2. MARIA ELIZABETH "MARY ELIZA"³ LEIST (*UNKNOWN*², *DAVID*¹) was born 1775 in PA probably Northumberland Co, and died January 01, 1867 in prob. Whiteside Co, IL, interred Genesee Grove Central Cemetery, Whiteside Co, IL. She married (1) BENJAMIN YOTTER Abt. 1798 in Pennsylvania, son of MELCHIOR YODER and ANNA GODSHALK. He was born Abt. 1774 in Philadelphia Co, PA, and died Bef. November 15, 1801 in PA, probably Northumberland Co, age 28. She married (2) JOHN YEAGER Abt. 1808 in PA. He was born October 05, 1779 in PA prob. Northumberland County, and died February 13, 1856 in OH age 76, interred Old Hamden Cemetery, Vinton Co, OH.

Notes for MARIA ELIZABETH "MARY ELIZA" LEIST:

Mary E. List belongs somewhere in the Leist family, but I have not yet identified her parents. She may be the daughter of a sibling or cousin of Andrew Leist. Reasons for placing her in this Leist family are:

1. Mary E. was married to Benjamin Yotter, brother of Catherine Yetter/Yotter, who married Andrew Leist, Jr - proof of this marriage is needed.
2. Her husband, Benjamin, was shown on the 1800 census in Northumberland Co, PA and the David Leist family was also there.
3. Andrew Leist, Jr. was appointed guardian of her 3 minor children in 1815 in Pickaway County, Ohio.
4. Some time after her first husband's death in 1801, she moved from PA to Pickaway Co, OH along with the Leist and Yeager families.
5. Family genealogy passed down to me showed her name as Mary Eliza List.

The Leist family is thought to have arrived around 1804-05 in Pickaway Co, OH. After Mary Eliza was widowed, she lived in the same town as her husband's father and several brothers, but it's not known with whom she lived. In 1804, Matthias Schoch was named guardian of her three minor children in PA; he died in 1812. Mary Eliza married John Yeager in 1808, when her three children were still very young. Andrew Leist (Mary E.'s brother-in-law) was appointed by a bond dated 5 Oct 1815 as guardian for Melcher, Catherine and Elizabeth Yodder, children of Benjamin Yoder, brother of Melchior Yotter/Yoder (www.yodernewsletter.org/nonamish/m27.html). A biography of John Yager states they moved to Ohio in 1812.

According to land records located by M.L. Cook in Pickaway County, Ohio (5 July 2007), Melchior Yotter purchased 25 acres of land for \$350 from John Yeager and his wife Maria Elizabeth on 10 April 1820. He purchased another 25 acres of land for \$400 on 29 August 1821. These land records seem to indicate that John Yeager moved his family to Vinton Co. OH in about 1820. John Yeager and his wife were among the members of an early church in Clinton Twp, Vinton Co, OH. Other early members included Patrick and Elizabeth [Yotter]

Reed, and several of the Salts family. John donated land for the cemetery north of Hamden, known as Yeager Cemetery where Patrick Reed is buried.

1790 census, Northumberland Co, PA: John Yeager was listed with 5 males under 16. Could one of these be the John Yeager who later married Mary E. Leist in Pickaway County? If so, this is another link to the Andrew Leist family listed on the same page as John Yeager in 1790. The Leist and Yeager families may have traveled to Pickaway County together.

1800 census - John Yeager not yet found

1800 census, Penns Twp, Northumberland Co, PA: Benjamin Youter (age 26-44). His presumed wife (age 16-25) and a male under 10 (Melchoir) were listed with him.

1810 census - not found

1820 census, Bloomfield, Jackson Co, Ohio: John Yeager (age 26-45) with 1 boy under 10, 3 boys age 10-16 and 3 girls (under 10), and 1 female (age 26-44). There were a total of 9 persons in the household.

1830 census, Clinton, Jackson, Ohio: John Yeager (age 50-59) with 1 boy (age 10-14), 1 boy (age 15-19), 1 girl (age 5-9), 1 girl (age 10-14), 1 girl (age 15-19), and a woman (age 50-59). A total of 7 persons were listed in the household. Next door was John Yeager's son, George (age 20-30) and his presumed wife (age 15-20) with no children.

1840 census - not yet found

1850 census, Clinton Twp, Vinton Co, OH: John (70) and Mary E. (74) Yeager. His occupation was farmer.

1860 census - Mary E. Yeager not found so she is presumed to have died 1856-1860.

Notes for BENJAMIN YOTTER: Letters of Administration on his estate were granted to Mary Yoter and John Yoter on 15 Nov 1802. On 30 Nov 1804 the Orphans Court appointed Mathias Schoch guardian for the young children (Yoder Newsletter cites Probate and Orphans Court Records of Snyder Co, PA, 1772-1855, Charles A. Fisher, Clearfield Co, Baltimore, 1991, p. 54).

1790 census, Montgomery Co, PA (formerly Philadelphia Co): Melcher Yoder was listed with 3 males 16 and up. It is presumed one of these was Benjamin since he did not marry until about 1798. Tax records are needed for Benjamin to determine when he moved to Northumberland Co.

1800 census, Penns Twp, Northumberland Co, PA: He is listed as Benjamin Youter (age 26-44). His presumed wife (age 16-25) and a male under 10 (Melchoir) were listed with him.

Notes for JOHN YEAGER: John Yeager may be the son or grandson of Christian Yeager, the immigrant from Germany who lived in Georgetown (Dalmatia), Pa. A biography of his son, John Yager, states that the elder John moved from PA to Pickaway Co, OH in 1812 (Bent, 1877).

"Yeager, John of Clinton Township - dated 5-31-1853; recorded 3-8-1856. Wife, Mary Eliza. \$1.00 to Estate of George Yeager, dec'd. \$1.00 to Estate of Christian Yeager, Dec'd. \$1.00 to Heirs of Sophia Trip, only heirs of her body. Son, John Yeager, one-third of Property. To Rachel Catlin, one-third of property. To Mary Crow, one-third of property. Wife's wearing apparel after her death to go to her daughters Catherine, Elizabeth, Rachel and Mary who are the wives of John Critsswister, Patric Reed, Rial Catlin and Mathias Crow. Executors: Benjamin Diel. Signed: John (his mark) Yeager. Witnesses: Samuel Tarr and Thos. Scantlen." (Source: Vinton County, OH - Will Abstracts 1853-1857, Vol. 9, Gateway, 977.1, photocopied by Mary H. West).

3. MELCHIOR⁴ YOTTER (*MARIA ELIZABETH "MARY ELIZA"³ LEIST, UNKNOWN², DAVID¹*) was born December 03, 1798 in Penn Twp, Snyder Co, PA, and died March 28, 1859 in Claypool Twp, Kosciusko Co, IN age 60y 3m 25d¹. He married CATHERINE PONTIUS January 22, 1826 in Pickaway Co, OH. She was born November 02, 1807 in Ohio², and died June 02, 1892 in Prob. Kosciusko Co, IN, age 84y 7m 2d³.

Notes for MELCHIOR YOTTER: Melchior grew up in Northumberland Co, PA and Pickaway Co, OH, and from about age 9, he was raised by his step-father, John Yeager. Since his father died when he was a toddler, he and his sisters never really knew their father. After marriage, he and Catherine lived for a time in Adams Twp, Seneca Co, Ohio. While in Adams, Melchior and Catherine were members of the Coffman Methodist Episcopal Church, where several of their grandchildren were buried.

1830 census, Washington, Pickaway Co, OH: Melchor Yotter (20-30) with a boy under 5, a girl under 5 and presumed wife (20-30).

1840 census, Adams, Seneca Co, OH: Melchor Yoter (age 40-50), presumed wife (age 30-40), three boys (age under 5, 5-10, and 10-15), two girls (age 5-10, 10-15). Next door lived David Pontius and family. Note that David Pontius is buried near Yotter in Kosciusko Co, IN.

