, Westmoreland, at a salary of £400 per annum.

Extract from The Diocesan Gazette, September 1924, pp 22 & 23 - THE REV. JOSIAH CORK

A Brief Record by his Eighth Son.

In St. Ann, my father's health returned. The Rectory then was 2 miles from St. Ann's Bay; several years after it was sold and a spot adjoining the Church bought for a Rectory. My father much enlarged the residence. Just below is the office of St. Ann's Benefit Building Society, which the late Hon. Michael Solomon, Custos, and my father founded in 1874. The Custos was President, my father secretary, his daughter Paulina Assistant Secretary. Both founders died in 1892; she became Secretary, retiring in 1923. Father and daughter also conducted a large Penny Bank, which she managed after my father's death. Alfred Cork, 11th August, 1924.

His newspaper obituary appeared in "*The Daily Gleaner*" on Monday, October 3, 1892. Headline: "The Late Rev. Josias Cork of St. Anns Bay"

"After thirty-five years of faithful service in Jamaica, the Rev. Josias Cork, late Rector of St. Anns Bay passed away to his rest at noon on Sunday the twenty sixth September in his 80th year. In sorrowful tones many were heard to say, 'our good old Rector is gone, he was a good useful man.'" The obituary goes on to mention his 22 years at the Episcopal Church in St. Anns Bay and his skill as an Engineer and mathematician. He laid out many of the country roads in that area. He died of bronchitis. of Josias Cork Rector of Westmoreland but residing at St. Ann's Bay in the Parish of St. Ann and doing the like duties as Rector of the Parish Church at St. Ann's Bay by consent of the authorities under legal authority, hereby notify that I am about to retire from active duty on a ... legally provided for a case such as mine. I deem it right at this special juncture to declare this to be my last Will and Testament I hereby revoking all other and former wills whensoever and wheresoever made by me.

My will to be this. I am possessed of property landed and personal. From such means, my funeral expenses are to be paid, which I desire should be plain ...and if money shall not suffice then such portion of my property Kellets in the Parish of Clarendon shall be sold to the amount needed or leaving this property intact then my premises at Saint Ann's Bay may be sold. But, all such lands as I die possessed of and left by me unencumbered, with any and every personality, I give in equal proportions, my sons having made their place and income in the Island, to my four daughters Paulina Cork Matilda Cork Annie Eliza Cork and Caroline Augusta Cork share and share alike. And I desire that my Executors shall have full power to sell my... property or deal with the same as shall best provide an

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income for each of my said daughters, or to use and occupy as may be deemed best. My desire is that my executors shall do their best for their sisters so that a sufficient income may be to each.

My executors I name, William Cork my son Collector of Internal Revenue now residing at Spanish Town and my son Philip Clarke Cork Protector of Immigrants now in Europe but shortly expected to return to Jamaica to resume the duties of his office.

My will is thus short, simple, and if possible with full liberty to my Executors to do their best for their sisters after my decease. And should either decease before myself and I do not make another will resulting there from then the survivors shall have in equal proportions the share which would have fallen to ... alive.

Provided however that if either or all marry the children of the marriage or marriages will have the mother's share if mother ....the time of my decease.

My wife, if alive, will have her annuities from Rectors ..... Fund.

Witness my hand and seal this 13th day of March 1891.

**CODICIL**

My wife Jean Bruce Gordon Cork is now an inmate in the lunatic asylum Kingston. She will be entitled to her annuities from the Rectors and the Island Curates Fund these funds I direct my Executors should expend for her if still in the asylum. If elsewhere the provisions thus made shall be for her exclusive benefit or use or for disposal by her as may be deemed best.

Any cash standing at my credit on shares in the St. Ann Benefit Building Society, in the Bank of Nova Scotia, any cash as may be realised from any Security or Securities held by me, and any moneys that might be due and owing to me as well as any other of my Estate real or personal to be equally divided among my three sisters Matilda Cork, Annie Eliza Cork and Caroline Augusta Cork after all my just debts and funeral expenses are paid. John and Margaret are buried in Mann's Chapel Cemetery, Vermilion Co, IL.

