1. JOHAN GEORG¹ DOMER was born December 05, 1710 in Ergersheim and Dottenheim, Germany, and died 1746 in At sea enroute from Germany to America. He married (1) ANNA MARGARETHA¹ Abt. 1730. She was born Bet. 1700 - 1710 in Germany, and died April 06, 1733 in Ergersheim Franconia-Anspach. He married (2) CATHERINE WEISS December 19, 1734 in Germany, daughter of JOHANN WEISS and DORTHEA HANNEMANN. She was born December 19, 1712 in Dottenheim, Mittelfranken, Bavaria, Germany, and died Aft. 1747 in Frederick Co, MD?.

Notes for JOHAN GEORG DOMER: Johan Georg was a master shoemaker. His first wife, Anna Margaretha, died in an epidemic (grassierende gefahrliche Seuche) in Germany. Since Johan Georg died enroute to America, it's likely that his 2nd wife, Catherine, remarried soon after she arrived in America in 1746 with several small children. I need to find a record of her second marriage, perhaps in Frederick Co, MD. A marriage record has not been found, but her two youngest children, Anna Maria and Michael, are mentioned in Philip Angleberger's will (Shillinger, 2005), written 26 July 1750, Frederick Co, MD.

5. MICHAEL² DOMER (*JOHAN GEORG*¹)^{5,6} was born July 09, 1744 in Watenburg, Germany, and died Aft. 1831 in Sugar Creek Twp, Tuscarawas Co, Ohio. He met ANN MARY "ANNA" Abt. 1771 in Hagerstown, Washington Co, MD. She was born Abt. 1755 in Hagerstown, MD or Germany?, and died Aft. 1830 in Ohio.

Notes for MICHAEL DOMER: Michael Domer arrived in Maryland in 1765 (Wyand & Wyand, *Colonial Maryland Naturalizations*, 1975). He was naturalized in Frederick Co, MD Sept. 1765. In 1776, Michael Sr, his wife Anna, Michael Jr, and Frederick were in Elizabeth Hundred, Frederick Co, MD near Hagerstown.

1796 Elk Lick Tax Assessment (From Laurel Messenger Feb. 1984 page 105): Elk Lick township was formed in 1785, the fifth township carved out of Brothersvalley Twp., Bedford County. It was one of the six townships which formed Somerset County when it was erected in 1795.

It is evident from the written records that all the brothers lived close to each other. George and Michael had farms abutting each other, and they appear on the 1808-09 tax list for Goshen Twp, Tuscarawas Co, OH, along with Frederick, Jacob, and Mary (source: *First Centennial Atlas of Tuscarawas Co, Ohio*, p. 49. Edwin S. Rhodes, Tuscarawas Centennial Association, New Philadelphia, OH, First Tax Duplicate, p. 49). Michael lived in Sugar Creek Twp, Tuscarawas Co, Ohio by 1809. Michael was on the tax list in Tuscarawas Co, Ohio in 1816. There is a land purchase of 80 acres by Michael on February 01, 1831 in the Land office in Zanesville. In addition to farming, Michael was said to be a Dunkard Preacher (source needed).

By the 1790 census, they were listed in Washington Co, MD. In the 1800 census for Somerset Co, Michael Domer and his wife, each aged 45 or over, were living with two sons 10-16 (Frederick and George), one son 16-26 (Jacob), one daughter under 10, one daughter 10-16, and two daughters 16-26. Nearby lived oldest son Michael, Jr and his wife, each age 26-45, and two daughters under 10 years.

1820 census, Sugar Creek township, Tuscarawas County, Ohio: Michael and his sons Michael, Jacob and George. In about 1825, when the county line between Tuscarawas and Holmes Co. changed, George's farm remained in Auburn Twp, Tuscarawas Co. and Michael's farm became part of Walnut Creek Twp, Holmes Co. One mile north is Sugar Creek Twp, where Frederick and Jacob lived on adjoining farms.

1830 census, Dover, Tuscarawas Co, OH: Michael Domer, Sr. (80-90) with 3 females (1 = 34-40; 1 = 45-50; and 1 = 78-80)

Notes for ANN MARY "ANNA": Hagerstown was founded in 1762 by Jonathan Hager, a German settler. Some have asserted that Mary Ann was a Hager, but that has been disproved (see Descendants of Jonathan Hager). She was called Anna Mary in Hagerstown church records (source needed).

She was born March 22, 1769 in Middletown, Frederick Co, MD, and died October 22, 1848 in Antis Twp, Blair Co, PA, interred Antis Cemetery.

7. MICHAEL S.³ DOMER (*MICHAEL*², *JOHAN GEORG*¹) was born Abt. 1772 in Elizabeth Hundred, Frederick Co, MD?, and died Bef. 1850 in OH, interred German Reformed Church Cemetery, Shanesville, OH. He married ELIZABETH Abt. 1799. She was born June 29, 1781 in Maryland, and died April 18, 1867 in OH, age 85y 9m 20d, interred Old German Reformed Church Cemetery, Shanesville, OH.

Notes for MICHAEL S. DOMER: Michael received a bounty for \$3 for killing three wolves on March 08, 1809.

1820 census, Sugar Creek, Tuscarawas, OH: Michael Domer (age 45+) with his presumed wife (age 26-44) and 2 women (age 45+).

