TIMOTHY⁵ CORY (*ISSAC⁴, THOMAS³, THOMAS², UNKNOWN¹*)¹ was born October 27, 1741 in Weston, Middlesex Co, MA², and died September 19, 1811 in Brookline, Norfolk Co, MA, buried in Walnut Street Cemetery, Tomb Q, Brookline, MA. He married ELIZABETH GRIGGS April 07, 1767 in Massachusetts, daughter of THOMAS GRIGGS and MARGARET WILLIAMS. She was born October 12, 1745 in Roxbury, Suffolk Co, MA, and died November 18, 1837 in Brookline, Norfolk Co, MA, buried in Walnut Street Cemetery.

Notes for CAPT. CAPT. TIMOTHY CORY:

According to the Brookline, MA historical society Timothy settled in Brookline, Mass. in 1760. Timothy served in Capt. Thomas White's Brookline Co. and in Col. William Heath's Regiment, which marched on the alarm of 19 April 1775. He is on a list of men who delivered firelocks on 23 Jan. 1776 (source: Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors in the War of the Revolution). His rank was first Sergeant, then Captain. Timothy apparently moved his family to Vermont, after the Revolutionary War, because his 10th child was born in Derby Line, Vermont. His next child was born in Brookline, and the next again in Vermont. Why did he move back and forth between Massachusetts and Vermont? Was he simply trying to avoid paying taxes after the war? Proof is needed of where his children were born.

Middlesex Co. was one of the four original counties in Massachusetts incorporated 10 May 1643. Brookline (incorporated 1705) is 4 miles west of Boston, and Weston is 12 miles west of Boston. Derby Line, VT was chartered in 1788 and is next to the Canada border. It's likely that the border with Canada shifted back and forth during this period.

Notes for ELIJAH CORY: Elijah was a deacon in the Brookline Baptist Church and a trustee of Newton Theological Seminary.

1850 census, Brookline, Norfolk Co, MA: Elijah Corey (76), wife Lucy (63) and two others who were born in Ireland. A teenage named Lucy B. C____ (14) was also in the household. Her birthplace begins with "B" but it was not legible. Elijah's property was valued at \$100,000 which is a fortune for that time - I wonder if a mistake was made. Elijah's grandson, Francis H. Cory, was living two doors down and there were two other Corey families nearby.

Notes for CHARLES CORY:

Orleans Co, VT was organized in 1792 so Charles Cory must have been an early settler there. He moved there before 1804, probably just after the Revolutionary War when many people moved to Vermont to escape the taxes levied by the new United States government. Derby Line is only 8 miles from the Canadian border and 30 miles from Greensboro, VT. Derby was chartered in Oct 1779, and by 1800 the population was 178. Derby Line was a post village on the line between Derby and Canada, and the first permanent settlement was in 1795. Did the Patterson and Cory families travel there together from Massachusetts? Were they neighbors in MA?

1820 census, Derby, Orleans Co, VT: Charles Corey listed among others alphabetically. He is shown age 45 or older with 3 males 18 or younger and 3 females under 16. These ages match his sons Sylvester, Ira, Cyrus, Charles & Orin. His presumed wife on this record is shown 45 or older, which does not match with a birth date of 1784 for Mary, his wife. Charles does not appear on the 1830 census for Derby, VT.

Notes for MARY "POLLY" P. BAILEY:

Was Polly the daughter of James Bailey, an early settler in 1780 in Peacham, VT? She could also be the daughter or sister of Joshua Bailey who appears on the 1830 census in Derby, Vermont, born 1760-1770. Joshua lived next door to Timothy Correy, born 1800-1810.

In 1850, Mary P. Corey was living in Greene, Trumbull Co, OH with her son Orin and his family. Her age was shown as 66, meaning that she could not have died in 1843, as shown on the Cory Family Website. It makes sense that she lived with her oldest son. Unless she remarried, she had no other choice but to live with one of her children. It's possible that the person reporting to the census taker did not know her true age, since she was shown as age 45+ in 1820, making her born before 1776. Polly was not found on the 1860 census, so I presume she died between 1850 - 1860.

1830 census - not yet found. Orin would be about age 26.

1840 census, Greene, Trumbull Co, OH: Orin Corey, age 30-39, with 2 males under 5 and 1 male age 10-15. His presumed wife was age 30-40. He lived near his brother Cyrus Cory and also Edward Bailey (perhaps a relative of his mother).

1850 census, Greene Twp, Trumbull Co, OH (M432_733, p. 356): Orrin Corey (41), farmer, Polly Corey (43), and their children John (12), Nelson (11), Dwight (8), Lois (7), Sylvia (5), Charles (3), and Mary (1). Mary Bailey Corey (66) also lived with the family. Value of property in 1850 was listed as \$4,000.