Notes for OCIE ANNA SMITH: Ocie Anna Mandillan Smith - "Anna" - was born March 16, 1869 in Arcadia, IN, the 6th of 7 children of Ebenezer Hugh and Mary Powell (Kuntz) Smith. The family moved to Rossville (from Marion Co, just east of Indianapolis) in the fall of 1884 when Anna was 15. They initially lived on a farm one mile west of town, then in Potomac for a year, and then in 1888 bought the home at 202 Harrison St. Anna's father worked in several occupations through the years, including teaching school, running restaurants in Rossville and Potomac, and operating a cigar factory in Rossville. Her name "Ocie Anna" was a variation on the Greek "Oceanna" and was a "fashionable" name for girls at that time. Her father was a schoolteacher and farmer and her mother was a German immigrant who had come to the U.S. by herself at age 12. The family moved from the Indianapolis area to Rossville, IL in the fall of 1884 when Anna was 15. They came in large part because her mother's sister, Margaretha (Kuntz) Habel, and her husband had moved to Rossville a few years earlier and encouraged Anna's parents to come too. The family initially lived on a farm owned by Thomas Armstrong on the north side of the Rossville Road a mile west of town, and Anna and her younger brother Sam walked to and from Rossville to go to school. They moved to nearby Potomac in 1886 and were there for 2 years, then back to Rossville in 1888 and bought the house at 202 Harrison St. Anna's father worked in several occupations through the years, including teaching school, running restaurants in Potomac (1886-1888) and Rossville (1888 - 1893), and operating a cigar factory in Rossville (1893 - 1900). Anna worked with her mother at home taking care of the family and also helped her father and brothers in the restaurants and the cigar factory.

On Oct. 22, 1895 Anna (age 26) married a Rossville man named Charles William Cork in the living room of her parents' home at 202 Harrison. Shortly after their marriage, the couple moved to Indianapolis where Anna had a son, Charles Ebenezer "Charlie" Cork, on Aug. 7, 1899. Unfortunately, Anna had serious complications associated with the birth and after suffering for 13 months died on Sept. 4, 1900 at age 31. She was buried in the Rossville cemetery in the Smith family plot where her parents, older sister Laura, and twin nephews who died at birth (first children of Anna's brother Sam) were later buried. Her small stone only says "Anna". After Anna's death, her son Charlie lived at 202 Harrison with Anna's parents, sister Laura, and brother Sam until 1913 when he was 14 years old. At that point he moved to Indianapolis to live with his father and remained there the rest of his life. Anna's brother, Samuel Q. Smith, became a prominent businessman in Rossville and lived there (at the family home at 202 Harrison) until his death in 1964. He adored Anna and often said it was a tragedy that she was taken so young. And Sam always thought of Charlie as a surrogate son (posted to find-a-grave Memorial #166814279).

ORA "ORY"<sup>7</sup> CORK/COOK (*JOHN*<sup>6</sup> *CORK*, *WILLIAM*<sup>5</sup>, *WILLIAM*<sup>4</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>3</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>2</sup>, *JOSIAS*<sup>1</sup>) was born August 18, 1878 in Rossville or Danville, Vermilion, IL<sup>141</sup>, and died July 13, 1927 in New Orleans, LA, age 48, interred Ponchatoula Cemetery. He married MARY M. "MAMIE" THIELSEN October 24, 1907 in New Orleans, LA, daughter of REGINUS THIELSEN and MARY KELLER. She was born August 14, 1882 in Springfield, Livingston Parish, LA<sup>142</sup>, and died April 21, 1947 in Charity Hospital, New Orleans, LA, interred Ponchatoula Cemetery.

Notes for ORA "ORY" CORK/COOK: Ora was the 7th child and youngest son of John and Margaret Cork. Nothing is known about his childhood in northern Illinois. In July 1899, Ora Cork was bound over to the grand jury for participating in a "white cap" outrage in Rossville, IL, and he was released on a \$300 bond. About a dozen men went to James Briley's house, called him outside, whipped, then covered him with tar (Daily Commercial Newspaper, Danville, IL, July 11, 1899 issue), reportedly because Briley had not taken care of his family. The men were accompanied by Henry German, brother of Briley's wife. In a newspaper article, Ora was called a "Saloon Loafer" and was described as having a "lantern-jawed face" and an unforgettable chin" (Danville Daily News, 12 July, 1899). On the 1900 census, he was listed as Ora Cook, and was living with his sister, Nora Huffer. Did he skip out on his bail and change his name to evade the law? Soon after the "white capper" incident, his parents moved to Mississippi. Did he skip out of town before his trial? His father's obituary in 1905 indicated that Ora was living in Ridgeland, Mississippi. By 1907 he had gone to Louisiana, possibly because he was working as a Pile Driver Engineer and Assistant Bridges Foreman for Illinois Central Railroad. His 1907 marriage license lists Ora's real last name as Cork. In 1910, Ora sold his inheritance from his Uncle Henry, and family tradition is that he and Mamie went to Rossville or Danville about that time. According to his daughter-in-law, Ora and his wife had a car in Hammond before his death - perhaps he bought the car with his inheritance from his uncle Henry C. Cork who died in 1909. His WWI draft registration listed his height as medium and his build as stout, and he had gray eyes and brown hair. Ora died suddenly at the age of 49 of a skull fracture, and his son Roy always told his family that a load of lumber was dropped on him. In fact, Ora was working at a company that made strawberry boxes when he was killed by a fall from a scaffold. Ora did not die immediately, and he was taken to Presbyterian Hospital in New Orleans where he died the next day. His body was returned to Hammond, LA via the Illinois Railroad on 14 Jul 1927 at 3pm.