1830 census, German, Holmes, Ohio: Michael Domer [indexed as Damer] (age 50-59) with his presumed wife (age 50-59) and 2 boys (age 10-14). One of the boys is the right age to be son Michael. Was there another son?

1840 census - not yet found

1850 census, Sugar Creek, Tuscarawas Co, OH: Elizabeth Domer (60) and Charlotte Domer (50). This record shows born in PA. They lived near John Domer (b. 1804) and family.

1860 census, German Twp, Holmes Co, OH: Elizabeth Domer (78) and Charlotte Domer (68) lived with the Michael Domer (b. 1812) family.

Notes for RALEIGH DOMER: "Mr. Raleigh Domer, whose illness from paralysis was announced last week, died on Sunday at his home in Keedysville, aged 79 years. He was a boatman for many years, but at the close of the war he went to Keedysville, where he conducted a hotel. Some twenty-five years ago, when no license to sell liquor could be obtained in Shepherdstown, he created a sensation here by operating what was called "the floating battery", a sort of houseboat fitted up as a bar-room, which he anchored in the Potomac river, close to the wharf. It was a knotty question to decide whether he was in Maryland or West Virginia, and while the question was agitated in the courts the thirsty had ample time opportunity to slake their thirst. The floating battery was finally towed away, and the experiment has never been repeated. Mr. Domer had been blind for many years. His wife died about seven years ago and he leaves no children. He owns a brick house in Shepherdstown and a farm a couple of miles east of town" (Shepherdstown Register March 1, 1900).

Raleigh Domer bought from John & Eliza Benner

1 April, 1864 (recorded 8 April, Liber IN 17, folio 542) for \$2,000
[101] [West] half of Lot 49, 51½ x 186 feet. The Benners warrant specially the property, "Except" the \$400 mortgage in favour of Joseph Poffenberger. Raleigh agrees to pay it, but the \$400 will be deducted from the \$2,000.

[Michael Domer was a Tavern Keeper in 1794 (Liber H, folio 830-2)]

Elie Wade bought from Raleigh & Susan Domer

1 April, 1864 (recorded 8 April, Liber IN 17, folio 541-2 [recorded out of order with the one above] for \$2330

[101] [West] half of Lot 49, 51½ x 186 feet. The Domers warrant specially a \$400 mortgage in favor of Joseph Poffenberger, Executor of Jacob Cauffman, dec'd. Elie agrees to pay it, but the \$400 will be deducted from the \$2,330.

[Why did Raleigh buy the property and sell it the same day to Elie?]

1850 census, Washington Co, MD: Rolla (26) and Susan (28) Domer lived next door to his mother on one side and brother Jacob on the other side. Rolla was a laborer with property valued at \$1500.

9. JOHN FREDERICK³ DOMER (*MICHAEL*², *JOHAN GEORG*¹)^{J2} was born April 20, 1776 in Hagerstown, Washington, Maryland^{13,14}, and died Bet. 1842 - 1845 in Shanesville, Tuscarawas, Ohio¹⁵. He married ELIZABETH BOLLINGER Abt. 1803 in Pennsylvania. She was born Abt. 1784 in PA, and died Bet. 1851 - 1860 in prob Elkhart Co, IN.

Notes for JOHN FREDERICK DOMER: Frederick was baptized on May 26, 1776 in Evangelical Lutheran Church at Hagerstown, MD (source: Wright, F. Edw., *Washington County, Maryland Church Records of 18th Century, 1768-1800*, Willow Bend Books, 2001). The surname was also spelled Dohmer. Judge Frederick Domer is thought to have been one of the first settlers in Tuscarawas County, OH in about 1807. Frederick moved to Tuscarawas Co, Ohio and cleared land, then went to Somerset Co, Pennsylvania, probably to get married. Tuscarawas Co was formed in 1808 from Muskingum, and the county was recorded by County Commissioners on 7 Mar 1811. His father and brothers came with him to Ohio after 1807 (source: History of Tuscarawas County, 1884, p. 655). He lived just south of Shanesville (SE qtr of Section 3) where he was a prominent and respected citizen until his death. He was a Dunkard (German Baptist), and church services were held in his home. Frederick and brothers George, Jacob, and Michael are on the 1809 Tuscarawas Co. first duplicate tax list. In April, 1811 the first electors of the Sugar Creek Twp met at Frederick Domer's house to elect the township officers. Frederick's will is listed for 1842 in Tuscarawas Co, where the county seat was New Philadelphia. Estate settlement recorded Tuscarawas Co, OH on 15 Oct 1845, pp. 67-69.

1830 census, Sugar Creek, Tuscarawas, Ohio: Fredk Domer (age 50-59) with a boy (age 5-9), 2 boys (age 10-14), 1 man (age 20-29), 2 girls (age 5-9), 1 girl (age 15-19), and presumed wife (age 40-49). Total = 9 persons.

1840 census, Sugar Creek, Tuscarawas, Ohio: Frederick Domer (age 60-69) with 2 men (age 20-29), 1 girl (age 10-14), 1 girl (15-19), and presumed wife (age 50-59). Total = 6 persons.