1850 census, Adams, Seneca Co, OH: Melcher (50) and Castoria (44) Yetter with children Jacob (20), Susan (17), Henry (10), and George (8). Melchior was a farmer with property valued at \$1400. On one side of him was the David Pontius (38) family. David was probably the brother of Melchior's wife, Catherine. On the other side of him was John (24) and Elizabeth (22) Yetter with daughter Electa (1).

Melchior's will was written November 13, 1858, prob. in Kosciusko Co. The Index to early Wills on the GenWeb site shows "Melcher Yotter" with the date 7 Apr 1859, which must be the probate date. His birth date was calculated from his age at death and death date is from his tombstone.

Melchior and Catherine are buried in Mount Pleasant Church Cemetery, Kosciusko Co, IN about 15 miles N of Claypool on State Route 15 in Row 8, Lot 6. Their gravestones were photographed by M.L. Cook on July 5, 2007; Melchior's stone is leaning, but the names and dates are legible. The last name on the stone is clearly spelled "Yotter."

Notes for CATHERINE PONTIUS: Catherine is a relative of George Pontius, Sr. who came to Pickaway Co, OH in 1808 with 5 children and his son-on-law Peter Row. Two of George's sons were George and Conrad Pontius. Why did they go to Indiana?

1860 census, Clay Pool PO, Clay Twp, Kosciusko Co, IN: Henry Yetter (20), George Yetter (19), and Jane Yetter (8) with Susan Pontius (72). Catherine (53) lived next door with Abram Rodes (24), a carpenter, and his wife and presumed siblings. Catherine had property valued at \$2200 and her personal estate was \$400.

1870 census, Warsaw PO, Clay Twp, Kosciusko Co, IN: Catherine Joter (62) lived with Eliza Jane Joter (15), domestic servant. Catherine's property was valued at \$1000 and \$100. Next door was her daughter Susanna Hoover and family. Nearby was her son George Yotter (28) and family.

1880 census, Corporation of Silver Lake, Kosciusko Co, IN: Catherine Yotter (73) was head of household, living next door to her son George Yotter (38) and family.

1870 census - not yet found

Henry is buried in Mt. Pleasant Cemetery, Claypool Twp, Kosciusko Co, IN beside his brother Jacob and Jacob's wife, Amanda. M.L. Cook visited the cemetery in July 2007 and found Henry's tombstone on the ground.

4. CATHERINE⁴ YOTTER (*MARIA ELIZABETH "MARY ELIZA"³ LEIST, UNKNOWN², DAVID¹*) was born January 01, 1801 in Pennsylvania, prob. Northumberland Co⁴, and died July 31, 1883 in Plattsmouth, Cass Co, Nebraska, buried in Eight Mile Grove Cemetery, Cass Co, NE. She married (1) ANDREW "MELL" DILL May 20, 1819 in Pickaway Co, OH⁵, son of BENJAMIN DILL and HANNAH. He was born 1796 in Pennsylvania, and died March 1832 in Vinton Co, OH, buried in Dill Lot, Yeager Cemetery, Hamden, Vinton Co, Ohio. She married (2) JOHN C. "TIP" CHRISWISSER September 28, 1842 in Vinton Co, OH⁶. He was born 1786 in Baden, Germany⁷, and died Aft. 1860 in Pike Co, OH.

Notes for CATHERINE YOTTER:

1820 census, Clinton Twp, Jackson Co, OH. Nearby were the families of Downey Reed and Acklin Reed.

1830 census, Clinton Twp, Jackson Co, OH: Catherine Dill with 2 males under 5, 2 males age 5-10, 1 male age 10-15, 2 females under 5, 1 female age 10-15.

1840 census, Liberty Twp, Jackson Co, OH: John C. Christwisor (age 50-60) with 2 boys age 10-15, 2 girls 5-10, and 2 girls 10-15.

1850 census, Franklin, Jackson Co, OH: John (64) and Catherine (52) Cutswhisor with children William (23), John C. (21), Rachel (7), and Bennet (5). John was a farmer with property worth \$1000.

1860 census, Beaver PO, Beaver, Pike Co, OH: John C. (74) and Katharina (60) Kreizwisser with children Rachael (17) and Bennet (14). John was a farmer with property worth \$1700 and \$350.

1870 census - not yet found

1880 census - not yet found but not living with her children Bennett or Rachel. I wonder if she went to Illinois to her sister's funeral in 1880.

The record on the Nebraska GenWeb site shows her dates as 1801-1883.

Notes for ANDREW "MELL" DILL: Will of Andrew Dill (1796-1830) taken from 1971 Dill book

In the name of God, amen I Andrew Dill, of Jackson County and State of Ohio, Being weak in body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory. Do make and publish this my last will and testament, in manner and form following, that is to say, first I give to Beloved wife Catherine Dill All my Real Estate and personally property as long as she remains my widow, Except fifty dollars to be paid in property. I give and bequeath unto Sally Casner, when she becomes of age, of this my last will and testament; hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty nine. Andrew Dill

Signed Sealed published and Declared by the above named Andrew Dill to be his last will and testament, in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our names as Witnesses in the presence of the testator. - Wm. Ayers; Acklin Reed; George Yager; Eli Catlin.

5. ELIZABETH⁴ YOTTER (*MARIA ELIZABETH "MARY ELIZA"³ LEIST, UNKNOWN², DAVID¹*) was born June 01, 1802 in PA probably Northumberland Co, and died August 07, 1880 in Flora, Clay Co, IL, buried in Elmwood Cemetery, Flora, IL. She married PATRICK REED Abt. 1821 in Ohio, son of DOWNEY REED and AILSE DEHART. He was born August 10, 1798 in Rockbridge Co, VA or Greenbrier Co, WV⁸, and died August 04, 1862 in Hamden, Vinton Co, Ohio age almost 64.

Notes for ELIZABETH YOTTER:

Elizabeth was born in PA after the death of her father. When she was 3-5 years of age, her mother moved to Pickaway County, OH. She was raised and educated by her mother and step-father, and could read both English and German. Her son, A.D. Reed, claimed that her parents came to America from Germany in steerage, and he called her a "little Dutch girl." In that time period, Germans were often called "Deutch." However, it seems almost certain that her grandparents were the ones who immigrated to America. A.D. Reed said she had worked in Philadelphia as a kitchen girl to pay her passage; I believe her mother may have worked in Philadelphia County, PA before marriage. In about 1871, she went to Flora, Illinois with her son Ene and his wife Martha. This was where her daughter Catherine was living.

Notes for PATRICK REED:

A.D. Reed wrote that his father was born in Greenbrier Co, WV, as the family was moving west. Others believe Patrick grew up in Virginia, and later came to southeastern Ohio where he bought 160 acres a half-mile north of the present village of Hamden, just south of Downey Reed's property. In about 1800 he was living in Rockbridge Co, VA. Patrick was listed on the 1806 tax list in Gallia Co, OH.

A.D. Reed wrote in a letter published in the Wellston Telegram in 1936 that his father went to Ohio in 1818, and that he lived for a time on a farm outside of Wilkesville, Vinton Co, OH. At that time the county was sparsely settled, and Chillicothe was a two-day trip to the west on the Scioto River where banking was done. His first home there was a 2 story hewn log house and a one-story kitchen with a large porch on two sides, and weatherboards on the sides. He built a mill on the bank of the Little Raccoon creek, near the present iron bridge. The mill operated for 40 years. The post office, known as Reed's Mill, continued until enough families lived in Hamden to move the post office there. Until the railroads came, the weekly mail was carried by the postboy from Jackson and Athens " (source: The Wellston Telegram, Wellston, Ohio).

1850 census, Clinton Twp, Vinton Co, OH: Patrick (51) and Elizabeth (46) Reed with children Henry (22), Rachel (17), Emma (16), Electa A. (14), Mary E. (12), John (8), Amos (4) and Enos (4).

