Notes for ISAAC CORY: The origins of this man are unclear and he may not belong here as a son of Isaac Cory and Sarah Linda Cook. I have put him here in order to work on his line, which may include my ancestors.

3. TIMOTHY⁶ CORY (*JOSEPH⁵, ISAAC⁴, ISAAC³, JOHN², UNKNOWN¹*) was born December 17, 1740 in Plainfield, Windham, CT⁶, and died April 13, 1810 in Plainfield, NH. He married (1) JEANNE BOYD March 06, 1764 in Plainfield, Windham, CT⁶. She was born Abt. 1741 in Plainfield, CT, and died Abt. 1790. He married (2) MARTHA DERFE 1809.

Notes for TIMOTHY CORY: Timothy served as a Corporal in Col. Jonathan Chase's Regiment in the New Hampshire Militia. He was discharged 18 June 1777, and did not receive a pension.

1790 census, Plainfield, Sullivan, NH: 2 males (under 16), 3 males (16+) and 4 females for a total of 9 persons.
1800 census, Plainfield, Sullivan, NH: Timothy Cory 1M 10-16 and 3F 16-26
1800 census, New Grantham, Cheshire, New Hampshire
1810 census, Plainfield, Cheshire, New Hampshire: Timothy Cory (45+) and presumed wife (45+) for a total of 2 in the household. On the same page were his sons Noah and Robert, and his brother, Maneer (Mansur).

From Ruth E. Cory: I am descended from Job Cory - have following information from old letter from town clerk of Plainfield, NH

I spoke with the Plainfield, NH Town Clerk on 23 Oct 2013. She checked a book on the history of Plainfield, which was compiled by Vernon Hook, a former town Clerk. The following offices were held by Timothy Cory:

1775 - Sealer of Leather and Surveyor of Highways

1778 - tithingman and Surveyor of Highways

1796 - Tax Collector

1801 - Town Constable

1810 - Hog Constable

Because Timothy was a Tithingman, I assume he belonged to the Congregational Church, which was formed in 1779. His children would have been christened at another nearby church. The Town Clerk told me that Cheshire Co, NH has early records for NH.

She was born December 29, 1774 in Marlboro, MA¹¹, and died August 02, 1847 in Derby, Orleans, VT.

Notes for JOB CORY: He lived in Plainfield, Sullivan Co, NH in 1800. He was in Derby, Orleans Co, VT in 1810, as were Lyman, Timothy, and Charles.

1800 census, New Grantham, Cheshire, New Hampshire: Job Cory (26-44) with 3 boys (under 10) and a woman (16-25). Total of 5 in the household.

1810 census, Derby, Orleans, Vermont: 13 in the household.

6. HANNAH⁷ CORY (*TIMOTHY⁶, JOSEPH⁵, ISAAC⁴, ISAAC³, JOHN², UNKNOWN¹*) was born January 27, 1773 in Craftsbury, Orleans Co, VT or Plainfield, NH¹², and died October 18, 1847 in Derby, Orleans, VT. She married JOSHUA BAILEY, JR. July 13, 1794 in Plainfield, NH by Daniel Kimball, J.P., son of JOSHUA BAYLEY/BAILEY and MERCY DAVIS. He was born January 09, 1763 in Warwick, Franklin, MA¹³, and died April 11, 1843 in Derby, Orleans, VT, age 81, interred Derby Center Cemetery¹⁴.

Notes for JOSHUA BAILEY, JR.: Alternate birth date: January 09, 1767

Joshua fought in the Revolutionary War and received a pension for his service. He served June 13 to Dec. 1780 as a Private under Capt. Watson in the Massachusetts regiment of Gen. Poor's Brigade. He was on a payroll document for the Town of Marlborough, MA. He served again from July to August 1781 under Capt. Green and Capt John Benjamin at Bethel Fort for Vermont. He appeared at a court hearing in Derby, VT at age 69 on 16 Aug 1832 to testify about his service. The document from the Department of the Interior gives his birth date as 9 Jan 1763. It shows that he moved to Windsor, Vermont with his father in 1781. Joshua's residence when he applied for the pension was Derby, VT.