Notes for ELIZABETH BOLLINGER: When my mother obtained a copy of Annie Domer Keim's death certificate, the clerk wrote in the margin that Annie's mother's surname was Bollinger (original certificate in the files of ML Cook). Elizabeth could be the daughter of Henry Bollinger of Nazareth (PA?), who was in Gnadenhutter, Tuscarawas Co, OH in 1799. He attended a church service in the home of Mr. Heckwelders, called "The First Home" on July 13, 1799 (source: *Combination Atlas Map of Tuscarawas County, Ohio*, 1973). More research on the Bollinger line needs to be done. Perhaps Henry Bollinger's will lists his children.

1850 census, Union, Elkhart Co, IN: Elizabeth Domer (66) lived with her daughter Elizabeth and Fred Sliffe. In 1860 Elizabeth was no longer living with her daughter and is presumed dead (Proof needed). Elizabeth is probably buried in Elkhart Co, IN near Goshen. Did she leave a will?

Notes for JACOB DOMER: Jacob and his wife had 10 children. He was a Dunkard minister and elder. His farm was located one mile southwest of Shanesville, OH.

11. GEORGE³ DOMER (*MICHAEL², JOHAN GEORG¹*) was born Abt. 1783 in Frederick Co, MD or PA, and died Bet. 1851 - 1860 in Shanesville, Tuscarawas Co, OH. He married CATHERINE BYERS/BOYER Abt. 1808. She was born Abt. 1788 in Middletown, Frederick Co, MD, and died October 22, 1849 in Ohio.

Notes for GEORGE DOMER: This might be the George Domer listed on the 1790 Frederick Co, Maryland census. The listing shows 3 males over 16 and 2 females in the household. In 1808 he relocated from Parkersburg to Blair Co, PA. He was one of the pioneer settlers of Holmes Co, Ohio.

"George Domer came with his father from Pennsylvania to what is now Sugar Creek Township before 1809." He settled on NW Quarter, Section 13, NW corner of Auburn. George was a Dunkard (source: *History of Tuscarawas County, Ohio*, 1884).

1840 census, Sugar Creek, Tuscarawas Co, OH:

1850 census, Auburn, Tuscarawas Co, OH: George Domer (67) lived with his son George (45) and family in Sugar Creek Twp. Ohio.

Notes for CATHERINE BYERS/BOYER: Her name is spelled Bauer, Boyer, or Byers.

There is no known record of why they left the Amish church, but perhaps it was because he married outside of the Amish faith. According to the *History of Elkhart Co.* (1881), "Mr. Keim is an honored and respected member of the German Baptist Church. He is a Republican and cast his first vote for Zach. Taylor" (p. 1013). After his father's death, the probate record shows Tobias purchased one "True Christianity" for \$2.30 and a book for \$.50.

W. S. HOSTLER, an active and successful coal and coke dealer of Altoona, and the senior member of the firm of W. S. Hostler & Co., is a son of John and Barbara (Domer) Hostler, and was born in Sinking valley, Tyrone township, Blair county, Pennsylvania, February 11, 1852. The Hostler family is of German descent, and John Hostler, the paternal grandfather of the subject of this sketch, was an early settler of Centre county, from which he removed to Sinking valley, where he died. He was a blacksmith by trade, and purchased a good farm in Sinking valley, which is now in the possession of his son. Another of his sons, John Hostler (father), was born in Centre county in August, 1814, and in early life came to Blair county, of which he has been a resident ever since. His business in life has been chiefly that of farming and stock-raising, and he now owns a valuable farm at Bellwood. Although well advanced toward his four score years, he is still active, and personally supervises all of his farming operations. He is a consistent member of the Evangelical Lutheran church, and in politics supports the Republican party. He has held several of his township's offices, and made a good record as public official who was conscientious and firm in the discharge of his duties. Mr. Hostler married Barbara Domer, who was born in 1825, and they reared a family of children. One of the most successful business men in Wabash county is John W. Domer, vice-president of the Lawrence National Bank at North Manchester, while his son is a successful physician in the city of Wabash. John W. Domer was born near Wawaka, Indiana, October 19, 1851, a son of George and Caroline (Steinbarger) Domer, natives respectively of Ohio and New York. Mr. Domer during his boyhood attended the common schools, and when about twenty years of age started out in life for himself, his first experience and training being as clerk in a store. From Indiana he went west to Missouri, located on farm lands, and remained there until driven out by severe droughts and attacks of grasshoppers, and that disastrous experience caused him to return to his native state. In the fall of 1874 Mr. Domer moved to North Manchester, and has thus been identified with Wabash county for forty years. His early work at North Manchester was teaming in the village and conducting a farm nearby. From 1882 to 1890 the marble establishment in that village was conducted under his management, but in 1890 his attention was directed to the real estate and insurance business. When the city decided to install local water works in 1893, Mr. Domer and Dr. Sluder secured the contract to tap all the mains, and for a time did practically all the plumbing. It was in 1895 that he became interested in the Lawrence National Bank, acquiring with Mr. J.M. Curtner of Wabash the Lawrence & Mills interests, and soon afterwards Mr. Curtner became president and Mr. Domer vice-president and general manager of the institution. Since then, 1896, the deposits of the bank have been increased from forty-eight thousand dollars to nearly four hundred thousand dollars, which fact alone attests the capability of the new management. Besides his duties as a banker Mr. Domer has accumulated some city property at North Manchester and in Chicago, and is one of the organizers and a director of the New Union Trust Company at North Manchester. A Republican in politics, he has taken an interest in public affairs and has served as a member of the city council and on the school board. Aside from his business he has found time to cultivate the social side of life and is identified with the Masonic fraternity and the Knights of Pythias. In 1871 John W. Domer married Miss Dora Harter, daughter of Eli Harter, a pioneer of Wabash county. To their marriage were born two children: Walter A. and Emma, both living.