Notes for ANSEL PATTERSON, JR.:

The exact date when Ansel and Eunice moved to Ohio has not been found, but it's likely that he moved with his brothers to Trumbull Co in 1834, along with several members of the Cory family. Ansel Patterson is found in a listing of "Entrymen on Lands" in Jackson Co, OH. The sale date was 22 April 1839 in Gallia County for 40.45 acres. This purchase was recorded at the Land Office in Chillicothe (source: Certificate #11149 from the General Land Office). The legal land description showed it was part of the Ohio River Survey (Act of 24 April 1820), 6N Township, 18W Range, Section #1. On this land record, he is listed as "of Gallia County, Ohio." Ansel left no will and clearly he died suddenly and prematurely, perhaps from a farming accident.

In early life she became a Christian and was ever firm in that live and faith of her Savior. Almost 9 years ago she met with an accident which resulted in her hip being broken, since which time she has been confined to the home. Coming to Savonburg the first of last November to spend the winter months with her daughter, Mrs. Flora Courtney, she was taken ill of senile gangrene the latter part of December, passing to her eternal rest March 2, 1912, after nine long weeks of untol suffering during which her patient, loving nature was ever in evidence." Brief funeral services were held and a quartette beautifully sang "Lead Kindly Light," a song Mary had expressed a desire to hear shortly before she was taken ill. Mr. and Mrs. Courtney sang it for her, and she expressed her appreciation of the beautiful words. Rev. Blalock, or Moran, conducted the final funeral services after which she was laid to rest by the side of her husband.

Aaron grew up with his parents in Ohio, near Mentor, part of the Western Reserve, about 25 miles NE of Cleveland in "Lake Country." There he joined the Christian Church. "He was immersed by the lamented James A. Garfield" (source: Newspaper Obituary). Garfield had attended seminary and Hiram College, and he preached the Disciples of Christ doctrine, mainly in Hiram, OH. At age 20, Aaron was living with his family in 1850 in Clinton Twp, Vinton Co, OH and his future wife was also in Clinton at that time. Did they attend the same church? Aaron and Mary Bailey Patterson were married in 1856 by an M.E. minister named Cherrington, who was on the Hamden circuit from 1856 to 1858. After marriage, they moved to Marion, Crittenden Co. (formed 1842) Kentucky, along with his brother Henry. KY Courthouse, Book D., p. 473). This date shows that Aaron made the trip to KY to buy land before he married. Aaron and Mary sold land to Henry Reed on 24 Jan 1857. Aaron and Mary B. Reed sold 300+ acres of land to H.S. Reed on 19 Sept 1857 for \$752 (Book D. p. 630). These are the only two land records for A.W. Reed, although I did find his name mentioned in Deed Book M, p. 189, showing that land was owned jointly by John P. Reed, Aaron Reed and his wife Mary B. Reed, and Amos Reed. Aaron was in Kentucky throughout the Civil War, and is listed

as a member of the KY Militia, reorganized 5 Mar 1860 "for the use and defense of the state." Militia members were mainly Union men, but KY was technically a "neutral" state (source: 1865 Crittenden Co, KY Militia List).

After Henry died in 1868, John and Amos D. bought the widow's interest in the land. Thus the three brothers had their finances in common until Amos was married. In 1870, John and Amos bought Aaron's interest in the land, according to Amos' account. However, I could not find a land record for this sale which should have been in 1869. Aaron moved his family from KY to Neosho County, Kansas in 1870, settling on the Osage ceded land. He was a resident of Big Creek Twp for 21 years, and lived next door to the Allen Haymaker family. Living nearby was the Richardson family; their son Henry married Alice Reed. A.W. Reed's will was dated and was written in Big Creek Township, Neosho Co, KS. The will was probated June 22, 1891 with M.A. Richardson as Executor. Aaron and Mary are buried in Leanna Cemetery, Leanna, Neosho Co, KS.

