1. HEINRICH "HENRY"³ DIEVENDORF (*LUDWIG² DUBENDORFER, JACOB¹*) was born October 03, 1695 in Basserdorf, Zurich, Switzerland, and died Bet. 1772 - 1783 in NY?. He married BARBARA MEYER Abt. 1721. She was born Abt. 1700.

Notes for HEINRICH "HENRY" DIEVENDORF: Henry, who immigrated about 1725 with a brother and a cousin, is the earliest ancestor of this family in America (source: Reynolds, 1911). He settled in Montgomery Co, NY at the present site of Currytown, near Canajoharie. Family tradition has it that he was a brother of Johannes, but I am not aware of any solid proof of this relationship. Bell (1932) also points to tradition as the source of information about their relationship as brothers. He stated that all the Devendorf descendants traced in his book go back to the brothers Henry and Johannes Devendorf (p. 47). Bell stated that there was virtually no record of Henry Devendorf, "other than tradition" (p. 47), but family tradition and the statements of local historians strengthen the tradition that he existed. In this working file, I use the spelling Dievendorf for all of the line, even when the spelling was changed over time. When census records are used, the spelling is shown as it appears in the record, and in quotes from published sources, the spelling is not changed.

- Notes for GEORGE COUNTRYMAN: George was a Lieutenant in Canajoharie Regiment of Tryon County militia in 1786. His farm was located on Dutchtown Road (Ft. Plain) in the town of Minden. The cellar was still visible in 1929. Will was written 28 Apr 1808 and probated Mar 1809.

Notes for CAPTAIN HENRY DIEVENDORF: Henry fought in the Fifth Company of Colonel Herkimer's Canajoharie Regiment, Tryon County Militia. "While in command of his Company at Oriskany he was mortally wounded by a bullet through his lungs, and died almost as he fell on the battlefield. His name appears on the Oriskany Battlefield Monument with two other Dievendorfs - Johann and John, both of whom were privates." Henry's will was written on March 24, 1772 and probated on August 20, 1783 (Albany Co, NY Wills and Deeds 498-D89).

3. Captain JACOB D.⁴ DIEVENDORF (*HEINRICH "HENRY"³, LUDWIG² DUBENDORFER, JACOB¹*) was born July 24, 1740 in Currytown, NY², and died November 23, 1816 in Currytown, Montgomery Co, NY³. He married ELISABETH BELLINGER March 16, 1762 in NY prob. Montgomery Co., daughter of PHILIP BELLINGER and ELISABETHA BAUMAN. She was born April 22, 1742 in Root, Montgomery, NY⁴, and died December 29, 1804 in Montgomery Co, NY⁵.

Notes for JACOB D. DIEVENDORF: "We reached Currytown, a small village nearly four miles south of Canajoharie, at about noon. The principal object of my visit there was to see the venerable Jacob Dievendorff, who with his family was among the sufferers when that settlement was destroyed by Indians and Tories in July, 1781. Accompanied by his son-in-law (Dr. Snow, of Currytown) we found the old patriot busily engaged in his barn threshing grain; and although nearly eighty years of age he seemed almost as vigorous and active as most men are at sixty. His sight and hearing are somewhat defective, but his intellect, as exhibited by his clear remembrance of the circumstances of his early life, had lost but little of its strength. He is one of the largest landholders in Montgomery county, owning one thousand fertile acres lying in a single tract, where the scenes of his sufferings in early life occurred. In an orchard a short distance from his dwelling the house was still standing which was stockaded and used as a fort. It is fast decaying, but the venerable owner allows time alone to work its destruction, and will not suffer a board to be taken from it. The venerable man here spoken of died Oct. 8, 1854, at the age of 84, the most wealthy resident of the town. His remains lie in the family burial place with those of his parents, on the homestead farm, which he bequeathed to his grandson, Jacob Dievendorff (*The History of Montgomery County and Fulton Counties, N.Y.*, by F.W. Beers & Co., 1878).