The medical profession of the city of Wabash has one of its ablest representatives in Dr. Walter A. Domer, who has practiced in that city for the past twelve years. Dr. Domer is a man of broad experience, and being well equipped professionally has acquired success and high standing in a community in which most of his life has been spent. Though Wabash county has been his home nearly all his life, Dr. Domer was born in Joplin, Missouri, November 10, 1872. His father, John W. Domer, is now living in North Manchester. The maiden name of his mother was Dora Harter, whose people were among the earliest pioneers of Wabash county. When Walter A. Domer was about one year of age his parents returned to Wabash county, and he grew up to manhood at North Manchester. His early experiences in that locality were chiefly attending public school and clerking in a store. His early pursuits were all along the lines of commercial life, and as part of his preparation for that work he completed a course at the Eastman's Business College in Poughkeepsie, New York. In 1897, having decided to leave mercantile affairs and make the practice of medicine his vocation, he matriculated in the College of Physicians and Surgeons at Chicago. From that old and substantial institution he was graduated M. D. in 1901. For eighteen months, beginning in his senior year he was deputy county physician of Chicago, having charge of one of the districts into which the city was then divided, his duties being to look after pauper and emergency cases. Also during his senior year in college he was honored with appointment as prosecutor for Dr. William T. Eckley, professor of anatomy in The College of Physicians and Surgeons and at the same time he assisted Dr. F. R. Sherwood who had charge of the Chair of Surgery at the Chicago Clinical School. In June, 1901, Dr. Domer returned to his home county, and began practice in the City of Wabash,

where he has since become securely established in the vocation which he has chosen for his life's work. Dr. Domer is a member and at this writing is president of the Wabash County Medical Society, belongs to the Indiana State Medical Association and the American Medical Association. While at Chicago in college he was president of the Beta chapter of the Phi Rho Sigma medical fraternity for the school year, 1900-01, and at the meeting of the Grand Chapter of that organization in Chicago, July 5, 1899, he was elected grand president, serving as such for two years and being the first grand president of the Grand Chapter. The doctor has other fraternal affiliations with the Masonic Order and the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, his politics is republican, and in religion he worships with the Presbyterian. knew him, was honest in business affairs, sociable, affable and pleasant in his everyday life, and his demise is mourned by the entire community." He died of heart failure but also suffered from cancer in the intestines.

After attending the Moody Bible Institute in Chicago, he went to Congregational college at Ridgeville, IN. He was ordained into the ministry at Andrews, IN in 1903 and served many churches in Indiana, Iowa, Illinois, and Wisconsin. Rev. Barnett was a member of the Blue Lodge of Masons and of the Royal Arch Masons of Ashland, Wisconsin. He also belonged to the Auburn Ministerial association and the Sons of Veterans of the G.A.R. Prior to his death, Rev. Barnett was stricken with paralysis for 10 days. He was buried in Baintertown Cemetery, Elkhart Co, IN.

"ANNIE"⁴ DOMER, JOHN FREDERICK³, MICHAEL², JOHAN GEORG¹) was born January 07, 1857 in Across the street from the Warner farm near Goshen, Elkhart Co, IN²³¹, and died June 18, 1927 in Gravois Mills, Morgan Co, MO, interred Cherry Mound Cemetery, Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS. He married ANNA AMELIA "ANNIE" TIPTON December 24, 1885 in near Westphalia, KA by Rev. J.K. Spencer²³², daughter of JAMES TIPTON and MARY HILL. She was born May 22, 1859 in Hyndman, Bedford Co, PA, and died March 20, 1937 in Goshen, Elkhart Co, IN at the Warner home, age 77, interred Cherry Mound Cemetery, Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS²³³.

Notes for JOHN CRIPE KEIM: John's family moved from Holmes Co, OH to Elkhart Co, Indiana in 1846, and John was born on a farm near Goshen. That farm is across the road from the current Warner farm, owned by his descendants. He and his twin brother were the 7th and 8th children in a large family. John's parents spoke German in the home, and he learned English only after he attended school. He had a twin brother named Sam, but as adults they were not close, since Sam lived in Dannebrog, Nebraska. John attended Valparaiso College, a teachers college, for a year. Afterwards, he taught for several years in Millersburg, IN (near Goshen). The 1880 census shows that he was age 23, still living with his parents, and teaching school. If we assume he taught in Millersburg from about 1876 - 1880, we are left with a period of time from 1881 - 1885 when nothing is known about his life, but it's likely he was teaching and farming. A note in the handwriting of Mary H. West shows that he moved to Kansas in 1884, but it is not known why he left Indiana. I wonder if he moved with a relative or friend? His uncle, Jacob S. Keim (brother of Tobias Keim) was in Westphalia in 1900 as were several other Keim families.