1860 census, Clinton, Vinton Co, OH: Patrick Reed (62), Elizabeth (58), Emily (26), Mary E. (22), John P. (17), Enos E. (15), and Amos D. (15). They lived next door to daughter, Catherine (30), her husband Thomas Hayward, and their 3 children plus Lizzie Howard (1 month).

1870 census, Clinton, Vinton Co, OH: Elizabeth Reed (63) lived with her son Enos (24) and family.

1880 census, Flora, Clay Co, IL: Elizabeth Reed (78) lived with her son Amos D. Reed (34) and family.

In about 1852, Patrick erected a big, rectangular brick mansion between Hamden and Dundas, at Reed's Mill on Little Raccoon Creek. The house had 8 large rooms with a wide hall from front to back downstairs, with a fine wide stairway in the middle. It was demolished 100 years later, in 1957, to make way for a new route 93 which was being straightened out between McArthur and Hamden. A picture of the half demolished house appeared in the Wellston Telegram, along with an article written by John Sylvester, editor, about the people who lived in it. According to a letter from A.D. Reed to Mary F. Reed, Amos and Enos "hailed those brick from the kiln to the building site on a sled [called stone boats] pulled by the oxen belonging to the boys. The old log house in which they were born had

been torn down some time after the new brick mansion was built." Patrick is buried in Yeager Old Cemetery (now Tripp Cem), Hamden, Vinton Co, Ohio (source: Cole, Frank T. Copier, 29 Mar 1904, Ohio Cemetery Records, Extracted from the "Old Northwest" Genealogical Quarterly). Five of his daughters are buried in the same cemetery (Harriett, Maria Jane, Emma, Electra, and Lomelia). The cemetery is now on private property and is not maintained (per Bob Reed, e-mail 4 Sept 2003). In the family history of 1981, it was stated that his stone was broken and was on the ground. It was of white and black veined marble and was 2 inches thick, 28" tall and 24" wide, set originally in a white marble base.

MARQUIS DELVIN YOTTER. Among the public-spirited citizens of Kosciusko County who have found time from their business affairs to serve as public officials, one who is well known for conscientious and energetic service is Marquis D. Yotter, of Silver Lake, who has served in the capacity of school trustee of Lake Township since 1924, during which period numerous improvements have been made in the educational system. A coal merchant by occupation, Mr. Yotter's former public service included six and one-half years as postmaster of Silver Lake, and at all times he has held and merited the confidence of the community.

Mr. Yotter was born in Kosciusko County, Indiana, March 10, 1868, and is a son of George W. and Esther Jane (Elder) Yotter. His paternal grandparents were Malcolm and Cynthia (Jefferson) Yotter, of Ohio, the former of German descent, who came to Kosciusko County, Indiana, in 1859, and there rounded out their careers. George W. Yotter was born September 25, 1841, in Seneca County, Ohio, and was eighteen years of age when he accompanied the family, to Kosciusko County, where for many years he was engaged in the lumber business.

The country schools of Kosciusko County furnished Marquis D. Yotter with his educational training, and during his early years he was engaged in agricultural operations. In 1903 he engaged in the coal business at Silver Lake, where he still has a large trade in this commercial field, being one of the substantial men of his community. In 1914 he was appointed postmaster of Silver Lake, acting in that capacity for six and one-half years, and in 1924 was elected school trustee of Lake Township, being reelected to this position in 1928. This district has an accredited high school a consolidated high school, and during Mr. Yotter's administration of his duties numerous beneficial changes have been effected. During his term as trustee the Silver Lake High School was built. He is not enthusiastically in favor of the teachers' tenure law, nor does he favor the consolidated grade school idea, but does believe in the consolidated high school plan, where the 6-6 system is employed. In this district there are five teachers employed under the supervision of a superintendent. Mr. Yotter is a Democrat in his political allegiance and belongs to the United Brethren Church. Fraternally he is affiliated with the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, in which he has passed through the chairs.

On January 18, 1890, Mr. Yotter was united in marriage with Miss Luzetta Rager, who was born in Kosciusko County, and to this union there were born the following children. Bernard Bly, born in 1891, attended the graded and high schools of Lake Township and the Indiana Pharmacal School and is now employed as a prescription clerk in a drug store at Fort Wayne. Keith Clifford, born in 1893, attended high school for two years at Silver Lake, and is now an automobile salesman at Warsaw. He married, July 18, 1912, Hazel Jontz, who died March 25, 1922, leaving one son, James Robert, born May 5, 1913, now attending public schools, and after his first wife's death Keith C. Yotter married, May 12, 1925, Dora Dilman, but they have no children. Zeta Wilodean, only daughter of Marquis D. Yotter, born January 17, 1903, who attended the local high school, and February 28, 1924, married E. E. Summe, and has two sons, Billy Lee, born October 10, 1926, and Tommy Lyle, born in September, 1929.

Obituary of Sarah Morrow

Sarah Dill Morrow was born in Vinton County Ohio March 28, 1815 and died May 25, 1900 at the home of her son, George Morrow, near Pacific Junction, Iowa. She was, at the time of her death, 85 years, 4 month and 22 days old. She married Andrew Morrow, September 27, 1835, and was the mother of 16 children – 14 boys and 2 girls; nine of who are living. She moved to Iowa in 1857 where she lived until her death. She was one who was inspired with a spirit of patriotism as there were six of her sons in the War of Rebellion fighting to defend the banner and preserve the nation's honor, it being said she sent more boys into service than any other family in Iowa. She was not only true to her County, but also truer to her God, having been a member of the Christian Church for seventy years. It may be truly said of her that a Saint of Israel has fallen asleep and gone to that beautiful City above and there awaits to welcome the loved ones of earth to that land where sorrow is unknown. Her funeral was held from the Christian Church, Sunday, May 27, 1900, conducted by Rev. McFarland after which she was laid to rest in Calhoun Cemetery.

Record to Be Proud of - Special to the Daily Nonparell. Glenwood June 31

Mrs. Sarah Morrow, who died at the age of 85 the past week at the home of her son, near Pacific Junction, leaves a record that is probably unequaled by any other woman in the state of Iowa. In addition to being the mother of fifteen children, eight of whom are still living, she had six sons who took part in the civil war. The claim has been frequently made and never contradicted that this was the greatest number going from any one family in the state of Iowa. The six Morrow boys all enlisted in the service at the courthouse in Glenwood. Three of these are now living, one having died of measles in the south during the war. George, Will and Rozelle Morrow were members of Company G of the fifteenth Iowa infantry. Tom and John Morrow belonged to Company K of the Twenty-ninth Iowa, while Amos Morrow was in the Fourth Iowa battery.

Notes for ANDREW MORROW:

Newspaper obituary, most likely from Modale, Harrison County, IA:

"...The deceased was born in Vinton County, Ohio (present day Vinton; at the time of Andrew's birth the area was part of Jackson County since Vinton was not created until 1850), Feb 8, 1814. His parents, James and Jane (Ludington) Morrow, emigrated from Greenbrier county, (W)VA to Vinton County, Ohio in 1810. On Sept 27, 1835, Mr. Morrow was married to Sarah Dill, who survives him. The fruits of this union were sixteen children, fourteen boys and two girls. Nine of the children are now living; their names and residences as follows: Geo. Morrow, Pacific Junction, IA, Allen Morrow, Malvern, IA, Rozzell (sic-Rozzel) and Wm. Morrow, Murray, Neb., Mrs. Catharine Davis, Whiting, Ia., Benjamin Morrow, in Idaho, Harry (sic-Henry) and Samuel Morrow, in SD, and Clinton Morrow, of this place. Shortly after his marriage, Mr. Morrow and wife moved from Vinton County to Jackson County, Ohio, about six miles west of the town of Jackson. After residing there several years they moved to Pike (sic-probably Pike, OH) county, residing there until 1857 when they moved to Iowa and settled in Page county. In 1860 they moved to Mills county, IA and in 1868 moved to Cass county, Neb. After a few years residence in Nebraska, they moved to this county (Harrison) and has since resided here, the last ten years having lived in Modale.