"9 July 1781- The Currytown settlement [now Root, Montgomery Co.] was attacked by Tory and Indian raiders led by Loyalist Lieutenant John Doxstader/Dockstader. They killed or captured the settlers working in the fields and burned the settlement. [Horton's Historic Articles Timeline for 1781 found online at <http://hortonsarticles.org/timeline1781.htm>]. Jacob Dieffendorf Sr. and his two sons, Frederick and Jacob, Jr., were at work in one of their fields when they were attacked. Jacob Sr. and Frederick made an attempt to reach Fort Lewis but Frederick was overtaken and tomahawked, scalped and left for dead (Jacob Sr. escaped). Jacob Jr. was captured along with Andrew Bellinger, and Mary Hiller. Philip Bellinger Jr., Jacob Moyer and his father, who had been cutting trees, were killed. [James, F. Morrison. Lieutenant and later Captain in the Revolutionary War. Jacob was a farmer who owned considerable property in the town of Root, where he and his father were early settlers. He is called the first white settler of Root, actually settling in Currytown prior to the Revolutionary War. Jacob's will was dated 28 Feb 1816 and probated 1 Feb 1817 (sources: Bell, 1932; Montgomery Co, NY, Calendar of Wills). His residence was listed as Charleston. The will is excellent documentation of his living family. I found it interesting that Jacob willed "my seat No. five on the Gallery in the white church in Curry Town" to Jacob Stowits, son of his daughter Margaret and George Stowits. He left his pew No. 4 on the lower floor to his 3 grandsons and he left seat No. 5 on the lower floor to his six granddaughters. Jacob's wife was not mentioned in the will, providing evidence of her earlier death. His daughter Barnabah received Jacob's German Bible.

The cemetery where Jacob and Elizabeth are buried is Dievendorf Burial Lot, Root, Montgomery Co, NY, "located in a pasture about 400 feet southeast of the Hubschmitt home, which is on the Sloansville Road. The cemetery is surrounded by a metal fence, still in good condition, and contains three monuments, visible from the road. The cemetery is grown up with trees and brush, mostly poison ivy, making the location of the stones difficult. Many of

the stones are lying on the ground, partially buried. The owner of the land mentioned some unmarked fieldstones which I failed to locate. I cannot be positive that I located every tombstone" (Elswick, Albert, Copied 1 Aug 1967).

Notes for PETER I. MILLER: Peter I., son of John and Margaret (Garlock) Miller, born in the town of Minden, Montgomery County, New York, May 5, 1789, died October 12, 1841. He was educated at the district schools. He was a tavern keeper at Mohawk, New York, for several years, after which he turned his attention to farming, following that occupation for the remainder of his active life. He was Whig in politics. He married Christina Devendorf, born November 27, 1798, died in Minden, January 28, 1867, daughter of Solomon and Christina Devendorf; granddaughter of Jacob Devendorf, one of the original patentees of the town of Minden. The Devendorfs came from Switzerland prior to the Revolution and one of the name served under General Herkimer and was killed at the battle of Oriskany in 1777 (source: <http://montgomery.nygenweb.net/minden/miller.html>).

BARBARA "BARNABAH"⁵ DIEVENDORF (*JACOB D.*⁴, *HEINRICH "HENRY"*³, *LUDWIG² DUBENDORFER, JACOB¹*) was born 1763 in Montgomery Co, NY¹⁶, and died March 17, 1838 in Newville, Montgomery Co, NY, 74y 8m 13d, interred Bellinger Road Cemetery, Danube, Herkimer Co, NY. She married CHRISTIAN BELLINGER November 16, 1784 in Caughnawaga, NY¹⁷, son of PHILIP BELLINGER and ELIZABETH FINCK. He was born January 15, 1764 in Randall, Montgomery Co, NY, and died May 02, 1838 in Newville, Montgomery Co, NY, interred Bellinger Road Cemetery, Danube, Herkimer Co, NY¹⁸.

Notes for CHRISTIAN BELLINGER: I have also seen his name as Johann Christian. He was baptized on January 31, 1764 at the German Flats Reformed Church, Stone Arabia, NY. In 1780, he enlisted in Tryon Co. Militia, 5th Regiment, Revolutionary War (source: Family Sketches of Danube Twp, Herkimer County, NY, www.rootsweb.com/nyherkim/danube/danubefam.html). He was captured by Indians and taken to [Niagara] Canada at the destruction of Currytown in Oct. 1781. He was released 21 May 1783. Christian purchased a farm from Jelles Fonda and settled in the eastern part of Danube, NY in 1792 (source: Walter, William Irving, A sketch of Some of the Prominent Families of the Town of Danube, Address delivered before the Herkimer County Historical Society, 11 April 1903). Due to service during the Revolutionary War, he drew a small pension until his death. He was at one time the owner of 4 slaves (source: Danube Twp Family Sketches). Christian and Barbara are buried in Montgomery Co, NY cemetery on Bellinger Rd. in St. Johnsville Twp.