After marriage in 1885, at age 28, he taught and farmed in Kansas. John C. Keim moved to western Kansas (Logan Co) with his wife Anna Amelia Tipton in about 1888. They lived in a sod house in Western Kansas for a time, and the two youngest children were born there. John was a member of the United Brethren Church. The family moved back to eastern Kansas, Westphalia, in 1896 after Anna's father died, and they lived on the Tipton homestead until the early 1900's. Did Mrs. McConnaghy Tipton live with them after James B. Tipton died?

From a newspaper article following his death: Near the end of his life, John and Anna moved to Gravois Mills, MO and bought a small farm. He also took on duties as an overseer of land adjoining his. John had been selling timber for crossties to William B. Moore, but there had been disputes between the two. Moore, with a gun in his pocket, came to the site of the lumber and found the gate locked with a note posting no entrance. Moore went through the gate, in spite of Keim's warnings. The 70 year old Keim threw some rocks at Moore, who shot him once just above the left eye, killing him instantly. Moore was released on bail but a handwritten note on the copy of the newspaper clipping stated that Moore was found "not guilty" (Versailles, MO, "Statesman", 23 June 1927).

John's granddaughter, Mary, remembers her mother traveling by train, with sister Elsa and brother Harry "Bud," to John Keim's funeral in 1927. He is buried at Cherry Mound Cemetery, north of Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS. John is 5779 in the book DJH and 13884 in DBH & CS.

1900 census, Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS: John C. Keim (43), farmer, Anna A. Keim (40), and their daughters Madge (12), Opal (8), and Hazel (6). They also had a border named Theodore Woodsworth living in the house. The family moved to Chanute in Neosho Co, KS after 1900. For a time John lived in Iola, Kansas and sold insurance. 1910 census, [Iola?] Allen Co, Kansas: J.C. Keim (53) real estate, Anna Keim (51), Opal Keim (18), doing housework in office, Hazel Keim (16), hotel waitress. There were three borders listed with the family including Opal's future husband, Harry Haymaker (19). They lived one block off the main street in a house that is still standing. 1920 US census, Iola, Allen Co, KS: J.C. Keim (62) and Anna Keim (59) and one male "roomer" (T625_522, p. 1404). In 1912, at age 55, John was proprietor of the Manhattan Hotel in Iola (source: Allen Co. sections of the Polk's Kansas State Gazetteer and Business Directory, Vol XII, 1912). According to his obituary, John was a member of the I.O.O.F. (Odd Fellows) in Iola and of the Modern Woodsmen (a fraternal organization) for many years.

Notes for ANNA AMELIA "ANNIE" TIPTON: Newspaper obituary: Anna, daughter of James B. and Ellen Tipton, was born in Bedford County, Pennsylvania, May 22, 1860. She died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. DeMain Warner, in Goshen Indiana, March 20, 1937. The deceased came to Kansas with her parents when but a small child, and who settled in the Cherry Mound community. When a young girl she united with the U.B. Church at Cherry Mound and steadfastly clung to that faith, and was an active member until her death. She was united in marriage to John C. Keim December 24, 1885, and of this union was born one son, James Ross, who died in infancy; and three daughters who survive her. They are: Mrs. Madge Dollimore, of Pueblo, Colorado; Mrs. Opal Haymaker, of South Bend, Indiana; Mrs. Hazel Warner, of Goshen, Indiana; ten grandchildren; one brother, Charles W. Tipton; one sister, Mrs. Edith

Stephenson; two sisters-in-law, Mrs. Eva Tipton, Homewood, Mrs. Minnie Tipton, besides numerous nieces and nephews and a host of friends.

Funeral services were held at the home of her daughter in Goshen Monday afternoon, March 22, conducted by the Rev. S.M. Whetstone, pastor of the First Brethren Church of that city, after which the body was brought to Westphalia and taken to the home of Mrs. Minnie Tipton with whom she had made her home for several years before going to live with her daughters. The funeral was held at Cherry Mound, her girlhood home, March 24, the services being in charge of Rev. N.L. Vezie, of Iola, her former pastor and friend, and whose remarks on the life and character of the departed were both consoling and impressive. The music was furnished by Mrs. Pettijohn at the piano. Eva Hill and Ruth McGinnis sang "There is a Home Eternal," "Haven of Rest," and "Gathering Home." Pall bearers were Bruce Hill, Mark Hill, Jesse Alban, Arthur Agnew, Lee Tipton and Dell Griffin.

Those who attended the funeral from a distance included Mr. and Mrs. Demain Warner and family, Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Dollimore, Mrs. Harry Haymaker, Glenn Tipton and son, of Detroit; Levi D. Keim and daughter Miss Bernice, of Kansas City; Mrs. Orville Reinfeldt and Rev. and Mrs. N.L. Vezie, of Iola; Mrs. K.B. Stevenson and Virginia Lou, of Garnett, and Mrs. Eva Tipton and daughter, Miss Helen, of Homewood.

The writer has known the deceased well and favorably since 1884. He has always known her as a most excellent, admirable woman, always frugal and just, and one who never spoke an ill of anyone. As a wife and mother there were no better, and with it was always the truest neighbor and friend. Everyone who knew her was her friend, and that is saying a great deal for or of anyone. Yes, she will be greatly missed by her family and large circle of friends, and they all have our deepest sympathy."