Mr. Morrow and wife were married and lived together nearly sixty years, raising a large family and seeing them reach manhood and womanhood. Five of their sons turned out to defend their country's flag during the late

rebellion. They were George and William who served in the Fifteenth Iowa Infantry. Amos in the Fourth Iowa Battery and John and Thomas in the Twenty-ninth Iowa Infantry.

The funeral occurred Tuesday at 10 am front the Union church, the sermon being preached by Elder Harris of the Christian church, after which the remains were laid to rest in the cemetery at Calhoun.

The relatives from abroad in attendance to the funeral were William Morrow and wife and Rozzel Morrow, wife and daughter, Mr. (Bennett) Chriswiser and wife, Rachel Calvin and S.M.(Stephen Meek?) Davis, of Murray, Neb., Andy Dill of Plattsmouth, Neb., Geo. Morrow, Pacific Junction, Ia., Allen Morrow and son, Frank, Malvern, Ia. and T.G.(Thomas Granville) Davis." A VETERAN OF THE CIVIL WAR, From Wednesday's Daily: (Plattsmouth paper, Aug 1901)

After an illness of nearly two months' duration, William Morrow passed away at 5:30 this morning. Mr. Morrow was taken ill about weeks ago, when an old gun-shot wound on his arm, received during the civil war, broke open. Soon after he took to his bed, the bone in the arm broke in two, and, while amputation was necessary, this deferred owing to the patient's weakened condition. The patient gradually grew worse and during the last few days of his life he suffered greatly. When the final summons came this morning there were present at his bedside his wife and five of his children, namely; Andy, Joseph, Bert, Milton and Mrs. Effie Banning of Newhawa. In the death of Mr. Morrow the ranks of the Grand Army of the Republic loses another old comrade who served his country so faithfully and gallantly during the stirring time of the civil war. The deceased was born in Jackson County, Ohio, September 27, 1839; moved to Page county, Iowa, in the spring of '57. Two years later he moved to Mills County, Iowa. At the age of twenty-two he enlisted in the Fifteenth Iowa regiment, serving for three years. The wound which caused his death was received on July 22, 1864, in the famous battle of Atlanta. He was

also a member of a company, which acted as a body guard to General Sherman at the battle of Shiloh, and took an active part in several other noted conflicts.

After returning home from the war, he was married to Miss Artie M. Shaw on March 17, 1867. In 1880 the family moved to Cass County, locating near Murray, but in late years they have resided in Plattsmouth. Besides a farm in the vicinity of Murray, Mr. Morrow owned some property in this city. He leaves a widow and five grown children to mourn his death.

It can be said that Mr. Morrow was one of those genial, good-natured men who seemed always to regard the bright side of life, and his kindly disposition made many friends for him during his long residence in Cass County. The funeral services will be held at the Presbyterian Church at 1 o'clock tomorrow afternoon, conducted by Rev. Baird, after which the remains will be taken to Eight Mile Grove cemetery for burial.

Note: His remains were later moved to Seward.

In 1857 he moved with his parents to Page County, Iowa and three years later came to this county, first locating in Lyons township and afterward near Glenwood. During that year he came to the farm where he now lives. He then went to the gold regions of the west and engaged in mining, but soon returned to Lyons township, and has since followed the occupation of a farmer. His parents, Andrew and Sarah, had a family of fifteen children, thirteen sons and two daughters. Five of the sons served in the war of the rebellion. Allen was not among those, owing to ill health. Was married April 13, 1869 to Miss Mary C., daughter of Stephen and Mary Davis of Vinton County Ohio. They were the parents of two children: Louisa and Frank. Mrs. Morrow died April 22, 1876. Mr. Morrow is a member in good standing of the Baptist church. He owns an excellent stock farm of 240 acres, well improved and systematically arranged, with good house, barn and orchard. -- taken from the Mills County Iowa 1881 Biography

Obit Allen Morrow

The remains of Allen Morrow, mention of whose death was made in last week's Leader, were brought to Malvern by Auto hearse, Thursday, and funeral services were held from the Baptist church. There was a large attendance of his old friends and neighbors, for Mr. Morrow had a host of friends among the older residents of this vicinity. The services at the church were conducted under the Christian Science direction with Mr. Warner as reader and a lady from Omaha, who sang. The remains were taken to the Malvern cemetery for interment and there the services were conducted by the local Masonic order of which the deceased was a member. Short services were held at the home before coming to Malvern. His children were all here to attend the funeral and two brothers, Clinton Morrow of Modale and Rozzel Morrow and two daughters of Tekamah, Nebr were also here. Mr. Morrow was well known to all of our older residents and all had a warm place in their hearts for him, for with his kindly ways and genial disposition he had made many friends who sorrow over his passing.

The following obituary was furnished us: Allen Morrow as born in Jackson County, Ohio, July 29th, 1840 and passed away Sept. 12th, 1916, aged 76 years 1 month and 13 days. He, with his parents, removed to Iowa in the year 1857 and settled near Clarinda, later removing to Mills County, of which place he was a resident for nearly half a century. He was among those who crossed the plains by wagon in the early days, following the Old Oregon Trail to the Rocky Mountains. In those days the chance to secure even a common school education was very rare but by his own efforts he improved his mind to such an extent that few men of his time were better posted, not only on current events, but also in regard to historical events, as well as notable undertakings regarding which he could state facts and figures in a remarkable manner. Mr. Morrow was a very sociable man. He made friends easily and enjoyed nothing better than visiting and relating his experiences, which were many and varied. He was a true friend and a kind and indulgent parent and no man can say that he ever did him wrong. During the last few months of his earthly existence he donned the Christian Science faith receiving great physical and spiritual help. He is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Wm. Shaw of Council Bluffs and Mrs. Roy Lash of Lexington, Nebr; two sons, Frank of Missouri Valley and Fred of Fremont, Nebr.; also five brothers and one sister besides numerous relatives and friends. He fell asleep at the home of his daughter Mrs. Wm. Shaw, surrounded by his loving children, to awaken to the life of truth and love.

In the passing of Mr. Morrow, Tekamah loses one of the most esteemed citizens; although Mr. Morrow had past his three score years and ten, yet he was a young man in spirit and active as a man of forty years. He was a close student of political economy and took much interest in national and state affairs. Mr. Morrow had rare musical talent and became an expert on the fife while in the army, and at the grand review in Washington, in 1865 he won the prize for having the best drum corp. After he became a resident of Burt County, he maintained what was known as the "Morrow Drum Corp" which was composed mostly of his sons, and was a feature at all public gatherings for many years. Recently when contingents of the Burt County boys were leaving for the training

camps, Mr. Morrow headed the processions to the trains with his fife and drum corp, rendering patriotic airs with all his youthful vigor. Mr. Morrow enlisted in the Home Guards when organized this fall and drilled with the boys every night. He was a fine character.

Rozzell Morrow the son of Andrew and Sarah Morrow was born in Jackson County, Ohio, April 9th 1847 and departed this life November 1, 1917 at the age of 70 years, 6 months and 22 days.

He, with his parents, moved from Ohio to Iowa in the year 1857 and settled in Clarinda, where they lived until 1860 then moved to Mills County, of the same state. In the year 1862 he enlisted in Co. I 15th Iowa infantry in which he served until May 1864 when he was transferred to the United States Patrol Guards in which he served until the close of the war.

At the close of the war he came to Cass County, Nebraska, and located near Plattsmouth, and was a member of the Plattsmouth Post No 45, at the time of his death. He was united in marriage to Miss Adella Frizzell March 25th 1874, to this union was born 9 children. He resided with his family in Cass County until 1894 when he removed to Tekamah, settling on a farm nine miles north and in the year 1910 moved from the farm to Shenandoah, IA. Where he resided for one year then returned to this city where he has since resided.