"Christian Bellinger was born in 1764 and came to Danube in 1792. He was a son of Frederick Bellinger and with his younger brother, Andrew, was captured by the Indians and taken to Canada at the destruction of Currytown in 1781. On his return he married Barbara, daughter of Jacob Diefendorf, a leading resident of that locality. He died in 1838. His son, Philip C. Bellinger, lived on the farm until his death in February, 1872, and it is now in the possession of his only surviving son, Washington. Philip C. Bellinger was a prominent figure in town for many years and he left an enviable reputation as a man of strict business integrity. His wife was a member of the Zimmerman family and their descendants in Danube and Minden are quite numerous. Jacob, a brother of Philip, died in the town of Little Falls in 1859 where his descendants still reside. Of the daughters of Christian Bellinger, one married Conrad Snell of Danube, one Abraham Snell of Minden, and one Conrad Mowers of Stark" (source: Smith, 1914, p.58).

Deponent had been informed by his parents & believes true that he was born in the now town of Herkimer in said County of Herkimer the 15th day of January in the year 1764. As also appeared by a record of deponents age made by the clergyman of the Reformed Cutch Church at the Castle [Indian Castle] in the now Town of Danube in said County of Herkimer a copy of which is in court under the hand & seal of D. A. Pick the present minister of said church.

At the time deponent was called into the service he resided in the (now) town of Root the county of Montgomery with his parents.

Deponent went into the service as a Substitute for one Fritcher—whose Christian name deponent cannot recollect deponent volunteered to take the place of said Fritcher. The company in which deponent served was commanded by Garret Putnam Capt. & [?] Putman [?] Isaac Paris was Lieutenant whose Christian Name deponent cannot recollect—General Peter Gansvoort may have commanded at Fort Stanwix as deponent believes at the time deponent served at said Fort—He made us work well though I can't recollect his name.—

That deponent never received a discharge in writing from the service.

That deponent is well known to Andrew Bellinger who resides in the town of Danube in the County of Herkimer about ten miles from deponent & who had known deponent since a boy he is also known to Peter P. Bellinger who resides in his present neighborhood & who can also with Peter Graves who can testify as to his character for truth & veracity & of his service as a soldier of the Revolution. (Signed with his mark) Christian Bellinger

Bellinger, Christian, S9277, NY Line, applied for a pension 10 Oct 1832 in Herkimer County, NY aged 68, a resident of Danube, NY., born 15 Jan 1764, Herkimer, NY., soldier's son Jacob was 61 in 1848 and states that soldier died 1838 leaving children; Jacob and Phillip Bellinger, "Betsey" Mowers, Catharine Sharpe, Margaret Snell, Barbara Feeter, Maria Snell and Fanny Baxter, in 1838 George Feeter lived in Herkimer County, NY at Little Falls.

She married CONRAD MOWERS 1785 in Currytown, Montgomery Co, NY, son of CONRAD MOWERS and ANNA SCHMIDT. He was born August 1758 in Claverack, Columbia Co, NY¹⁹, and died Bet. 1846 - 1850 in NY.

Notes for CATHERINA DIEVENDORF: She was baptized 18 May 1766 in the Reformed Dutch Church of Stone Arabia. In her father's will, dated 1816, she is mentioned as the widow of Conrad Mowers, and her son Jacob is also mentioned along with her daughters Elizabeth and Nancy. Catherine received \$1200 in her father's will.

Notes for CONRAD MOWERS: His father-in-law, Jacob Diefendorf, left a will written in 1816 (source: Bell, O.W., 1932). His daughter Catherine, was listed as the widow of Conrad Mowers, but this is thought to mean they were divorced. Three children were listed as heirs of Jacob Diefendorf: Jacob, Nancy, and Elizabeth Mowers.