7. CHARLES⁷ CORY (*TIMOTHY⁶, JOSEPH⁵, ISAAC⁴, ISAAC³, JOHN², UNKNOWN¹*) was born Abt. 1774 in Prob. NH, and died September 05, 1843 in Ohio, buried in South Cemetery (also known as Kenilworth), Greene, Trumbull Co, OH¹⁵. He married MARY "POLLY" P. BAILEY Abt. 1803 in Derby Line, VT, daughter of JOSHUA BAYLEY/BAILEY and MERCY DAVIS. She was born January 18, 1785 in Windsor, VT¹⁶, and died June 29, 1858 in Milton (Greater Boston area), Norfolk, Massachusetts, age 74¹⁷.

Notes for CHARLES CORY: The book by Al Bertus Cory (1991) shows Charles as the son of Timothy Cory, b. 1756, a descendant of John Cory. However, there are no sources given so Charles' ancestry is not proven. A review of the baptisms in Weston, MA shows that all of Capt. Timothy Cory's children were listed but there was no son named Charles. Thus, I believe that my ancestor, Charles Cory, is a descendant of John Cory of Suffolk Co, NY. I have placed him as a son of Timothy Cory, b. 1740, but this may not be correct. In New Hampshire baptisms listed on ancestry.com, most of Timothy's children are shown, but not Charles.

Orleans Co, VT was organized in 1792 so Charles Cory must have been an early settler there. He moved there before 1804, probably just after the Revolutionary War when many people moved to Vermont to escape the taxes levied by the new United States government. Perhaps his parents also moved there but they are not listed as early settlers in Orleans Co. I did find a Timothy Corey in Brighton, Essex Co, VT (adjacent to Orleans Co) in the early 1800s along with Elijah Bailey. Derby Line is only 8 miles from the Canadian border and 30 miles from Greensboro, VT. Derby was chartered in Oct 1779, and by 1800 the population was 178. Derby Line was a post village on the line between Derby and Canada, and the first permanent settlement was in 1795.

It appears that Charles and Mary moved to Ohio with at least four of their sons and probably some of the Pattersons in the mid 1830s. More research needs to be done on this family but we know that at least four sons ended up in Greene, Trumbull Co, OH.

1810 census, Derby, Orleans, Vermont: Chas. Corey: 3 boys (under 10 - Orin, Ira, Cyrus), 1 male (age 26-40 - Charles); 1 girl (under 10 - Eunice), 1 female (16-25), 1 female (26-44 - Polly). Total of 7 in the household.
1820 census, Derby, Orleans Co, VT: Charles Corey listed among others alphabetically. He is shown age 45 or older with 3 males 18 or younger and 3 females under 16. These ages match his sons Sylvester, Ira, Cyrus, Charles & Orin. His presumed wife on this record is shown 45 or older, which does not match a birth date of 1784 for Mary, his wife.

1830 census, not found

1840 census - not yet found

Regarding the cemetery in Trumbull Co, OH, Kee Rodgers wrote, "Remember, there is no such cemetery as Kenilworth. That name came from a woman who called the South Cemetery (didn't know the name of it) the "Old Cemetery at Kenilworth." Firstly there is no Kenilworth, it was the Kenilworth Post Office just north of the cemetery. All the gene people because of the modern computer copied the incorrect name of Kenilworth Cemetery from a woman years later who did not read the "Old Cemetery at Kenilworth" correctly and thought it was the Kenilworth Cemetery. So she types up the cemetery list and makes the heading "Kenilworth Cemetery." No such animal. It's the "South Cemetery" or "Old South Cemetery" (14 April 2011).