In 1870, at the age of 10, Carrie Reed traveled with her parents and 4 siblings from Kentucky to a farm in Neosho Co, Kansas. The census shows that the Reed and Haymaker families lived one door down from each other in Leanna, KS. At the age of 21, she married her neighbor and schoolmate Frank Haymaker. Nothing is known about their married lives except that they had 3 children. Carrie, Frank and the children were living in Pittsburg, Crawford Co, KS in 1900, and the census indicates that she was a "landlady." The copy of her Divorce Decree indicates that Frank deserted the family in 1906. By summer, 1907 Carrie was living in Los Angeles, CA with Harry, age 15. She took him back to Kansas in the fall, and began divorce procedures on 7 Oct 1907, through her attorney Chris Ritter, waiving a jury trial. Carrie appeared in court on 14 Dec 1907 for the trial. Frank did not appear, and the divorce was granted. Carrie retained custody of her minor son, Harry, and she retained title to her property of 82 acres of land. She was back in Los Angeles by 25 Feb 1908, when she sent him a post card from the Hotel Lankershim. Her eldest son, Roy, was already married and living in Los Angeles by the time she moved there, but he is never mentioned in the numerous post cards that Carrie sent to Harry. In July 1908, Carrie took the train to Salt Lake City, probably because she suffered from rheumatism and hoped the weather would help. She arrived on 8 July, and wrote to her son, "If I get better of this rheumatism I think I will like it here." The next week, she wrote, "The weather is nice here and I don't freeze like I did in L.A. so am in hopes my rheumatism will get better in time." In September, Carrie was feeling better and she wrote to Harry about a visit to the Mormon Tabernacle to hear the organ recital. She was very impressed with the building and remarked that it had been finished when she was 7 years old. Carrie seems to have remained in Salt Lake City until after Christmas, 1908. She returned in Oakland, CA on 19 Jan 1909. My mother believes that Carrie ran a rooming house in Oakland California, but I have not yet found evidence to prove that fact.

There is evidence in Harry's post card collection that Carrie, and probably her 2nd husband Frank Lynn, visited Kansas in 1910, perhaps on their honeymoon. She was in Coffeyville, KS on May 10 and she indicated her intention to be in Iola to visit Harry in a few days. Carrie was back in Oakland, California by 4 Nov 1910 when she sent him a post card chiding him for not yet writing. She signed many of her postcards with the words, "love and kisses, Mama." Her final post card from Oakland was dated 21 Feb 1912. By 1920, Carrie and Frank Lynn were living on 19th Street in Oakland, California (US Census 1920, T625, Roll 89, p. 102). Frank was listed as an insurance solicitor. Carrie sent two post cards to her son in 1921, and they indicate she was living in Alameda, California. In April 1930, Frank and Carrie were living in Olympia, WA with Winnie and Cor Post and their children. After Frank died, he was cremated in Tacoma, WA. Carrie went back to Kansas to live with family members. She had 11 grandchildren. She died of a heart attack is buried in the family plot at Leanna Cemetery, Neosho Co, KS. The name on her tombstone is "Carrie Reed Lynn."

Notes for C.FRANK HAYMAKER:

Frank moved with his family from Iowa to Kansas when he was about 9 years old. He married the daughter of Aaron W. Reed, who lived one house down from his family. They were probably classmates in school.

TIMOTHY⁵, ISSAC⁴, THOMAS³, THOMAS², UNKNOWN¹*) was born February 13, 1862 in Gallipolis, Ohio near Hamden⁵², and died February 03, 1909 in Dallas, TX⁵³. He married MATTIE ROSS CARTER⁵⁴ August 28, 1888 in Paris, Texas. She was born January 19, 1868 in Florida, and died March 19, 1945 in Prob. Texas.

Notes for PROF. WILLIAM WALLACE FRANKLIN:

William graduated from Grand College at the age of 15, and he taught there for a short time after graduation. Then he engaged in newspaper work until 1885, when "he moved to Texas and became head of the department of belles lettres and oratory at Baylor University, Waco. While marked success came to him in this capacity during the ensuing ten years, 1885 - 94, he severed this connection and with Prof. G.H. Rowe, professor of violin at Baylor University, established the Lone Star School of Oratory & Music in Dallas, Tex. The partnership was dissolved some two years later and Prof. Franklin discontinued the teaching of music and confined his instruction to oratory and belles lettres. Failing health forced him to abandon this school in 1906. He went first to Alpine, Tex., but experiencing no benefit from a sojourn in that climate, he proceeded to Dillon, Colo., where he became president of a college. Early in 1908 he experienced a relapse, and returned to his family in Dallas, where he was confined to his bed until his death in Feb. 1909. Many orators in public and private life in Texas today received their early training under him. He made a lifelong study of English literature and elocution and knew many of the great tragedians, including Booth McCullough, Lawrence Barrette, Joseph Jefferson, and others. He was the author of Franklin's Outline of Rhetoric, and also numerous treatises bearing upon elocution. He was an active member of the Baptist Church" (Who's Who in Texas 1931, p. 264).

In 1901, "The Arlington College Exponent" was first published from "The Journal" printery. It was edited by Professor W.W. Franklin, president of Arlington College. In a review of his work, it was stated, "no abler instructor graced the halls of any college of our state. His editorials and notes are bright, sparkling, sharp and to the point" (source: Tarrant Journal, p. 114). William and Mattie are buried in Oakwood Cemetery, Waco, TX.