He is survived by his wife, and seven children: Mrs. Viola Grothe, Edmon and Miss Hazel of Tekamah, Miss Anna of Omaha, Miss Lillian of Valley, Dr. Wren of Winnetoon, and Dr. Lawrence of Brunswick. He is also survived by one sister Mrs. Katherine Davis of Sloan, Iowa and two brothers Henry and Samuel of Silver City, South Dakota. His departure marks the passing of a kind and loving husband and father.

The funeral services were held at the Baptist church Sunday afternoon conducted by Rev. J.R. Mantey, the pastor, assisted by Rev. Owings of the Riverside Baptist church who was his pastor when he lived on his farm north of this city. The G.A.R. and W.R.C. likewise the Home Guards attended in a body and escorted the remains from the home to the church. The attendance was very large and the floral offerings profuse which he spoke silent tributes of the regard in which he was held by all who knew him, and the interment took place in the Tekamah cemetery.

Adella J. Frizzell was born at Wabash, Ind., June 26, 1857, and died at her home in Tekamah, Nebraska.

Andrew Dill, Jr. For Forty-One years a resident of Cass County died in his home in the city Saturday night.

Andrew Dill, one of the old residents of Cass County passed away last night at 9:40 at the home on Elm Street after an illness covering several weeks. Mr. Dill although only a few days of eighty-seven years of life, was a man of splendid vitality and strength, and though death has been slowly approaching for the past few days, his wonderful strength endured until the last, worn with the struggle of life, he passed peacefully over the river that marks the boundary of Eternity.

Andrew Dill has been a resident of Cass County for forty-one years having crossed the Missouri River at this place with his family on February 10, 1876 and at once located on a homestead near where the town of Murray is now

located and here Mr. Dill resided for many years, rearing his family and taking an active part in the development and resources of the county, A man of sterling character he won the respect and esteem of all those whom he came in contact with and his death will come a distinct loss to the old friends and neighbors with whom he associated for so many years. Some twenty four years ago Mr. Dill and his wife moved from the farm to Plattsmouth to spend their declining years to the enjoyment of a well deserved rest from their toil and have since made their home in this city. Few men have left behind a clearer record of their dealings with their fellow men than has the departed and his passing is a loss to the community that will be hard to replace and one that occasions the most profound regret throughout the City.

To mourn the death of this good man, there remains a widow and four children: Mrs. Alice Hipp of Lyons, NE; Ben Dill, Murray, NE; Mrs. Hattie Davis, Haxtum, CO; and Riley C. Dill, Rosalie, NE. A half brother Bennett Chriswiser and a half sister Mrs. Rachel Colvin of Nehawka NE also left to mourn his death.

The funeral service of Mr. Dill will be held tomorrow afternoon at two o'clock at Eight Mile Grove where the family formerly resided and interment will be in the cemetery there. Rev. W.A. Taylor, pastor of the Baptist Church will officiate. There will be a short prayer service at the home at one o'clock before the cortege leaves for Eight Mile Grove.

In Kentucky Aaron acquired 960 acres of land on Penny Creek from D.A. and Matilda Butler on 12 May 1856 for \$1504 to be paid in three installments, starting with \$304 in cash (source: Crittenden Co. KY Courthouse, Book D., p. 473). This date shows that Aaron made the trip to KY to buy land before he married. Aaron and Mary sold land to Henry Reed on 24 Jan 1857. Aaron and Mary B. Reed sold 300+ acres of land to H.S. Reed on 19 Sept 1857 for \$752 (Book D. p. 630). These are the only two land records for A.W. Reed, although I did find his name mentioned in Deed Book M, p. 189, showing that land was owned jointly by John P. Reed, Aaron Reed and his wife Mary B. Reed, and Amos Reed. Aaron was in Kentucky throughout the Civil War, and is listed as a member of the KY Militia, reorganized 5 Mar 1860 "for the use and defense of the state." Militia members were mainly Union men, but KY was technically a "neutral" state (source: 1865 Crittenden Co, KY Militia List).

After Henry died in 1868, John and Amos D. bought the widow's interest in the land. Thus the three brothers had their finances in common until Amos was married. In 1870, John and Amos bought Aaron's interest in the land, according to Amos' account. However, I could not find a land record for this sale which should have been in 1869. Aaron moved his family from KY to Neosho County, Kansas in 1870, settling on the Osage ceded land. He was a resident of Big Creek Twp for 21 years, and lived next door to the Allen Haymaker family. Living nearby was the Richardson family; their son Henry married Alice Reed. A.W. Reed's will was dated and was written in Big Creek Township, Neosho Co, KS. The will was probated June 22, 1891 with M.A. Richardson as Executor. Aaron and Mary are buried in .

1860 census, District 1, Crittenden Co, KY: A.W. Reed (31), Mary B. Reed (25), and Alice C. Reed (2).

1870 census, Big Creek Twp, Neosho Co, KS: Aaron W. Reed (40), Mary (34), Alice C. (13), Carrie (9), Patrick (7), Ida M. (3), Flora.

1880 census, Big Creek Twp, Neosho Co, KS: A.W. Reed (51), Mary B. (48), Alice (22), teaching, Carrie (19), P.H. (17), Ida (13), Flora Estella (11).

Notes for MARY BAILEY PATTERSON: Mary and her sister, Sophrona, were listed on the 1850 census for Clinton Twp, Vinton Co, Ohio in 1850 along with their mother, step-father, and siblings. Her obituary states, "21 years ago her beloved companion was taken home, since which time she has been lovingly cared for by her surviving children. In early life she became a Christian and was ever firm in that live and faith of her Savior. Almost 9 years ago she met with an accident which resulted in her hip being broken, since which time she has been confined to the home. Coming to Savonburg the first of last November to spend the winter months with her daughter, Mrs. Flora Courtney, she was taken ill of senile gangrene the latter part of December, passing to her eternal rest March 2, 1912, after nine long weeks of untol suffering during which her patient, loving nature was ever in evidence." Brief funeral services were held and a quartette beautifully sang "Lead Kindly Light," a song Mary had expressed a desire to hear shortly before she was taken ill. Mr. and Mrs. Courtney sang it for her, and she expressed her appreciation of the beautiful words. Rev. Blalock, or Moran, conducted the final funeral services after which she was laid to rest by the side of her husband.

 1920 census, Iola, Allen Co, KS: Henry A. (60) and Alice C. (62) Richardson with their daughter Flora F. (24). Henry was a hardware salesman and Flora was a telephone cashier.
 1930 census, Los Angeles, CA: Henry A. (71) and Alice C. (72) Richardson with daughter Flora F. (34). Henry was proprietor of a confectionary store and Flora was a credit manager for the telephone company.

Notes for HENRY A. RICHARDSON: History of Allen and Woodson Counties, Kansas (pp. 375-376), transcribed by Carolyn Ward from History of Allen and Woodson Counties, Kansas, Edited and Compiled by L. Wallace Duncan and Chas. F. Scott. Iola Registers, Printers and Binders, Iola, Kan.: 1901

HENRY A. RICHARDSON was born in Ripley county, Indiana, February 18, 1859, and was the eldest of the six children of M. A. and Eliza Richardson. His father was born in Onondaga county, New York, March 12, 1835. The grandfather, Asa Richardson, also a native of the Empire state, married Barbara Babcock, and died in 1870, at the age of sixty-five years. His wife passed away at the age of thirty-five years.