"Hammond, LA, July 15. Ora Cook suffered a fatal accident Tuesday afternoon at the plant of the Standard Box and Veneer Company. While engaged in the construction of a new unit to the factory a derrick released a large piece of timber which fell upon Mr. Cook, inflicting a fracture of the skull, breaking of his leg, and internal injuries. Rushed to a New Orleans hospital in the ambulance of C. Marvin Poole, the injured man lived until 6 o'clock Wednesday morning. His body was brought here Wednesday night and the funeral and burial occurred Thursday. He was for many years associated with the Illinois Central railroad in the construction department. At that time, he and his family lived in Ponchatoula. After retiring from railroad service, he moved to Hammond where he has resided for many years. He leaves a widow and several children, among the latter being Ora Cook, Jr." (source: *The State Times*, Friday, July 15, 1927, p. 9A).

On 27 Aug 1927, Mamie, a widow, bought property in Hammond, LA, probably with the inheritance from her husband's estate. Less than two years later, on 8 Apr 1929, a Sheriff's sale of that property was held. Most likely, she lost the property because she could not pay the taxes. Mamie then moved with her family to a rooming house, where she worked cleaning rooms. Family tradition is that she was part Indian. Roy Lee told his family that he was raised Catholic, so it is assumed that Mamie was Catholic. This is quite odd since the church in Burg where her father lived is Lutheran.

In 1946, the last time her daughter-in-law saw her, she wore her hair in a bun. The informant on Mamie's death certificate was her daughter, Mrs. Charles B. Archer (either Violet or Helen). Her address at death was 107 E. Morris St., Hammond, LA, and cause of death was Gastro-intestinal hemorrhage due to carcinoma of Cecum. According to their death certificates, Ora and Mamie are buried in Ponchatoula Cemetery, Hammond, LA but there are no markers.

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1900 census, Danville Twp, Vermilion Co, IL: Ora Cook (20) lived with his sister Dora and brother-in-law John Huffer. Note: The fact that he is clearly listed in 1900 as "Cook" might mean that he was eluding the law by using his mother's maiden name.

1910 census, Ponchatoula, Tangipahoa Parish, LA: Ora Cook (29), Mayme (27), and son Ora Alfred (15 mos). Ora's occupation was listed as Assistant Foreman Bridges. The family lived on Beech Street and rented their home.

1920 (Jan) census, Hammond, Tangipahoa Parish, LA: Ory Cook (40), his wife Mamie (38), and children Ory Jr. (10), William (8), Charles (4), and Helen L. (22 mos). Mamie's mother, Margaret Tilson (68) lived with the family. It appears that they lived on S. Church St. with the Timmon family. Ora's occupation looks like Laborer, Railway.

1930 census, 100 Morris Ave, Hammond, LA: Mamie Cook (48), Ory, 21, Charles, 15, Helen, 12, Violet, 9, Roy Lee, 7. Roomers were Jack Jells, Virginia, and his wife Ruth. Mamie was proprietress of the rooming house where rooms rented for \$25.00 per month.

1940 census, 100 East Morris Ave. Hammond, LA: Mamie Cook (57) with children Ora (28), Charles (24), Helen Louise (22), Marie Violet (19), Roylee Joseph (17), and grandson Samuel Claude (5); also two lodgers. Mamie was Proprietor, Rooming House, Ora was a News boy, Charles was an Advertising Agent, and Helen was a Saloon Maid. House #109. The writing is partly smeared so the family is not indexed. I found them by searching all the pages in Hammond.

Notes for MARY M. "MAMIE" THIELSEN: Obituary: Mrs. Mamie Cook, mother of "Ory" Cook, passed away Monday in a New Orleans hospital. Funeral services were held Wednesday at the Thomas Funeral Home. Interment was in the Ponchatoula cemetery. She is survived by three sons, "Ory" Cook, Roy Lee, and Charles Cook; two daughters Mrs. Violet Bradstreet and Miss Helen Cook (*The Hammond Vindicator*, Hammond, LA, 25 April 1947, Sec. 1, p. 1).