Notes for MARY "POLLY" P. BAILEY: In 1850, Mary P. Corey lived in Greene, Trumbull Co, OH with her son Orin and his family - meaning that she could not have died in 1843, as shown on the Cory Family Website. Her age was shown as 66. It's possible that the person reporting to the census taker did not know her true age, since she was shown as age 45+ in 1820, making her born before 1776. She might be buried in Milton Cemetery, established 1672 but I did not find her burial record.

The birth dates for children are from "The Branching Tree" (vrichter, updated 28 Oct 2003) and verified by the names and dates on the 1850 and 1860 U.S. census records. On this record, Orrin was a farmer and had property valued at \$3000 and \$1900. Nelson was a school teacher and Dwight was a farmer. Louise was a student. Jerome's occupation was "domestic" while John was a student.

1870 census, Greene, Trumbull Co, OH: Orrin Cory (60), wife Polly (63), and daughters Mary (22) and Eva (17). Property was valued at \$4700 and personal property was \$3160. Orin was listed as farmer.

1880 census, Greene, Trumbull Co, OH: Orin (70) and Lizzie (48) Cory. His occupation was retired farmer.

1900 census, Greene, Trumbull Co, OH: Orin Cory (90) and Elizabeth G. Cory (60). He was listed as "capitalist" and he owned his home.

Notes for MARY "POLLY" PHILLIPS: The Cory Family website shows her birth date as 9 Feb 1800, but this contradicts three census records. In 1850 her age is given as 43; in 1860 her age is 52, and in 1870 her age is 63. These census records put her birth date as 1807-08.

1850 census, Greene, Trumbull Co, OH: Cyrus Cory (43) lived in the household of Horatio (42) and Caroline (42) Bascomb and their 6 children. Also in the household were Alvin Bailey (11), Caroline Newell (60), Angeline Hoyt (36) and Martha B. Hoyt (10). (Note that his family lived in the same town but not with him).

1860 census - Cyrus has not been found. Cyrus is said to have deserted his family and four small children before 1860 and moved to Michigan (source: Brenda Nolan).

1870 census, Pompeii PO, Washington, Gratiot Co, MI: Cyrus Corey (62) lived alone and was a farmer. Property valued at \$4000.

Notes for SOPHIA HAYFORD: In about 1835, Sophia Hayford, widow of Hiram Key (1806-1833), married Cyrus Cory. It would be interesting to find out more about how they met and how Sophia supported herself and her young son after her first husband died. She might have lived with Hiram's parents.

He was born March 1804 in Vermont, probably Barre, and died April 02, 1839 in Gallia Co (now Vinton), Ohio, age 35y 20d, buried in Markum Cemetery, Bloomfield Twp, Jackson Co, OH. Between 1841 - 1862, Eunice lived in Hamden Station, McArthur, Vinton Co, OH.

1860 census, Reeds Mill, Clinton, Vinton, Ohio: John (74) and Eunice (72) Johnston with daughters Emily (16) and Christenia (12). John was a farmer and Emily was a servant. They had property worth \$800 and \$625.

1870 census, Auglaize, York Twp, Van Wert Co, OH: Catherine Knapp (41), Wallis Knapp (19), Josephine Knapp (16), Sophronia Knapp (13), Eunice Johnson (63), and a domestic servant Samantha Knox (19).

1880 census: Eunice was living in York Twp, Van Wert Co, Ohio with her daughter, Catherine Knapp, in 1880 and Catherine's two children, Wallace and Josephine. Eventually she moved to Leanna, Kansas and lived with Aaron Reed and Mary Bailey Patterson (her daughter).

Eunice was buried on April 03, 1887 in Leanna Cemetery, Leanna Neosho Co, KS under the name Eunice Johnson.

After John Johnson's death, his personal property was appraised by Stephen Salts, O.P Guerning, and James Crow on 11 Oct 1862.