M. A. Richardson, the father of our subject, became a resident of Indiana during his boyhood, and there resided until his removal to Kansas. In the meantime he married Miss Eliza Wylie, a native of Ohio, the wedding being celebrated in 1858. Feeling that his duty was to his country at the time of the Civil war, he enlisted on the 12th of August, 1862, as a member of Company A. Eighty-third Regiment of Indiana Volunteers, serving for three years, in which time he participated in the battles of Arkansas Post, Helena Arkansas, Chickaniauga, Grand Gulf, Champion Hills, Black River Bridge, both charges of Vicksburg, the battle of Jackson Mississippi, and many smaller engagements, displaying his bravery and valor on many occasions. After the stars and stripes were planted in the capital of the Confederacy he received an honorable discharge, August 27, 1865, and returned to his Indiana home. In 1872 he came to Allen county, Kansas, settling on a farm, and both he and his wife are now residents of Savonburg. He is still a vigorous and energetic man and assists his son Henry in the conduct of his business. This worthy couple are people of the highest respectability and have reared a creditable family of six children, namely: Henry A.; Mary, wife of William H. Allen, of Colorado; Lida, wife of William Pullum, of Argentine, Kansas; Lucy, wife of C. H. King, of Bloomington, Ill.; V. B., of Colorado; and Josie, wife of N. W. Mills, of Kansas.

Henry A. Richardson spent the first fourteen years of his life in Indiana and then came with his parents to Allen county, living near the south line in Cottage Grove township. His boyhood days were spent in the work of the farm or in attendance at the district schools. He was married August 5, 1880, to Alice C. Reed, a native of Kentucky, who came to Kansas with her parents in 1870. Mr. Richardson then purchased a farm of one hundred and sixty acres, which he owned and operated until 1886, when he sold out and became identified with commercial interests in Leanna, dealing in all kinds of produce there until 1895, when he removed to Chanute. A year later he took up his abode in Savonburg, and for eight months conducted the City Hotel, but later bought a business property, and has since engaged in dealing in produce with excellent success, his business now amounting to from fifteen to twenty thousand dollars annually. He has always paid the highest market price for produce and ships in car loads to the city markets. He has won the confidence of all with whom he has thus come in contact, by reason of his honorable business methods.

Unto Mr. and Mrs. Richardson have been born six children: Ada, now the wife of August Schwardt, a lumber merchant of Savonburg; Blanche, Edith, Nellie, Flora and Homer, all of whom are still with their parents. Since casting his first presidential vote Mr. Richardson has been a stalwart Republican, and his fellow townsmen, recognizing his worth and ability, have called him to office, so that he is now serving for the third term as constable of his township. He is a member of Savonburg Camp. No. 1271, M. W. A., and is prominent in business, social and political circles.

Notes for CARRIE EUNICE REED: In 1870, at the age of 10, Carrie Reed traveled with her parents and 4 siblings from Kentucky to a farm in Neosho Co, Kansas. The census shows that the Reed and Haymaker families lived one door down from each other in Leanna, KS. At the age of 21, she married her neighbor and schoolmate Frank Haymaker. Nothing is known about their married lives except that they had 3 children. Carrie, Frank and the children were living in Pittsburg, Crawford Co, KS in 1900, and the census indicates that she was a "landlady." The copy of her Divorce Decree indicates that Frank deserted the family in 1906. By summer, 1907 Carrie was

living in Los Angeles, CA with Harry, age 15. She took him back to Kansas in the fall, and began divorce procedures on 7 Oct 1907, through her attorney Chris Ritter, waiving a jury trial. Carrie appeared in court on 14 Dec 1907 for the trial. Frank did not appear, and the divorce was granted. Carrie retained custody of her minor son, Harry, and she retained title to her property of 82 acres of land. She was back in Los Angeles by 25 Feb 1908, when she sent him a post card from the Hotel Lankershim. Her eldest son, Roy, was already married and living in Los Angeles by the time she moved there, but he is never mentioned in the numerous post cards that Carrie sent to Harry. In July 1908, Carrie took the train to Salt Lake City, probably because she suffered from rheumatism and hoped the weather would help. She arrived on 8 July, and wrote to her son, "If I get better of this rheumatism I think I will like it here." The next week, she wrote, "The weather is nice here and I don't freeze like I did in L.A. so am in hopes my rheumatism will get better in time." In September, Carrie was feeling better and she wrote to Harry about a visit to the Mormon Tabernacle to hear the organ recital. She was very impressed with the building and remarked that it had been finished when she was 7 years old. Carrie seems to have remained in Salt Lake City until after Christmas, 1908. She returned in Oakland, CA on 19 Jan 1909. My mother believes that Carrie ran a rooming house in Oakland California, but I have not yet found evidence to prove that fact.

There is evidence in Harry's post card collection that Carrie, and probably her 2nd husband Frank Lynn, visited Kansas in 1910, perhaps on their honeymoon. She was in Coffeyville, KS on May 10 and she indicated her intention to be in Iola to visit Harry in a few days. Carrie was back in Oakland, California by 4 Nov 1910 when she sent him a post card chiding him for not yet writing. She signed many of her postcards with the words, "love and kisses, Mama." Her final post card from Oakland was dated 21 Feb 1912. By 1920, Carrie and Frank Lynn were living on 19th Street in Oakland, California (US Census 1920, T625, Roll 89, p. 102). Frank was listed as an insurance solicitor. Carrie sent two post cards to her son in 1921, and they indicate she was living in Alameda, California. In April 1930, Frank and Carrie were living in Olympia, WA with Winnie and Cor Post and their children. After Frank died, he was cremated in Tacoma, WA. Carrie went back to Kansas to live with family members. She had 11 grandchildren. She died of a heart attack is buried in the family plot at Leanna Cemetery, Neosho Co, KS. The name on her tombstone is "Carrie Reed Lynn."

Notes for C.FRANK HAYMAKER: Frank moved with his family from Iowa to Kansas when he was about 9 years old. He married the daughter of Aaron W. Reed, who lived one house down from his family. They were probably classmates in school. On 13 August 1900, Frank Haymaker, Carrie Haymaker, F.L. Haymaker, and May Haymaker sold One Square Acre of land in Neosho Co, Kansas to Josiah (?) School District 79 for a sum of \$25.00. It is not known why they moved in about 1899 to Pittsburg, Crawford Co, KS. Frank deserted his wife in 1906 (source: Divorce Decree), and eventually went to New Mexico where he raised horses and farmed. He lived in Cambray, New Mexico. His son Harry visited him once in New Mexico, according to Harry's daughter. His burial was handled by J.A. Mahoney Funeral Home and Wheelers Mortuary. Information obtained by Gerald Reed in 1962 from the Deming, NM Chamber of Commerce shows burial in Mountain View Cemetery in Sunset Plot, Row 4, Lot 70. The online transcription of grave stones in Mountain View verifies his burial there.

Frank's occupation was Land Lord and Carrie's occupation was Land Lady. Since they didn't have boarders, it's assumed they owned land or property.

This shows Leonard and Belle had been married 18 years and she had one child.

1910 census (April 29), Loveland, Larimer Co, CO: Leonard R. (57) and Rosa B. (52) Hayward lived with their son Reed H. Hayward (27) and his wife Grace M. (30). Also listed was Leonard R. Reed (18), brother, Lelia D. Hibbard (26), step-sister, and Sarah Marshall (54), grandmother. A servant named Carrie Glantz (22) was listed. This record shows them married for 20 years and it shows she had 3 children with all still living.

1930 census, Los Angeles, CA: Charles (61) and Nancy E. (61) Hayward with a chauffeur and a maid. He owned a house on Ash St. valued at \$15,000. No occupation listed.

A.D. Reed reported in his 1936 newspaper interview that Charley was living in Los Angeles, "where he owns a door and sash factory which covers one whole block of the city lot. He also owns 30 or 40 lumber yards. These and his factory have made for him a fortune. He is now rated as a millionaire. Charley has traveled extensively. He has made three trips around the world" (source, Wellston Telegram, about 1936). Charles was also listed as President of Hayward Lumber and Investment Co. "His wife died in Japan as they were on their way home on a second World tour" (sources: letter from A.D. Reed; Kirkpatrick, 2004).