Anna Tipton's daughter Opal wrote the following: "Things I remember my mother telling about her early life. She was born May 22, 1859. She attended country school at Cherry Mound [Kansas] N. of Westphalia. Also a United Brethren church (she attended & a long time member) that was close by the school with a cemetery, north, across the road where she, my father, grandparents Mr. & Mrs. James Tipton, uncles, aunts & our only brother who was 6 mos. old when he died of whooping cough. My mother was about 4-5 years old when her parents older brothers & sisters came by covered wagon from Penns. when they crossed the river at St. Louis by barge. She & her older brother Will were in back of wagon where they could see out when they were pointing their fingers at the first black man they had ever seen. When he spied them he said something to them. They were scared & got back in wagon where he couldn't see them. When she was a young woman her father sent her to Rich Hill, MO [in 1880] to attend a school for dressmakers. After she finished the course there she came back to Westphalia and she had a shop where she did dressmaking and the friend [Amelia] had a millinery store. She & my father were married on Christmas Eve at my grandparents home. Before marriage she had taken care of a half sister Mary Halferty who died of consumption [1880], which in our time has been called tuberculosis. When my sister Madge was 6 weeks old, April 1887, she took her on a train to Western Kans. where my father had gone some time before and took up land (claim it was called), built a sod house. This was in Logan County" (Handwritten by Opal Keim Haymaker, March 1977).

Family legend is that during the Civil War, when Anna was only about 4 years old, the family moved to northern Illinois to get away from the fighting. Two years later, in 1865, they moved on to Anderson Co. Kansas to a farm about 3 miles north of Westphalia. Anna had 2 older brothers and an older sister, as well as 3 younger brothers and a younger sister. Anna's granddaughter Mary told this story: When Hazel was a baby, the family lived in a sod house in western Kansas. Anna entered the sod house only to find a snake crawling on the ceiling, right above baby Hazel's cradle. Opal told her granddaughter, Mary Lou, that Anna was an extraordinary dressmaker, and that Anna could look at a dress in the store, and then go home and replicate the dress without a pattern. The family of Mary L. Haymaker (Opal Keim's daughter) still has a pink and white quilt made by Anna.

It is interesting to consider the early life of Anna Tipton because she actually went to school and took up an occupation before marriage after age 26, which was fairly late for those times. I wonder if she thought she would not marry. Earlier, Anna had nursed her older half-sister, Mary Halverty, who died of consumption (tuberculosis), and Anna began to show symptoms of the disease. She had her share of other losses as her mother died in March 1885, the year she married, and her father died the next year. Anna had begun to show signs of consumption, so she took the train to western Kansas, Logan Co. near Russell Springs when her daughter Madge was 6 weeks old. The move to Kansas was thought to be advantageous for TB (called consumption at that time). She and her family lived at the Tipton homestead in Westphalia, KS for several years after her father died, and they were still there when the 1900 census was taken. By

1910, they had moved to Iola as her husband made a change from farming to hotel operation. Anna had a good singing voice, according to Gen Warner - friends would say "strike up a tune Annie."

After her husband died, she stayed for a while with Minnie Tipton, widow of Sam Tipton. She also spent time at all of her daughters' homes, but seemed to prefer the Warner Farm, just outside Goshen IN, probably because there was always work to be done there.

Notes for MARY MADGE KEIM: During WWII, Madge received Pueblo, Co good neighbor award for being a Red Cross nurse's aid. The Pueblo Star-Journal reported "She had worked in St. Mary's hospital for six years and now is one of the institution's most dependable and well-liked nurses." She continued working until her health would no longer permit it" (source: Hazel Keim Warner). During the time she worked at the Catholic hospital, she converted to Catholicism, according to her niece Mary.

1900 census, Coldwater Twp, Branch Co, MI: Lewis Dollimore (24), wife Pearl, and daughter Marion (1).

1910 census, 4-WD Colorado Springs, El Paso Co, CO: Lewis Dollimore (34), wife Madge (28), daughter Marion (11), and son Harold (2m). Lewis' occupation was grocery salesman.

1920 census (January), Pueblo, Pueblo Co, CO: Louis (52) and Mary M. (30) Dollimore with children Harold (9), Anna R. (6), and William L. (3y 11m). Louis was a Motorman for the street railway.

1930 census, Pueblo, Pueblo, Co: Louis (52) and Mary M. (39) Dollimore with children Ruth A. (16), William L. (14), and Jean F. (7). His occupation was street car operator and they owned a home valued at \$1340.65.

Notes for LEWIS ERIC DOLLIMORE: He immigrated to the US from England in 1894 (source: 1930 US census). In 1918 he registered for the draft. His occupation was motorman and he lived in Pueblo, Co.