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Notes for ANSEL PATTERSON, JR.: The exact date when Ansel and Eunice moved to Ohio has not been found, but it's likely that he moved with his brothers to Trumbull Co in 1834, along with several members of the Cory family. Ansel Patterson is found in a listing of "Entrymen on Lands" in Jackson Co, OH. The sale date was 22 April 1839 in Gallia County for 40.45 acres. This purchase was recorded at the Land Office in Chillicothe (source: Certificate #11149 from the General Land Office). The legal land description showed it was part of the Ohio River Survey (Act of 24 April 1820), 6N Township, 18W Range, Section #1. On this land record, he is listed as "of Gallia County, Ohio." Ansel left no will and clearly he died suddenly and prematurely, perhaps from a farming accident or illness. 1830 census - not found

Notes for JOHN JOHNSON: According to a descendant, John served in the War of 1812 (phone conversation with Vivian Pencin, 1 Sept 2003). John had a land patent registered July 01, 1831 in Jackson Co, OH in McArthur (Twp. 5), on almost 81 acres (source: General Land Office, Chillicothe, OH, Certificate #1524). A biography of John Johnson (unknown source, photocopy) states that after John and Eunice married, they settled on 80 acres of land about 5 miles northeast of Hamden, not far from the John Tarr family near Puritan. Administrator of John's estate was his son, Henry Johnson. When inventory was taken, there was \$213.90 cash on hand. He was buried on September 26, 1862 in Tarr Cemetery, Clinton Twp, Vinton Co, OH.

JAMES BRADEN KILLED (9/22/1837-5/5/1910)

Well Known Citizen and Old Soldier Victim of Grade Crossing Accident at Cortland Monday Afternoon
DIED IN THE HOSPITAL IN THIS CITY

Struck by an eastbound Erie Main Line freight train at Cortland Monday afternoon, James Braden (b. 1837) of Greene, father of Postmaster George C. Braden of this city, received injuries that resulted in his death a few hours later. The accident occurred at the crossing, just west of the Cortland station and shortly after Mr. Braden had left this city to return home. Mr. Braden had been in Warren Monday and was in the best of health and spirits. He ate dinner with his son here and started home about the middle of the afternoon. Driving to Cortland he left his rig, at the mill of Richards Bros., where he secured some feed and walked over to the Barnes Hardware company's store. Securing some wool twine he started to walk back to the mill and had just cleared the north rail of the track when the train struck him. The cylinder head on the left side of the engine caught Mr. Braden on the left hip and hurled him some distance. He alighted on his head receiving several bad scalp wounds and tearing a portion of his scalp loose. Witnesses to the accident hurried to the injured man's side and carried him to the Erie station. Dr. McCurley of Cortland was immediately summoned and word of the accident sent to G.C. Braden of this city. Dr. McCurley made a superficial examination at the station and ordered him brought to the hospital here in Cross' ambulance. Mr. Braden did not lose consciousness following the accident and talked with his son and others at the station and on his way here. On the way to the hospital he was somewhat restless, and Dr. Ward of this city, who had been sent for, met the ambulance and administered to the injured man, easing his sufferings. When the ambulance arrived at the hospital he was still alive but passed away just as he was carried in and laid on a bed. Internal injuries caused his death.

James Braden was one of the pioneer citizens of Trumbull county and of Greene township. He was born in Greene nearly 77 years ago, on the farm where he was living at the time of his death. With the exception of about twelve years he spent his entire life in that township. One year he lived in Fowler township and for eleven years he resided on one of the Perkins farms east of this city in Howland township. For about twenty years in his early manhood Mr. Braden was in the cheese making business and after that he followed farming. He was a man of strict integrity and one who enjoyed the fullest confidence of those who knew him. His standing among his fellowmen was the highest and his reputation was as a good citizen and one who always held the purest motives. During the civil war he served in Co. C. 177th O.V.I. being a bunkmate of M.J. Sloan and Rev. E.B. Wakefield, both of whom enlisted from his township.