1860 census, District 1, Crittenden Co, KY: Wm. B. Wilson (33), Rachel Wilson (27), and H.D. Wilson (7). They lived next door to Aaron Watson Reed's family.

1870 census, Flora Ward 1, Clay Co, IL: Wm B. (43) and Rachel (38) Wilson with children Hollis (17), Adella E. (9), Cora E. (7), and Aaron W W (4). William was a Miller with property valued at \$1200 and \$1800. Hollis also worked in the mill.

1880 census, Carrigan, Marion Co, IL: William (53) and Rachel (48) Willson with children Hollis (28), Adella (17) and Allice (14). William was a Miller (saw) and the two sons also worked in the saw mill.

1900 census, Township 3, Fresno Co, CA: Wm B. (73) and Rachel (68) Wilson with her sister Catherine Hayward (70). They had been married 48 years and she had 4 children with 1 still living.

Notes for MARY ELIZA REED: This sister of Enos and Amos, wanted to be a teacher, so she took the twins to school with her when they were only four years old. She taught school for about 5 years before she was married.

He married (1) SUSAN BELL MORSE Abt. 1865 in Sandy Grove, Whitley Co, KY. She was born January 27, 1852 in Ohio, and died February 02, 1887 in Fredonia, KY on a farm near Marion, Crittenden Co, KY, interred Hill Cemetery, Fredonia, KY⁹¹. He married (2) ELIZA HARDIN DURHAM October 1887 in KY. She was born Abt. 1850, and died Bef. 1895 in KY. He married (3) MARTHA ELEANOR "MATTIE" MARTIN WILLIAMS October 1895 in KY. She was born July 22, 1855 in Lyon Co, KY⁹², and died June 09, 1937 in Kuttawa, Lyon Co, KY⁹².

Notes for JOHN PATRICK REED: John fought in the Civil War, 114th Regiment under Cap. Lafe Hawk, and was captured by the Confederates. A.D. Reed wrote that he was in many battles and served in the 44th Ohio Infantry, which was made up of men from Vinton and Jackson counties. He was nearly sent to Libby prison, but was fortunate to be paroled at Little Rock, Arkansas. In 1867, he moved to Kentucky and by 1872, John owned 3700 acres of land in Kentucky. It was paid for and well stocked, according to Amos Reed's narrative about the family. John was a dealer in live stock and he had 8 children at Shady Grove. One of his sons became an oil magnate in Texas while the others lived in Kentucky. In Sept 1884, J. P. Reed purchased a farm in Fredona, KY.

Mary Lou visited the Crittenden County, KY Library on 24 June 2006 and found several paragraphs on John P. Reed in the following book:

Walker, Odell (2002). In Lyon County, Saturday was Town Day: A Collection of Writings from Lyon County's Historian. Kuttawa, KY: Lyon County Historical Society.

"The following story centers on an area in northwest Lyon County. Mr. John Reed owned several hundred acres of land on the Cumberland River above the point where Livingston Creek runs into the river. The farm included a lot of Livingston Creek bottomland for two or three miles up the creek on the south side. Many sharecroppers both white and black worked on Mr. Reed's farm. ... There were enough black families in the area to support a church and school. A black church was constructed on Mr. Reed's farm. The building was located on top of a hill about three hundred yards north of White Oak Spring and overlooking Livingston Creek. The church building also served as a schoolhouse for black children" (p. 155).

"John P. Reed owned a large plantation farm of several hundred acres in the northeast corner of Lyon County. The farm was located on the Cumberland River south of the point where Livingston Creek runs into the Cumberland River. The majority of the farm consisted of the fertile land in the Cumberland River and Livingston Creek bottoms. It took a large labor force to carry on Mr. Reed's extensive farm operation. A large number of this labor force consisted of black people. There were a number of black sharecroppers that lived on the place and a larger number of laborers that worked by the day for wages. I have heard some of the older people who worked for Mr. Reed speak of corn rows along the Cumberland River that were a mile long (p. 219).

1870 (June 18) census, Marion, Crittenden Co, KY: John P. Reed (27), wife Susan B. (20), and son Homer E. (1). Amos Reed (25) lived with the family along with 6 other people: Saml Newkins (19), Mariah Newkins (16), Saml Dollar (18), Amanda Smith (35), Charlie Smith (15), and Ellen Smith (10). John was a farmer with property valued at \$2000 and \$2500.

1880 census - not yet found

1900 census, Depot St., District 29, Marion, Crittenden Co, KY: John P. Reed (57), wife Mattie (45), and his daughter Stella (16). They had been married 3 years.

1910 census, Kuttawa, Lyon Co, KY: John P. Reed (65) and wife Mattie E. (55). He was a farmer and stock dealer.

John and Mattie are buried in Kuttawa Cemetery, Kuttawa, Lyon Co, KY. His grave was visited and photographed by Mary Lou on 25 June 2006 and it was in excellent condition. To locate the stone, drive into the Kuttawa Cemetery under the metal arch with the name on it, and the stone is about 10 yards ahead on the left, next to the roadway. No other Reed stones are nearby.

Notes for PRESLEY LOGAN REED: On 7 Aug 1896, Logan Reed and his sister, Estella Reed, witnessed a marriage near Marion in Crittenden Co, KY.

1900 census, Poplar St, Kuttawa, Lyon Co, KY: Preston L. Reed (28), wife Pearl (25) and brother Major F. (19). His occupation was "livery feed."

1910 census, Kuttawa, Logan Co, KY: Logan Reed (37), wife Pearl D. (35), and children Hugh (9) and Rosie (10 mos). A boarder, Tom Cardin (?) age 39 lived with the family.

1920 census, Kuttawa, Lyon Co, KY: Presley L. Reed (48), wife Pearle D. (45), and children Hugh (19), Rossie (11), and Ruth (7). His sister, Lucy E. (44) lived with the family. A note on the census record stated that Ruth's name was not given on her birth certificate but it listed the names of her parents and gave her exact birth date.

Logan and Pearl are buried in Hebron Church Cemetery (source: Lyon County Cemeteries (1989) published by the Lyon Co. Historical Society and located at the Crittenden County Library in Marion, KY). Directions to Hebron Church Cemetery: Located in Fredonia Quadrangle. Across Hwy 1943 from Hebron Baptist Church. From Eddyville, turn off Hwy 62 on Hwy 373, go past the state garage to the intersection of 1943. Turn left on 1943 and go about 1/2 mile.

Notes for IVY ELIZABETH "LIZZIE" REED: It is presumed that this is John's sister, called Lizzie, who lived with John in Kentucky. After John's death, she went to live with Logan Reed and his single daughter. Dora Reed wrote in a letter, "When John Reed was in the service during the Civil War, he came to visit Aunt Mary Dycus. Aunt Mary had lost almost all her livestock and poultry to both sides of that armies." Lizzie is buried in Hebron Church Cemetery, near Fredonia, KY.

Notes for DORA ANNA REED: Dora inherited 200 acres of land from her father, John Reed. The marriage record located by Mary Lou Cook at the Crittenden County, KY library indicated that Dora was the 2nd wife of Rufe Barnett. It showed that he was age 44 and she was age 26 when they married at the home of P.L. [Presley Logan] Reed. She died of a heart attack while digging and transplanting bulbs in her garden.

1910 census (May 5), Part of 1st Mag. District, Lyon Co, KY: Rufus Barnett (49), wife Dora (32), son Leslie (15), daughter Inez (15), son Loyd (12) and daughter Beulah (4). Rufus was a farmer and he had been married to Dora for 5 years.

1920 census, District 1, Eddyville, Lyon Co, KY: Ruffus Barnett (59), wife Dora A. (41), and children Inez L. (25), Lloyd L. (22), and Beulah L. (13). His mother, Lucindia J. (79) lived with the family.