This Conrad is probably the man who received a Pension dated 1832 from Montgomery Co, NY for service during the Revolutionary War (copy in my files). He was a private under Capt. Yates of the Regiment commanded by Col. Fisher in NY for 12 months. In the full pension application, several other units were mentioned but the handwriting is difficult to read. Conrad was 74 years of age when he appeared in court in 1832. His service began in fall 1776 and went into 1778. He was involved in the Battle of Oriskany. He testified that when he entered the service he lived in the town of Currytown (now Root). George Mowers gave testimony about his service. His pension of \$40 began on 4 March 1834.

According to Robert Matteson (Town Historian for Smyrna, NY in 2006) that Conrad was married three times. His 3rd wife, Barbara, is buried in the North Side Cemetery, Plymouth, NY. The Conrad who lived in Smyrna, NY was listed on the 1840 census as a Pensioner, age 79, making him born about 1761.

She was born December 26, 1780 in NY, and died November 06, 1844 in NY age 63, interred Dievendorf Burial Lot, Root, Montgomery Co, NY off Sloansville Rd.

Notes for JACOB DIEVENDORF, JR.: Jacob Diefendorf, the pioneer settler, was born in Corry's Town, (Currytown), town of Root, county of Montgomery, September 23d, 1769. He was of German descent. His grand parents having emigrated from Germany early in the eighteenth century. His father, Jacob Dievendorf, with his family, was living in Corry's Town at the time of the invasion of this place, July 9th, 1781, by a party of Tories and Indians under the command of Captain John Dockstader. Jacob with others was captured by this party, and taken south into the town of Sharon, where on the following day, Dockstader's force having been overtaken by Colonel Willett and his men, they prepared for battle by killing and scalping their prisoners. Jacob was seated on a horse; looking back and seeing them kill and scalp his fellow prisoners, he placed his hand on the forehead of the horse, and leaped, striking on his feet on the ground. He ran a short distance, but was overtaken and knocked down by a blow from a tomahawk upon his right shoulder. Jumping upon him with his knees, the Indian who had struck him cut off his scalp and he was left for dead. When he returned to consciousness, bleeding, weak and trembling, he arose and tried to walk; but finding

his strength insufficient, he again lay down and partially covered himself with leaves, expecting to die. Colonel Veeder and his men passing that way on the day after the battle, found Jacob lying across a tree, insensible, and took him to Fort Plain. There his wounds were dressed, and he was placed under the care of Doctor Faught of Stone Arabia, where he remained about five years, but the scalp never permanently healed over. He lived to a ripe old age, and toiled excessively in clearing up and preparing the virgin soil for the growth of the life sustaining cereals. Jacob Dievendorf was married to Margaret Bellinger May 13th, 1801, by whom he had six children, three of whom are now living, the only ones who separated from the parental home and had families -William H, the only surviving son, Mrs. Hannah Dockstader and Mrs. Margaret Snow. Jacob Dievendorf, with his denuded scalp, was a living monument of the atrocious cruelty practiced by the Indians upon the early white settlers, with and by the aid of the British and Tories, as those of this country were called who espoused the cause of Great Britain during the Revolutionary war. He lived and amassed a large fortune, including many hundred acres of land; died October 8th. 1859, being 85 years old, and was buried in the family burying-ground. Thus passed away from earth an honest, upright and just man (source: http://myroots.pgwhosting.com/spoon/jacob_devendorf.htm).