Surviving Mr. Braden are ten children as follows: Mrs. John J. Smith, Denver, Colo.; Mrs. C.W. Harrington, Rock Creek, Mrs. P.C. Hayes, Burghill; Dr. W.C. Braden, Orchard, Colo.; George C. Braden of this city; James A. Braden of Akron, and Mrs. Herbert Wilson of Niles. The remains were today taken to Greene where the funeral will be held. Compete arrangements have not been made, but the services will probably be held Thursday.

4. Was he killed in those conflicts? No, he died of a fever after an illness of 14 days (source: *Kansas Trails* website).
5. Where is Catherine buried? Should be in Venedocia, OH but not yet found.
6. 1840 census - Lucius was not found. Was he living with his parents? When did they move to Jackson Co, OH?
7. Did Lucas leave a will? The probate record for his estate was dated 13 April 1860 and Catherine was named administrator along with Zadock Lewis and H.C. Service. Her signature on the probate record shows she could probably read and write.
8. Did Catherine buy property in Van Wert, OH?

Notes for MARY BAILEY PATTERSON: Mary and her sister, Sophrona, were listed on the 1850 census for Clinton Twp, Vinton Co, Ohio in 1850 along with their mother, step-father, and siblings. Her obituary states, "21 years ago her beloved companion was taken home, since which time she has been lovingly cared for by her surviving children. In early life she became a Christian and was ever firm in that live and faith of her Savior. Almost 9 years ago she met with an accident which resulted in her hip being broken, since which time she has been confined to the home. Coming to Savonburg the first of last November to spend the winter months with her daughter, Mrs. Flora Courtney, she was taken ill of senile gangrene the latter part of December, passing to her eternal rest March 2, 1912, after nine long weeks of untol suffering during which her patient, loving nature was ever in evidence." Brief funeral services were held and a quartette beautifully sang "Lead Kindly Light," a song Mary had expressed a desire to hear shortly

before she was taken ill. Mr. and Mrs. Courtney sang it for her, and she expressed her appreciation of the beautiful words. Rev. Blalock, or Moran, conducted the final funeral services after which she was laid to rest by the side of her husband.

Notes for AARON WATSON REED: Aaron grew up with his parents in Ohio, near Mentor, part of the Western Reserve, about 25 miles NE of Cleveland in "Lake Country." There he joined the Christian Church. "He was immersed by the lamented James A. Garfield" (source: Newspaper Obituary). Garfield had attended seminary and Hiram College, and he preached the Disciples of Christ doctrine, mainly in Hiram, OH. At age 20, Aaron was living with his family in 1850 in Clinton Twp, Vinton Co, OH and his future wife was also in Clinton at that time. Did they attend the same church? Aaron and Mary Bailey Patterson were married in 1856 by an M.E. minister named Cherrington, who was on the Hamden circuit from 1856 to 1858. After marriage, they moved to Marion, Crittenden Co. (formed 1842) Kentucky, along with his brother Henry. In Kentucky Aaron acquired 960 acres of land on Penny Creek from D.A. and Matilda Butler on 12 May 1856 for \$1504 to be paid in three installments, starting with \$304 in cash (source: Crittenden Co. KY Courthouse, Book D., p. 473). This date shows that Aaron made the trip to KY to buy land before he married. Aaron and Mary sold land to Henry Reed on 24 Jan 1857. Aaron and Mary B. Reed sold 300+ acres of land to H.S. Reed on 19 Sept 1857 for \$752 (Book D. p. 630). These are the only two land records for A.W. Reed, although I did find his name mentioned in Deed Book M, p. 189, showing that land was owned jointly by John P. Reed, Aaron Reed and his wife Mary B. Reed, and Amos Reed. Aaron was in Kentucky throughout the Civil War, and is listed as a member of the KY Militia, reorganized 5 Mar 1860 "for the use and defense of the state." Militia members were mainly Union men, but KY was technically a "neutral" state (source: 1865 Crittenden Co, KY Militia List).