Notes for OPAL MAUD KEIM: Opal was born near Russell Springs, Logan County, Kansas, and likely lived for a while in a sod house. After her grandfather Tipton's death in 1896, the family moved back to Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS and lived until the early 1900s at the Tipton homestead. As a young woman, Opal worked for a time as a telephone operator in Iola. Her father had gone to college, and she could have done so also, but she chose to work instead. She played the pump organ for a church in Kansas. During the depression, the family received help from her sister Hazel, who often brought food from the Warner farm. When her husband lost his job, Opal worked in the "Frances Shop" a fashionable women's dress shop in South Bend. She became an expert seamstress like her mother, and specialized in alterations. Her granddaughter, Mary Lou, remembers that Opal had several women customers who regularly came to her home at 304 East Donald Street, South Bend, Indiana, to have their hemlines lowered or raised depending on the current fashion. Opal would sit on the floor with her pin cushion on her wrist, pinning up the new hemlines. Opal made Mary Lou's wedding dress by taking a pattern and altering it to match a store-made gown. In addition to her sewing work, Opal was a devoted and expert gardener. During the summers in South Bend, she kept a beautiful garden of flowers along with vegetables like tomatoes, carrots, onions, and beans. She especially loved "moss rose" and rose bushes, and she always had fresh cut roses in her home. Every summer Opal canned tomatoes and peaches, and the family enjoyed fresh food all through the winter. For most of her adult life, Opal suffered from a digestive problem that forced her to recline after a meal. To prevent health problems, she took regular walks throughout her life, never smoked or drank alcohol, and maintained a healthy weight. She avoided caffeine, and drank Postum every morning because she wanted a hot drink. For most of her adult life, she was a member of St. Paul's United Methodist, where her funeral service was held. Opal regularly read "Prevention Magazine" and "Guideposts." The fact that she lived 93 healthy years is a testament to her lifestyle. Opal is #13886 in the book "Descendants of Barbara Hochstetler." In about 1983, Opal moved from her apartment in South Bend, IN to her daughter's home in Fort Worth, Texas.

Notes for HARRY HARLAN HAYMAKER: Harry Harlan Haymaker (grandfather of Mary Lou Cook) was born on a farm, and attended school at Leanna, Pittsburgh, and Iola Kansas. He finally quit school after the 8th grade because, although he liked to read, he didn't like something the teacher wanted him to do. His parents were divorced in 1907 when he was about 15 years old, and his mother and sister Winnie moved to California. Harry's post card collection

shows that he was in Los Angeles during the summer of 1907, when his sister sent him at least 8 post cards while she traveled to Yellowstone National Park by train. Harry lived with the Snodgrass family in Chanute for about a year and, according to his daughter, he remained close to the Reeds throughout his life. There is evidence in the post cards that Harry's mother took him back to Chanute from California, and stayed with him at the Snodgrass farm for several months.

His friend in Kansas who took pictures of Harry was Nathan Leffler, a photographer.

Sometime in mid-August, 1908, Harry moved to Iola, where he worked for a while as a machinist at a cement plant. For the first month, he received his mail via general delivery. Then the post cards show that he lived at 819 Jefferson Street for about 4 months. He moved to 211 South Chestnut Street in Iola in February, 1909 but was only there for a few months. By April 1910, he was in Iola, Kansas boarding with the John C. Keim family, and that is undoubtedly how Harry and Opal met (1910 census, Iola, Allen Co, Kansas). Harry's daughter said that Anna A. Tipton, Opal's mother, didn't want him to marry Opal because he smoked.

After he and Opal were married in Iola in 1912, they went to California on their honeymoon, probably to see his mother. They rode the ferry to Catalina from Oakland. Mother says he was sick with pneumonia and pleurisy around that time and was very ill. Anna Haymaker Hess loaned them her house in Chanute, KS. During WWI, he was drafted but discharged on August 09, 1915 as unfit for duty due to nervous problems ("neurosthenia"), even though he was a precision machinist. His daughter remembers that he had a toolbox with velvet-lined drawers that contained levels & squares. He and Opal moved to South bend, Indiana 17 April 1917 and lived in Coquillard Flats (apartments close to downtown). It is likely that they chose South Bend because her Uncle Adam Keim lived there. Harry worked for Singer, where he finished cabinets, and later he worked for Studebaker until he retired in 1956. According to his daughter, Mary, in every house where they lived, Harry cut a hole in the ceiling to the attic so firemen wouldn't have to cut into the house. On one occasion, Mary remembers that Harry's mother, Carrie Reed, came to visit after her 2nd husband died in 1929. When Carrie died in Kansas, Harry was very upset because he had no money to make the trip to Kansas. Relatives sent enough money for Harry to take a bus to Kansas, and he was able to attend the funeral. Harry and Opal celebrated their 50th Wedding Anniversary in 1962 with all four of their children in attendance. A reception was held for them at St. Paul's Memorial Methodist Church on Sunday, Sep. 23, 1962. Harry was a heavy smoker of Camel cigarettes, and he developed gangrene in his lower legs as a result of the smoking and diabetes. In about 1960, both of his legs were amputated below the knees, and he was wheelchair bound for the remainder of his life. His cause of death was subarachnoid hemorrhage, generalized atherosclerosis, and diabetes mellitus. Harry and Opal are buried October 08, 1969 in Highland Cemetery, South Bend, IN.

Notes for HAZEL FRANCES KEIM: Hazel's niece, Mary Haymaker, remembers that Hazel moved to Indiana because there was a failed love affair in Kansas. The family also tells the story that Hazel drove the family car for a time, but after an accident when the car rolled into a ditch, she never drove again. As an older woman, Hazel was a large woman who seemed to spend most of her time in the kitchen. She had very long gray hair that she rolled into a neat bun during the day. Hazel was an avid genealogist all of her life, and she compiled a History of the Hill Family based on letters, documents, and obituaries that she saved.

For most of his adult life, DeMain Warner was a Farmer and Fruit Grower. They lived on a farm just outside Goshen, IN and had milk cows, which were cared for by their son Phil Warner after DeMain retired. During the Depression in the 1930s, Hazel and DeMain sometimes took truckloads of food into South Bend, IN for her sister Opal's family. From what my mother has told me, Hazel and DeMain were very generous with their apples and other fruit and vegetables. Mary Lou visited the Warner farm in Goshen every summer while she was growing up, and she enjoyed watching the cows and picking strawberries.