Jacob "grew up on the farm in that then wild and thinly settled neighborhood where life at the best was a struggle, rendered doubly hazardous by the conflict then going on between the colonies and Great Britain and the presence in the neighborhood of hostile Indians and unfriendly, vindictive Tories" (Reynolds, 1911). Several of the citizens were killed or captured and taken to Canada during the Indian and Tory raid on Currytown, NY on 9 July 1781, known as "Invasion Day." Jacob was taken south to Sharon, and the Indians began killing prisoners. He was scalped by Indians and left for dead. He was found the next day by Col. Vedder and taken to Stone Arabia, where he remained for five years. Later in life, he became very wealthy in land, but he always suffered pain and discomfort from his scalp wound. Excerpt from *The History of Montgomery County: The Town of Root*: The author tells a story about the Indian attack called "oxtader's murderous raid up the settlement in 1781" when Jacob Dievendorf was scalped. "Mr. Lossing thus speaks in his Pictorial Field Book of the Revolution, published in 1851: We reached Currytown, a small village nearly four miles south of Canajoharie, at about noon. The principal object of my visit there was to see the venerable Jacob Dievendorff, who with his family was among the sufferers when that settlement was destroyed by Indians and tories in July 1781. Accompanied by his son-in-law (Dr. Snow, of Currytown) we found the old patriot busily engaged in his barn threshing grain; and although nearly eighty years of age he seemed almost as vigorous and active as most men are at sixty. His sight and hearing are somewhat defective, but his intellect, as exhibited by his clear remembrance of the circumstances of his early life, had lost but little of its strength. He is one of the largest landowners in Montgomery county, owning one thousand fertile acres lying in a single tract, where the scenes of his sufferings in early life occurred. In an orchard a short distance from his dwelling the house was still standing which was stockaded and used as a fort. It is fast decaying, but the venerable owner allows time alone to work its destruction, and will not suffer a board to be taken from it. The venerable man here spoken of died Oct. 8, 1854, at the age of 84, the most wealthy resident of the town. His remains lie in the family burial place with those of his parents, on the homestead farm, which he bequeathed to his grandson, Jacob Dievendorff" (p. 163). Jacob's estate was probated on 21 Nov 1854.

The son of a wealthy agriculturist and large land owner he naturally enough took to an agricultural occupation; and in addition to his raising the cereals, became a manufacturer of cheese - one of the first to engage in cheese-making in this country. He has continued to follow the occupation of a dairyman-farmer in connection with his other business, to the present day, and having kept pace with the onward movements of the science of cheese-making, he now stands at the head of one of the largest associations for the manufacturing of cheese in this county. Mr. Diefendorf, by his personal position and standing in society, in connection with his large wealth, has often been called to occupy positions of trust and honor among his fellow townsmen, During the war of the great Rebellion, when such a multitude of bonds and securities were afloat, there was a seeming security in those to which his name could be found attached; and the positions of trust and the amount of stock which he held in two bank in the county, namely, the Spraker Bank at Canajoharie, and the Mohawk River Bank at Fonda, lend their aid in giving the people a confidence in those institutions. Mr. Diefendorf is the owner of a very large landed estate, second in extent to none in the county, which he so manages as to make it a source of aid and assistance, and not of depression, to those depending upon him. Taught by his long life of practical financial business, he foresaw the evils that would arise from our inflated currency, and the fictitious values placed on everything; and now, when many are sinking from their imaginary height of wealth, even to want. He passes along comparatively unharmed by the financial crisis (source: http://myroots.pgsvhosting.com/spoon/jacob_devendorf.htm).

"He was an extensive farmer and one of the first to make dairying a specialty in Currytown. He was a Democrat and served the town as supervisor (*Northern New York*, p. 490). As the son of a wealthy farmer, he continued in that endeavor, and was one of the largest cheese manufacturers in the country. He became regarded as one of the most substantial men in the Mohawk Valley. William married his 1st cousin.

Conrad Mowers survived his wife for some years, dying March ___ (this date is smudged). Mrs. Mowers was a daughter of Christian Bellinger, who was taken a prisoner to Canada during the revolution, and who came to eastern Danube from Arrytown. Montgomery County, in the closing years of the 19th century. His wife was a member of widely-extended Devendorf pioneer Palatine family. Christian Mowers at one time possessed over --- acres of land on the boundary line between Danube and Stark. In partnership with one of his neighbors. Mr. Smith, he at one time owned and operated a saw mill near his residence. He also followed the business of threshing for some years. In politics he was a strong Republican. In the Fremont Campaign, he and several of his neighbors

rigged up a wagon, attaching to it six bay horses with white manes and tails, with a drum corps, recruited the immediate neighborhood, and in that manner attended the election, returning home by way of Cramers Corners, Ostranders and Newville. In 187- . Mr. Mowers purchased the Houpt sawmill and farm land adjoining Newville, removed there tearing down and rebuilding the mill and the damn, replacing the later structure of logs and plank with one stone. This proved insufficient to withstand the freshets in the spring and fall. The farm is now the property Henry H. Tibbitte. Mr. Mower died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Hiram W. Oliver at Newville. In October ---- a brother, Jacob Mowers died very suddenly in September ---- and a sister, Elisabeth Mowers 1- years later. Two other sisters Mrs. Jacob Mowers and Mrs. Barbara March passed away some years ago. Mrs. Christain Mowers maiden name was Christiana Shaut. Her mother was a granddaughter of Mr. and Mrs. John G. DAVID K. DIEFENDORF DIES IN CURRYTOWN

Well Known Resident of Root Township Had Long Illness.