After Henry died in 1868, John and Amos D. bought the widow's interest in the land. Thus the three brothers had their finances in common until Amos was married. In 1870, John and Amos bought Aaron's interest in the land, according to Amos' account. However, I could not find a land record for this sale which should have been in 1869. Aaron moved his family from KY to Neosho County, Kansas in 1870, settling on the Osage ceded land. He was a resident of Big Creek Twp for 21 years, and lived next door to the Allen Haymaker family. Living nearby was the Richardson family; their son Henry married Alice Reed. A.W. Reed's will was dated and was written in Big Creek Township, Neosho Co, KS. The will was probated June 22, 1891 with M.A. Richardson as Executor.

ACQUISITION: This addition to the Orin G. Libby Papers was deposited in the Orin G. Libby Manuscript Collection by Margaret Libby Barr, Grand Forks, North Dakota in January 1986 and by Robert Barr, Bismarck, North Dakota, on March 10, July 1, and July 15, 1987 (Acc.# 86-1429, 87- 1508, 87-1521, 87-1573).

The addition to the Orin G. Libby Papers consists primarily of correspondence and diaries. The bulk of the correspondence is that of Orin G. Libby to his wife Eva Cory Libby, 1895-1916 and Libby family correspondence, 1849-1920. The majority of the diaries are those of Orin G. Libby written from 1880-1887, and 1929-1945. The letters of Orin G. Libby to Eva Cory Libby can be separated into two periods, the five years of courtship before 1900 and the years of marriage after 1900, each reflecting different concerns.

The courtship correspondence reveals the personalities of both Orin and Eva Libby and describes social conventions of the late nineteenth century. Letters also recount his teaching experience at the University of Wisconsin and his problems working under Frederick Jackson Turner. His correspondence relates Eva's teaching activities at Central School in Harriman, Tennessee, her music endeavors, and woman's place in society in general.

Libby's correspondence after their marriage comments on family matters and describes his work with the North Dakota Historical Society. He spent many summers on archaeological expeditions in an attempt to document the history and lifestyle of North Dakota's Indian population and to increase the Society's collection of Indian artifacts. Although the addition to the Libby Papers contains only a handful of letters from Eva, it does contain several important ones which describe her feelings regarding the Kane affair at the University of North Dakota and Libby's role in the attempted ouster of President Kane in 1920.

Libby family correspondence revolves around letters to and from Asa Libby, Orin Libby's father. Some describe Asa's trip west from Richmond, Maine in 1855 in search of land which he secured in Hammond, Wisconsin. Others describe family matters, health problems, and everyday concerns. Correspondents are Mary S. Webster, Asa's first wife who died in 1862; Julia Barrows Tidd, Asa's second wife, who died in 1872; brothers Lyman, Warren and Charles; children, Orin and William, and step-children Charles, Lillian, and Julia. There is also correspondence from various Webster, Barrows, and Tidd relatives.

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Libby's early diaries, 1880-1887, record his school days at the River Falls Normal School and daily family affairs, including the work of his father, Asa at the saw-mill. Lottie and Lillain (?) also recorded their school experience in diaries, 1881-1888. Libby's latter diaries, 1929-1945 recount family matters in addition to activities and affairs of the University of North Dakota and the history department in particular. Included also are the financial records dealing with Asa Libby's estate and correspondence and news clippings documenting the New Richmond, Wisconsin cyclone of 1899. New Richmond was the site of the Libby family home from 1855 to 1870. 3 photographs were separated and added to the Orin G. Libby Photograph Collection.