Notes for ORA ALFRED COOK, JR.: After his mother died in 1947, it is not known how or where Ory lived, but on 17 Oct 1949 he was committed to the East Louisiana State Hospital, probably because of his epilepsy. He was also diagnosed with mild psychosis. On 25 May 1973 he was transferred to the Hillhaven Nursing Home #3 in Gonzales, LA where he later died.

Newspaper story: *Hammond Vindicator*, 18 Nov 1949

"Several have contacted me concerning the sad plight of Ory Cook, who was recently transferred from the hospital at Independence to the Institution at Jackson. Many say that Ory should not be in Jackson, but right here in Hammond where he handled the Times-Picayune for many years, and where his services are missed. It is said that no one cared to accept Ory as a boarder and lodger, hence authorities deemed it wise to let him remain in Jackson. One friend of the boy said that he would donate \$10 toward building Ory a small place in which he could sleep and get his meals at one of the numerous restaurants and cafes. Maybe the Times-Picayune would feel inclined to assist in getting Ory a place to lay his head. He certainly was faithful to the paper over a period of many years."

Another article appeared in the same paper on 2 Dec 1949 indicating that Ory Cook was a "well known newsboy here for many years and who is missed by the citizens in general." This article states that a letter was received stating that Ory was transferred from the East Louisiana Hospital of Jackson. The letter states that Ory was receiving "the best of food, a good place to sleep, and is where he will receive further privileges when he is better." It goes on to state that he is receiving "shots, shocks, and medicine to help for his affliction."

Notes for ROY LEE COOK: Roy was only five years old in 1927 when his father died after an accident at a strawberry packing company. He had always claimed that a black man had dropped a load of lumber on his dad and that's what killed him. Ory's obit partially confirms that story. He was the youngest of 8 children, but he grew up without the guidance of a father. My mother claimed that he was raised and teased mercilessly by his older brothers. The only brother I met was Charles, known to me as "Uncle Red." He visited us twice that I remember in Washington D.C. He and my father enjoyed drinking beer together and I recall that they gave me a taste when I asked if it tasted good. They had a good laugh at my face after the taste. The 2nd time Uncle Red visited us he had returned from a tour in South Korea where he was involved in the Korean War. I was never told any details, but when he came into our apartment, I ran up to him and jumped into his arms. My mother admonished me not to jump on him due to his hurt back.

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Cookie dropped out of school after or during the 10th grade. He always kept his football sweater and was proud of it. In hindsight I wonder if the reason he didn't finish high school was that he was a poor reader. While I was growing up, I don't recall him ever reading a book. He did read the sports section of the newspaper but never a book that I recall. His military record shows that while in high school, he worked at a gas station. Just before he enlisted in the military, in 1941 until June 42, he worked for a Milk Produce Company. That work entailed driving a 2.5 ton truck hauling produce on long distance trips. He loaded and unloaded the truck and made minor repairs.

A newspaper article with a picture of Roy, known as "Cookie," in uniform, age 20, was titled "Completes Course." He had received a certificate of proficiency as an aircraft maintenance mechanic. The certificate stated that "Private Cook had successfully completed the prescribed course and practical examination given under the supervision of the West Coast Air Force Training center at Albuquerque Air Base, New Mexico." According to an Honorable Discharge form, Roy had enlisted in the 385th Air Service Gp on 26 June 1942 in Baton Rouge, LA. My parents never told me what he did during the first year after he enlisted, but by 1943, he was in Miami Beach where he met my mother. She told me he was a drill sergeant in Miami but no other details were given. There is one picture of him in Miami pointing a rifle, and a picture taken in Dec 1945 reveals a sharpshooter pin. I have no information about how he earned that one. His military record shows he was a private during basic training and was promoted to Sergeant after that. At first, he drove a truck. Then for 24 months he was a Duty NCO who trained recruits in the school of soldier, drill, use of weapons. He trained about 110 men at a time.

His military occupational specialty was given as "Duty NCO 566." Battles and campaigns were given as "Sou Philippines (Liberation); Luzon." He received the following decorations: Theater ribbon w/2 Bronze stars; American Theater Ribbon; Philippine Liberation Ribbon w/2 Bronze stars; Good Conduct Medal; Victory Medal World. Service outside the U.S. began on 4 Jan 1945 when he went to the Philippines, arriving on 1 Feb 1945. He left there 26 Nov 1945 and arrived in the U.S. on 12 Dec 1945. Roy was discharged from the Army Air Corp on 20 Dec 1945 at Sep Cen Camp Atterly, Indiana at the rank of Sgt. Pictures among my father's possessions also show he spent some time in Japan during the occupation in 1945, but he never told me about that service. It was only years after his death when we found the pictures from Japan that I learned he had been there.