Notes for MAJOR FRANNES "FRANK" REED: According to Gerald R. Reed, Major (name, not title) got into an argument and killed the father of his first wife. He spent some time in an Oklahoma penitentiary. His first wife and three children moved to Oregon.

1900 census, Lyon Co, KY: Major F. (19) lived with his brother, Presley Logan Reed.

1920 census, District 43, Dumas, Desha Co, AR: Walton J. Rice (45), wife Stella M. (35), and children Christine (16), Walton D. (14), Glen (11), Katherine S. (9), May Belle (7), John W. (4), Zane C. (3), and Baby (2 mos). Walton's occupation was "bookkeeper farm."

1930 census, Dumas, Desha Co, AR: Stella M. Rice (46) with children Maebelle (18), John W. (14), Jana E. (12), Owen R. (10), and Fay (7). Stella's occupation was Postmistress, US Post Office Dept. Next door was her son Walton H. (25) and his wife Mysette (21).

AMOS DRIAH⁵ REED (*ELIZABETH⁴ YOTTER, MARIA ELIZABETH "MARY ELIZA"³ LEIST, UNKNOWN², DAVID¹*)¹⁰⁰ was born August 12, 1845 in Reed's Mill, Hamden, Vinton Co, Ohio, and died January 07, 1939 in Harveyville, Wabaunser Co, KS at the home of his daughter¹⁰¹. He married ELIZABETH "LIZZIE" A. PARMETER March 23, 1873 in Osage Co, KS near Burlingame, daughter of EPHRAIM PARMETER. She was born March 22, 1847 in Morgan Co, OH, and died July 22, 1934 in Harveyville, KS¹⁰².

Notes for AMOS DRIAH REED: Amos, called A.D. went to Kentucky in 1869, two years after his brother John went there. AD reported in a newspaper interview when he was 91 that he went to Kentucky because of the glowing description of the state by his Aunt Mary. After marriage, he moved to Illinois to care for his aged mother. In an article he wrote late in life, he said he sold his interest in the land he had purchased in Kentucky to brother John, and arrived in Kansas the day before Christmas, 1872. There he bought land next to his brother Enos. However, he must have moved to KS later, since the 1880 census shows he was still in Illinois.

1880 census, Flora, Clay Co, IL: Amos D. Reed (34), his wife Elizabeth (33), and two children, Bertha (2) and Errold (2 months). Living with them was Elizabeth Reed (78), mother of Amos.

1900 census, Cottage Grove, Allen Co, KS: Milo Reed (20) lived with his parents.

1910 census, Cottage Grove, Allen Co, KS: M. Earl (30) and Hattie M. (23) Reed with daughter Mildred S. (1). His parents, Amos D. (65) and Elizabeth A. (63), lived with them and Earl was a farmer.

1920 census, Cottage Grove, Allen Co, KS: M. Earl (39) and Hattie M. (33) Reed with children Mildred (10) and Robert (2). His parents lived next door.

1930 census, Cottage Grove, Allen Co, KS: Earl (50) and Hattie (47) Reed with their son Robert L. (12), and his parents Amos D. (84) and Elizabeth A. (83) Reed. Earl was a farmer.

Elizabeth died in Aug. 1880, and in 1881, they moved to a farm near Leanna, Ks. Amos made two trips back to Ohio, the first of which was in 1877. The second was in 1884 when he and his brothers "sold the old homestead where my father located soon after his marriage" (source: story in the Wellston Telegram). The buyer was Erastus Johnson. Funeral services were held at the Leanna Christian Church with the Rev. E.A. Ham of First Christian Church in Chanute officiating. Amos and his wife were buried in Leanna Cemetery, Leanna, Neosho Co, KS.

ENOS "ENE" ELENEUS⁵ REED (*ELIZABETH⁴ YOTTER, MARIA ELIZABETH "MARY ELIZA"³ LEIST, UNKNOWN², DAVID¹*) was born August 12, 1845 in Reed's Mill, Hamden, Vinton Co, OH, and died December 13, 1929 in Chanute, Neosho Co, KS at the home of his daughter, buried in Leanna Cemetery, Neosho Co, Kansas¹⁰³. He married MARTHA J. "MATTIE" ARNOTT August 18, 1868 in McArthur, Ohio, daughter of JOHN ARNETT and MARY HIGGINS. She was born December 04, 1848 in Jackson Co, OH or West Virginia, and died November 05, 1928 in Chanute, Neosho Co, KS¹⁰⁴.

Notes for ENOS "ENE" ELENEUS REED: Enos married a friend from school days. After Patrick Reed's death in 1862, Enos and his family lived in the brick mansion for about 8 years with his mother, Elizabeth Yotter. They moved to Princeton, Kentucky in about 1869 to be with his brother John. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge in Princeton, KY. Not long after moving to KY, Ene, his wife, and mother moved to Flora, Illinois where Catherine Reed lived. They must have moved back to KY since they were listed on the 1880 census. After 1880, they moved to Leanna, KS with his wife, and bought a 160 acre farm for \$1,600. He later sold that property for \$5,500, and then bought several properties in Chanute which he rented out. In the fall of 1904, they moved to Chanute, KS. Enos built his house in Kansas with native lumber. The house is pictured behind family in the Reed Family reunion about 1901. "While there he worked for the Ice Cream Company for 10 years. He worked all the gardens on vacant lots to have something to do after a day's work at the Ice cream company... He delighted in giving his friends and neighbors vegetables from those gardens and a bouquet of flowers to go with them" (Reed, 1981).

1870 census, Wilkenville PO, Clinton, Vinton Co, OH: Enos (24) and Martha (21) Reed with daughter Elizabeth (2), his mother Elizabeth (63) and his niece Ida Reed (14). Enos was a farmer with property valued at \$4000 and \$1220.
1880 census, Princeton, Caldwell Co, KY: Household included E.E. Reed (34), Martha Reed (31), and six children: Lizzie (12), Clara (10), Stella (8), James (6), Sarah (4), and an unnamed girl (1 month). Also living with the family was "laborer" Lizzie Minchey (19).

1900 census, Big Creek, Neosho Co, KS (15 June 1900): Enos E. Reed (54), Martha J. (51), Vinnie (17), Hugh D. (15), Eunice I. (13), Henry W. (11), George E. (9), Martha L. (7). This record shows Enos and Martha married for 31 years, and they had 14 children with 8 living in 1900.

In 1918 when James registered for the WWI draft in Chanute, KS, he worked for the M.R. Smith Shingle Co. as a Lumber Yard Manager.

It was noted in Hugh Reed's obituary that James was the bookkeeper for the Dubach Lumber Co. at Chanute, KS. 1920 census - not yet found

Though she had not been in good health the past nine years, since the death of her daughter, Miss Caroline, still she was able to be useful about the home and seemed to be in fairly good condition until about three weeks ago when she became very ill and at no time showed any sign of improvement. Her great age, she was in her eighty-seventh year, made it impossible for her to rally. She was the mother of six children, four daughters and two sons. All four of her daughters were teachers. She was deeply devoted to her daughters and when Miss Carolyn died it was a great blow to the mother and one from which she never fully recovered. Mrs. McCarthy was born in Vinton county, Ohio in 1836. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Christian Yeager, pioneers in that part of Ohio. Her early life was spent in her native state, but after her marriage she came west and spent most of her life in Alton. She lived for the greater part of that time at the corner of Eighth and Alby street, and in her neighborhood she was admired and loved by all her neighbors. She was known as a good mother and the very best kind of a neighbor. She was a devout member of the First Baptist church, with which she had united in 1869. She was one of the oldest members of the First Baptist church, there being but a few with a longer period of connection there than she had. She is survived by three daughters. Misses Harriet McCarthy, principal of Washington school, Alice and Sara McCarthy, all of Alton. The funeral will be Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock from the family home.