Canajoharie, Sept. 7.- David K. Diefendorf, one of the best known residents of the town of Root and a member of one of the oldest and most prominent families of Montgomery county, died Sunday evening at 10 o'clock at his home in Currytown. He had been ill the past year and a half and despite the best of medical attention and care, did not improve and gradually weakened until the end came. "He had submitted to an operation about a year ago at the Albany hospital by Dr. Arthur Etting and for a time there was hope of his recovery from his ailment of chronic intestinal nephritis. He returned to his ancestral home and cheerfully awaited the summons of his Master. Mr. Diefendorf was born at Currytown, Jan. 3, 1871, a son of Jacob and Lydia Shelp Diefendorf and all of his life had been spent in this section, where he was very well known and greatly liked by all. He was a great-grandson of Jacob Diefendorf, who was scalped by the Indians during the Revolutionary War and left for dead, but recovered and lived to a good, old age. The family is one of the most prominent in the history of this section and were most successful tillers of the soil. David managed his father's farm and took an active interest in the business and social life of the country. He was chairman of the Currytown Liberty Loan committee during the recent war and aided materially this and any worthy cause. He was an active member of the Currytown Reformed Church, a life member of the Montgomery County Agricultural Society, a director of the National Mohawk River Bank of Fonda, a member of Hamilton Lodge, No. 79, F. & A. M., the Odd Fellows, the Fort Rensselaer Club and other organizations. He was a most friendly, agreeable and courteous gentleman, whose loss is keenly felt by a large circle of relatives and friends. He is survived by his widow, three sisters, Mrs. Charles Bedford of Los Gatos, Cal., Mrs. Warren R. Hadsell of Mountain View, N. H. and Mrs. Howard Stowitts of Amsterdam. The funeral will be held Wednesday at 1 o'clock, Rev. Harry A. R---son, pastor of the Guttenberg, N. J., Reformed Church, a

DEWITT A. DEVENDORF, Death of the Promoter of Schoharie Power, WAS AN AGGRESSIVE BUSINESSMAN

The People of Fort Hunter Saddened because of His Demise-Successful as a Broom manufacturer-Sketch of His Interesting Career-The Funeral Arrangement

Fort Hunter, Dec.,23.-This community was saddened last evening when the announcement was made of the death of Dewit A. Devendorf. It was known that he was critically ill, but the end was not anticipated so soon. As has been heretofore stated in *The Democrat*, Mr. Devendorf was taken ill four weeks ago today with a severe attack of nervous prostration, followed by typhoid fever. The medical attendance was secured, but it was impossible to stay the ravages of the disease, and at 5:45 o'clock last evening, the patient, surrounded by loved ones, passed away. Mr. Devendorf was 36 years of age and was the second son of Dr. and Mrs. Henry A. Devendorf [Rachel] of the town of Florida, where he was born on the family homestead. In his earlier days he commenced the manufacture of brooms on his father's farm, and later engaged more extensively in the business at Fort Hunter, where he built a factory and continued the business in a successful way up to the time of his death. He was the inventor of broom machinery, which is of great value to broom manufacturers.

For the past three years or more Mr. Devendorf had been deeply interested in the project of harnessing the Schoharie creek with a view of supplying electrical power for manufacturing and illuminating purposes throughout the state. Recently a company was organized under the title of the Empire State Power company and Mr. Devendorf was made secretary and general manager. As is known, the work on the extensive plant is now going on at Schoharie Falls. Mr. Devendorf had on the scene almost constantly looking after the important details. He, with his father, was the promoter of this vast scheme and directed all his energies and activities in its behalf. The severe mental strain he had been under, together with the exposure, resulted in his fatal illness. He, together with his, passed many days along the banks of the Schoharie, extending into the Catskill mountains, buying land in order to successfully carry out his plans which he had cherished for years.