Notes for MARGARET EVA LIBBY: Margaret Libby Barr was born on September 8, 1904 in Harriman, Tennessee. She was the daughter of Dr. Orin G. Libby and Eva Cory Libby. Dr. Libby was chair of the History Department at the University of North Dakota from 1902 to 1945. Margaret graduated from UND with a Bachelor of Science degree in Commerce in 1926 and taught in the Bemidji, Minnesota, school system. She moved back to Grand Forks after marrying Paul E. Barr on June 8, 1932. Paul Barr was head of the Art Department at UND for 25 years, from 1928 to 1953. She assisted with the publication of his book, *North Dakota Artists*, in 1953. Paul Barr died on December 22, 1953. They had two children: Robert and Martha. After her husband's death, Margaret became an Associate Professor of Business and Vocational Education at UND from 1954 until 1975. She added a Master of Science degree in Education from UND in 1956. In 1974, she was awarded the Charles DeBruyn Kops award for excellence in teaching and loyal service to UND. She co-authored the 1977 book *University of North Dakota Pottery: the Cable Years*, with her son Robert Barr and UND art professor Donald H. Miller. In 1987, she was presented with the Elwyn B. Robinson award for preservation of North Dakota history. This award was given because of her establishment of the Cable Pottery Collection at the UND's Hughes Fine Arts Center. During that same year, she was bestowed with the President's Award for outstanding service to UND. She was also active in several Grand Forks organizations: Chapter D of the P.E.O. During his career, he painted in more than half of the states in America and in more than ten foreign countries. He maintained studios in New York City, Paris, Colorado, and Indiana and attended eight different colleges and universities including the Art Institute of Chicago, Sorbonne University of Paris, and the universities of Colorado, Chicago, and Indiana. Subjects of his paintings included architecture, landscapes, and other scenery of Holland, Switzerland, and Mexico along with rivers, woodlands, southwestern landscapes, and national parks in the United States and mountain ranges such as the Rockies, Grand Tetons, Catskills, Alps, and Tyrolean Alps. During the summer of 1938, Barr spent six weeks and traveled 2,000 miles in North Dakota's Badlands to produce fifty-six paintings of the area.

Something of a prodigy, Barr's interest in art developed at an early age. In 1904, at the age of eleven, he exhibited some of his work at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition at the World's Fair in St. Louis and in 1916, he became an annual exhibitor at the John Herron galleries in Indianapolis. He then produced, through continued artistic and educational endeavors, a steady output of paintings that were exhibited in the Marshall Fields department store and the Hoosier Salon and galleries in Chicago; the Indiana Artists Club and Pettis galleries in Indianapolis; the Fort Wayne Art Museum; the Society of the Four Arts in Palm Beach, Florida; the William Rockhill Nelson Gallery in Kansas City, Missouri; and the Rockefeller Center in New York City, among other places.

In 1928, Barr was appointed chair of the Art Department at the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks, a position he held until his death in 1953. In December 1938, thirty-one of Barr's fifty-six Badlands paintings were exhibited in Memorial Hall of the North Dakota State Capitol Building in Bismarck. Described by then-Governor William Langer (1933-1934 and 1937-1938) as a "visual record of one of the state's greatest scenic assets," the

paintings had such titles as "Breaks of the Little Missouri," "East Rim: Painted Canyon," "Teddy Roosevelt's Horsepasture Road," and "Ranchhouse in the Badlands." When parts of the exhibit toured east, viewers were said to have expressed surprise at the organized pattern of light, shade, texture and vivid colors (such as blue skies, purple rocks, scoria-colored buttes, and green plateaus) that Barr used and disbelief that such scenery existed. The scenes were all too real, however, to those who were familiar with them.

Barr died in late 1953 at the age of sixty-one, having suffered a cerebral hemorrhage as a result of a stroke. He was survived by his wife Margaret Libby and their son Robert and daughter Martha. His work lives on, though, in private collections all over the country, including that of the International Business Machines (IBM) Corporation and the North Dakota Governor's Office. His book *North Dakota Artists*, a collection of biographical sketches on notable visual artists from North Dakota, was published posthumously in 1954.

In addition to painting, Barr was also a lecturer, teacher, illustrator, and poet. He served as State Chairman for American Art Week, has been added to the Honor Roll of the American Artist Professional League, and co-authored with Eugene Myers the art textbook *Creative Lettering*. - Ben Nemenoff

Cory-Merrill Neighborhood By Editor, Mar 8, 2010

"The Cory Merrill neighborhood was founded in 1858. By the 1920's it was annexed by the City of Denver. Influenced by the growing number of saloons throughout Denver, residents tried to avoid the same fate for Cory Merrill and designated the area as a dry town. Located on Steele and Arizona the John Paul II Center for the New Evangelization, home to the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Denver, almost marks the center of the neighborhood.