1920 census (3 Jan), N. Walnut St., Portage Twp, South Bend, IN: Hazel Keim (26) lived with her sister Opal and brother-in-law Harry Haymaker. Harry was a Singer sewing machine inspector and Hazel was a book keeper

From there he moved to St. Paul, Nebraska, where he worked at the building of the Burlington railroad west out of St. Paul. Later, he took up a homestead in West Cleveland. From his wife, he obtained 200 acres of land, which is still in the family. She received the land from the Kalhoffer family in the later 1800's. Sam was a member of the I.O.O.F. Lodge for many years.

1920 census (Feb. 3): Samuel C. Keim (63), farmer and widower, and children Cora (24), Irwin S. (19), Leonard T. (17), and Teddy H. (14).

In addition to a B.S. in Business, he also earned diplomas from the Finance Forum of America and the Dale Carnegie course. He served in the Civilian Conservation Corps and was a Master Mason and held offices in his lodge. In 1961, he became a mathematics and accounting instructor at Spencerian College, Milwaukee, WI. Cause of death was a heart attack.

KEIM: From a copy of "History of St. Joseph County" (undated, p. 322): Adam began farming after attending school, and farmed until he was nearly 30 years old when he moved to Wakarusa for 3 years. From there he moved to South Bend, Indiana and began working for C.W. Hyde, coal and wood merchant. Mr. Hyde made him a partner and finally Adam bought the business, which was conducted under the name South Bend Coal and Wood Company. Mr. Keim is a very conscientious man and lives up to the spirit as well as the letter of any promise he may make... " (p. 323). He was President, South Bend Wood & Coal Company. In 1918 he lived at Euclid St. South Bend, IN. He was a member of the Methodist Church. He was buried October 18, 1935 in Solomon Creek Cemetery, Elkhart Co, IN near Syracuse.

Notes for IDELLA "DELL" SARAH UNRUE: Aunt Dell's niece remembers that she had a brother named Ed. During the Depression, the family of Harry and Opal Haymaker lived with Opal's Aunt Dell in her large house. Mary Haymaker remembers that Dell was not used to having children running around, so "it didn't work out."

JONAS M KEIM, son of Moses and Lydia Keim, was born in Holmes county, Ohio, on the 21st of April, 1843. It was his privilege to be reared on a farm, the source from which have sprung the majority of the nation's greatest men, and he early became acquainted with the manifold duties which such a mode of life implies. At the proper age he entered the public schools and attended the same until about eighteen years old, meanwhile assisting his father of summer seasons with the work of the farm. On the 15th day of August, 1862, he enlisted in Company B, One Hundred and Fifteenth Ohio Volunteer Infantry, with which he served three years, during which time he took part in many noted campaigns and bloody battles, including the various engagements in which General Thomas' command participated. The day on which the regiment was mustered out he was sent to a hospital where he remained about one month and at the expiration of that time he received his discharge and returned home. On leaving the army Mr. Keim resumed the pursuit of agriculture on the home farm and in the fall of 1865 was united in marriage to Miss Catherine Trump, daughter of George Trump, of Nimishillen township, Stark county. He continued tilling the soil in his native county until 1869, at which time he changed his residence to the county of Stark, locating at Louisville, where he engaged in the grain business, in connection with which he also handled provisions and dealt quite extensively in wool. Subsequently he disposed of this business and purchased an interest in the hardware house founded by his father and during the next twenty-five years was a member of the firm of Keim & Sons, which became one of the largest and most successful establishments of the kind in the county. His connection for so long a time with this line of trade resulted in the accumulation of a fortune which enabled him, in 1897, to lay aside business cares, since which time he has been living a life of honorable retirement in the thriving little town of Louisville. Mr. Keim possesses marked business ability and superior judgment. He looked after the management of the house with commendable fidelity, built up a large and lucrative trade and by fair and honorable dealing won the confidence of all with whom he had relations of any kind whatever. Aside from his connection with the commercial interests of Louisville, Mr. Keim has long been a factor of considerable consequence in the general affairs of the town, every enterprise calculated to advance the community materially, socially, or morally, receiving his support and hearty co-operation. As a citizen he is deservedly popular, charity and benevolence being among his chief characteristics, and to the poor and needy he is ever ready to extend a helping hand. His political support is given to the Republican party, but the wiles and chicanery of modern partisanship have always received his strongest disapproval. Religiously he is an influential member of the Progressive Branch of the German Baptist church, belonging with his wife to the Louisville congregation, of which he is one of the pillars and

chief supporters. He has high ideals of Christian character and endeavors to realize the same in his daily life and conduct. Mr. Keim's first marriage was blessed with the birth of one son, Charles B. Keim, who is now engaged in the boot and shoe business in Louisville. Mrs. Keim dying in 1873, the subject afterwards wedded Miss Mary Keim, of Nimishillen township, daughter of Adam Keim, a union terminated by the death of the wife in 1887. Mr. Keim's present companion, to whom he was united in the bonds of wedlock in the year 1896, was Mrs. Ella Werner, formerly Miss Slote.