He was twice married, his first wife being Agnes, daughter of the late Boyd R. Hudson, of Fort Hunter. By this union he had two sons, Hudson and Boyd Dewitt Devendorf, who survive. Six years ago he was married to Miss Alice, daughter of Mr. Charles F. Wait of Amsterdam, who survives, together with a daughter, Dorothy [Devendorf]

He is also survived by his parents, two brothers, Jay and Milton Devendorf, and three sisters, Mrs. Edward Edwards [Emma C.] of Glen, Mrs. Willard Selmser [Nettie] of Johnstown and Mrs. Mary, wife of Dr. Meding of New York City.

He was a member of the First Reformed church of Amsterdam, and possessed many valuable traits of character; was very philanthropic in nature, and many in this vicinity have been the recipients of his unostentatious acts of kindness. He will be greatly missed, both in a business and social way. Had his life been spared, he would have been of still more usefulness to the community.

He was an extensive collector of Indian relics, and, as an antiquarian, ranked second in the state at the time of the death of Adelbert G. Richmond of Canajoharie.

Mr. Devendorf's death occurred in the historic Queen Anne's chapel parsonage, erected in 1712, and which has been modernized and beautified by its late owner. In politics, Mr. Devendorf was a Republican, and he was ever ready to advance the interests of his party. He never held a public office.

A year ago last July Mr. Devendorf made a trip to Alaska for the benefit of his health, and, while making a sea voyage at night the steamer went down and he, with others, narrowly escaped being drowned. He lost his baggage, and for many hours was on a raft until picked up by rescuers.

The funeral will be held from the house on Tuesday noon. The services will be conducted by the Rev. J.R. Kyle of Amsterdam. Interment will be made in Green Hill cemetery in Amsterdam. The bearers will be Jay and Milton Devendorf, Edward Edwards, Willard Selmser, Dr. C.M. Meding and David Hubbs.

A shade of gloom was cast over the village of Fort Hunter and vicinity this morning when the announcement was made of the death of Mrs. Agnes Boyd Hudson, wife of Dewitt A. Devendorf, the broom manufacturer, which occurred at 3 o'clock. Mrs. Devendorf's death was due to puerperal fever and she had been ill but a few weeks. She was highly connected in the way of relationship, being the elder daughter of Boyd R. Hudson, who represents one of the oldest and most influential families in this part of the Mohawk Valley. About three years ago she was married to Dewitt A. Devendorf, son of Henry A. Devendorf of the town of Florida, who also represents one of the oldest and best known families in this locality. Mrs. Devendorf received her education in this city and was a graduate of Prof. Haberer's school of music. With her mental accomplishments she combined much social and moral worth, and beloved by a large circle of relatives and friends. She is survived by her husband and two infant sons and also by her parents, one sister, Miss Emma A. Hudson, and one brother, Van Buren Hudson. Jacob Mowers was a blacksmith and worked at the business for many years, principally in Newville, but for a period, at the residence of his father-in-law, Conrad Mowers, In Stark. Mr. Mowers died and the descendent quite some years later Mrs. Price, widow of --- Price and mother by her first husband of Mrs. Amanda Lasher of St. Johnsville. Mrs. Mowers died in the early months of 1866 (smudged, date may not be correct). Some years later he relinquished work and divided time between his son at Newville and his daughter in Ontario County. On coming from Ontario County in mid winter, he was either struck by the cars or had an epileptic seizure at Little Falls and before he could be identified died. His friends in Western New York not

hearing of his arrival became alarmed and communicated with Harvey J. Mowers at Newville and the identity of the unfortunate man was discovered. After the outbreak of the Civil War, Harvey J. Mowers enlisted in the Second Artillery N.Y.S.V. and served until the close of the war. Returning to Newville he married and removed to East Bloomfield, Ontario County, returning however to Newville where he passed the remainder of his life. He is survived by his widow Frances, daughter of Daniel and Margaret Miller, (Lighthart) who was found to be seriously ill herself this morning, a son William who resides at home and a daughter Gertrude, wife of J.W.