As recalled by residents who lived in the area in the 1940's, what is now I-25 was once known as "The Swamp". Cory Merrill kids used the area as a playground where they would ride bikes and collect bugs and frogs. The Steele Street Bridge was constructed in 1953 in preparation for Valley Highway. This provided a southern route for residents as access would soon no longer be available. In 1954 construction and clean-up of "The Swamp" was finally underway. Construction began at Colorado Boulevard making way for Valley Highway, now known as I-25.

The Coronado School was the first school in Cory Merrill. By the late 1940s the old single room school house started showing signs of aging. An area of land once platted as the Armstrong Farm was donated by the family in the late 1940's to Denver Public Schools. The district used the land to build Cory Elementary and Merrill Junior High to replace the old aging school. The schools were named after John J. Cory and Louise A. Merrill, notable educators. John Cory, first principal of South High School, enjoyed a 20 year tenure with the school. Two writers, whose works are known the country over, were born and brought up in Greene and still return there regularly to visit the "home town" folks. They are Mrs. Belle Case Harrington, author of short stories, cantatas and verses and the other is James A. Braden, author of boys' books.

THE BOYS' FAVORITE

Mr. Braden, Greene's other author, is also a favorite with the children for his chief works are boys' adventure stories. He is a brother of George C. Braden of this city and makes his home in Akron where he is identified with the Commercial Printing and Lithographing Co. of that city. Previous to his author days, he was for twenty years with Akron and Canton newspapers. He has been immensely successful with his real boy stories among which are two very popular series. One of these includes "Connecticut Boys of the Western Reserve," "Captives Three," and "Far Past the Frontier," and the other includes "The Auto Boys' Quest," "The Auto Boys' Outing," and others.

A few years ago "Jim" Braden, as he is known to all Greene township, wrote and read at the annual Greene homecoming, a decidedly clever poem which he called "The Greene Directory." In it he mentioned the name of every family in the township with some of their outstanding characteristics. The poem is still talked about by Greene citizens and many of them have preserved copies. It was in the course of this little poem that Mr. Braden, in mentioning his own family, wrote the lines:

"There was a red spring wagon of Bradens
Then more of the same tribe passed on"

Mr. Braden is still writing and who knows but what his greatest and best things are still to come?"

While marked success came to him in this capacity during the ensuing ten years, 1885 - 94, he severed this connection and with Prof. G.H. Rowe, professor of violin at Baylor University, established the Lone Star School of Oratory & Music in Dallas, Tex. The partnership was dissolved some two years later and Prof. Franklin discontinued the teaching of music and confined his instruction to oratory and belles lettres. Failing health forced him to abandon this school in 1906. He went first to Alpine, Tex., but experiencing no benefit from a sojourn in that climate, he proceeded to Dillon, Colo., where he became president of a college. Early in 1908 he experienced a relapse, and returned to his family in Dallas, where he was confined to his bed until his death in Feb. 1909. Many orators in public and private life in Texas today received their early training under him. He made a lifelong study of English literature and elocution and knew many of the great tragedians, including Booth McCullough, Lawrence Barrette, Joseph Jefferson, and others. He was the author of Franklin's Outline of Rhetoric, and also numerous treatises bearing upon elocution. He was an active member of the Baptist Church" (Who's Who in Texas 1931, p. 264).

In 1901, "The Arlington College Exponent" was first published from "The Journal" printery. It was edited by Professor W.W. Franklin, president of Arlington College. In a review of his work, it was stated, "no abler instructor graced the halls of any college of our state. His editorials and notes are bright, sparkling, sharp and to the point" (source: Tarrant Journal, p. 114). William and Mattie are buried in Oakwood Cemetery, Waco, TX.