Three pictures are dated in his handwriting showing he was in Chitose, Hokkaido Province, Japan on 3 Nov 1945. Another picture shows him with two other men in Irumagawa, Honshu Province, Japan dated 10 Nov 1945. The last picture in the group shows Roy with a colleague in Camp Anza, San Pedro, CA on 14 Dec 1945. When I asked my mother about his overseas service during the war, she said he was not in any battles but he worked as a mechanic. Sure enough, his military record shows that in Sept 1944, he served at Page Field, Florida as an Auto Equipment operator.

Another Honorable Discharge form shows he reenlisted 20 Dec. 1945 and was discharged 19 March 1946 at Hqs La Mil Distr., New Orleans, LA. According to my mother, Roy looked for work in South Bend, IN where she was living but he couldn't find anything. He also looked for work in Hammond, LA but again had no luck. At that point, he reenlisted and remained in the Air Force for 20 years; he retired with a pension at the age of 39.

During his 20 years in the Air Force, our family was stationed in the following places:

Washington, D.C. Bowling Air Force Base

Panama Canal Zone - Balboa Air Force Base.

Massachusetts -- Westover Air Force Base, rank up to Tech Sergeant

Ft. Worth Texas - Carswell AFB, worked on B52 airplanes on the flight line.

There are many more stories about my dad which I will add to this working file. I've begun posting pictures on FamilySearch with my tree - they are public so anyone can go look at them.

Elgin woman was devoted to family, faith

Villa Cork was a homemaker who told her 13 children she wanted to see them in heaven. "She was a wonderful, wonderful woman who was a dedicated mother, grandmother and wife," said her son, Floyd Cork of Huntley. "She had a strong faith, which she instilled in all her children. She said, 'I want to see each one of you in heaven.'" Mrs. Cork died New Year's Day at Rosewood Care Center of Elgin, a week short of her 99th birthday. Her daughter, Evona Krarup believes that keeping busy and being around her family contributed to her long life. She never lacked for visits from her extensive family. Mrs. Cork is survived by 12 children, 42 grandchildren, 79 great-grandchildren, and 5 great-great-grandchildren. "She was always doing something for everyone," Evona recalled. "It was cooking, or baking or taking care of the children. She also helped out at the church (Elgin Church of the Nazarene) with crafts."

Mrs. Cork had lived in Elgin independently until two weeks ago when she entered the hospital with pneumonia. She did her own cooking and tended her garden until about two years ago and did her own canning and freezing when her children were growing up.

"She was a God-fearing woman," said Gary Griffin of Barrington. His wife, Lynette, is one of the grandchildren.

"We visited her on Christmas, and she asked me to bring her Bible from home. She was still reading it. She wasn't your typical 98-year-old."

Mrs. Cork was born Jan. 8, 1910 in Bismark, Ind., and raised on a farm. She married Albert Cork, who was also from a farming family. They bought 10 acres to farm in Burlington, Ill., but Albert had to go to work during the Great Depression.

"He worked for a division of Illinois Tool Works," said Floyd Cork. "He was devoted to the company. He stood up against the union because he said he would never go against a company which had given him a job and allowed him to put food on the table. My mother stood with him on that."

Mrs. Cork moved to Elgin after her husband died in 1975 of cancer at age 65.

In addition to her son and daughter, Mrs. Cork is survived by daughters Irene Ludwig of West Chicago, Lella Kramka of Woodstock, Freeda Springer of Hopedale, Ill., Wanda Swanson of Elgin, Janice Sneed of Ypsilanti, Mich. and Rita Evan of Elgin. She is survived by her sons Merrill of Huntley, Leland of Elgin, Harlan of Burlington and Carl of Greensborough, Georgia. She was preceded in death by her son, Glen.

He was a lifelong farmer in the Jamaica, Illinois area. He served in the U.S. Navy during World War II and upon returning he married the daughter of Charles and Jenny Cork (both deceased). He and Patsy first met at about the age of 9-10 in the tiny one-room schoolhouse that stood just behind the house in which he was born and grew up. That same house, together with the one in which Patsy now lives, was where they raised their six children. Patsy was the love of his life.
