Notes for GEORGE MAURER: George was age 32 when he immigrated to NY in June 1709. George is also rendered as "Jurge" or "Jorg." His occupation was listed as Mason on ship record. Columbia County was established in 1786 from Albany County and the original capital was Claverack. In 1805 the county seat was moved to Hudson. For ease of working on this database, all of the descendants of George Mauer will be called "Mowers," even though the name is rendered in several different ways (Maurer, Mauer, Mower, Mowers, Maur, Mour, Mourer) in Jones (1885) and in census records.

According to Jones (1985) a Matthy Moorer lived in Dutchess Co, NY and was on the Rhinebeck tax rolles for 1756 - 1758.

He married ANNA GERTRAUD "GEERTJE" SCHMIDT Abt. 1754 in NY, daughter of CONRAD SCHMIDT and ELISABETH SMITH. She was born June 04, 1734 in Claverack, Columbia Co, NY<sup>2</sup>, and died Aft. 1773 in prob. NY.

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Notes for CONRAD MOWERS: According to Jones (1985), Conrad joined the Germantown Reformed Church in 1746, and he served in Capt. Jeremiah Hogeboom's Company in 1767 (p. 608). Conrad's children are from Jones, 1985, p. 608.

**4.** GEORGE ADAM<sup>4</sup> MOWERS (*CONRAD*<sup>3</sup>, *GEORGE*<sup>2</sup> MAURER, *BARTHOLOMAUS*<sup>1</sup> MAUER) was born Bef. April 16, 1755 in NY, and died April 03, 1820 in prob. Montgomery Co, NY. He married MARY OATHOUT November 28, 1783 in Schaghticoke, NY in Dutch Reformed Church. She was born Abt. 1755.

Notes for GEORGE ADAM MOWERS:

George was baptized on April 16, 1755 in Stark/Danube, Herkimer Co, NY (source: Kampen, Amy, Mower, Hemstreet, Nichols, Manion Families, Ancestry.com, updated 24 Apr 2003). George lived in Danube Twp (formed from Minden in 1817; became Stark in 1828), Herkimer/Montgomery County in 1820 (county seat was Fonda). Records show that he was wounded in both shoulders in an action with the Indians at Oriskany on 7 Aug 1777, and was entitled to a full pension. Revolutionary War Bet. 1792 - 1795 - drew a pension (source: Kampen, 2003). 1820 census, Danube, Herkimer Co, NY: George Mower (age 45+) with a male (16-26) and his presumed wife (age 45+).

Notes for MARY OATHOUT:

Could she be related to Jan and Catharina Van Deusen Oothout, who lived in Albany Co? According to a biography on an Albany web site, Margarita Oothout, a daughter, was born in 1736, and she married Hendrick Quackenbush, a Watervliet businessman and Albany property holder. Margarita is biography #688. She was baptized in the New York City Dutch Reformed church on 5 Jan 1737.

He married (1) CATHERINA DIEVENDORF 1785 in Currytown, Montgomery Co, NY, daughter of JACOB DIEVENDORF and ELISABETH BELLINGER. She was born April 09, 1766 in Currytown, Montgomery Co, NY, and died Aft. 1817 in NY. He married (2) BARBARA ANN SCHOWDEN Abt. 1796 in New York. She was born Abt. 1772, and died March 17, 1850 in Smyrna, Chenango Co, NY age 78, buried in the North Side Cemetery, Plymouth, NY.<sup>4</sup>.

Notes for CONRAD MOWERS:

His father-in-law, Jacob Diefendorf, left a will written in 1816 (source: Bell, O.W., 1932). His daughter Catherine, was listed as the widow of Conrad Mowers, but this is thought to mean they were divorced. Three children were listed as heirs of Jacob Diefendorf: Jacob, Nancy, and Elizabeth Mowers.

This Conrad is probably the man who received a Pension dated 1832 from Montgomery Co, NY for service during the Revolutionary War. According to Robert Matteson (Town Historian for Smyrna, NY in 2006) that Conrad was married three times. His 3rd wife, Barbara, is buried in the North Side Cemetery, Plymouth, NY. The Conrad who lived in Smyrna, NY was listed on the 1840 census as a Pensioner, age 79, making him born about 1761.

Notes for CATHERINA DIEVENDORF:

She was baptized 18 May 1766 in the Reformed Dutch Church of Stone Arabia. In her father's will, dated 1816, she is mentioned as the widow of Conrad Mowers, and her son Jacob is also mentioned along with her daughters Elizabeth and Nancy. Catherine received \$1200 in her father's will.

Notes for HENDRICK MOWERS:

Amy Van Kampen's web page on the Mower Family shows that Henry Mower and Elizabeth Conyne had a son named Conrad, who was baptized 27 Oct 1791 in the Dutch Reformed Church of Caughnawaga.

Notes for ELIZABETH CONYE OR FREDERICK:

1840 census, Schuyler, Herkimer Co, NY: Elizabeth is probably the woman (age 70-80) living with Conrad Mower.

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1850 census, Schuyler, Herkimer Co, NY: Elizabeth (80) lived with her son Conrad Mower and his family.

Notes for ABRAHAM MOWERS:

They are probably the Abram (76) and Elizabeth (76) Mower living in 1850 in Steuben with the John Mower family. For the time being, I'm showing John as their son. Since they were next door to Abram A. Mowers, I assume a relationship between Abram and John. However, I did note that John's name did now have an "s" on the end, while Abram's last name was clearly given as Mowers.

1860 census, prob. Oneida Co, NY - where was Elizabeth France Mowers? She would be about 86 years of age. Did they have a son named Abram?

He married MAGDALENA FETTERLY March 19, 1794 in Fort Plain, NY<sup>7</sup>, daughter of JOHN FETTERLY and ELIZABETH CROUSE. She was born Abt. 1776 in Fort Plain, NY, and died May 18, 1859 in Annsville, Oneida Co, NY at age 81, buried in Wiffin Cemetery, Glenmore, NY<sup>8</sup>.

Notes for PETRUS MOWERS:

Peter was christened on March 17, 1765 in the Reformed Church, Claverack, Columbia Co, NY. He entered the military at the age of 14 in 1778 and served in the Revolutionary War under Gen. Marinus Willit.

1830 census, Annsville, Oneida Co, NY: Peter Mowers

1840 census, Annsville, Oneida Co, NY: Peter Mowers (75) was listed as a Revolutionary War pensioner. His household consisted of only him and a woman age 70-80, presumably Magdalena. Also living in Annsville were Peter, Jr., John, and Henry Mowers. In addition there was another younger Peter Mowers.

1850 census, Annsville, Oneida Co, NY: not yet found

Notes for JOHANNES MOWERS: Johannes was christened on November 08, 1767 in Claverack, Columbia Co, NY at the Reformed Church. Johannes and Anna had 7 children, and all but one were born in Montgomery Co, NY.

1850 census, Clarendon, Orleans Co, NY: Jacob and Rebecca Mowers lived with their son Conrad (52).

**12.** CONRAD<sup>5</sup> MOWERS (*GEORGE ADAM*<sup>4</sup>, *CONRAD*<sup>3</sup>, *GEORGE*<sup>2</sup> MAURER, *BARTHOLOMAUS*<sup>1</sup> MAUER) was born Bet. 1781 - 1791 in Minden (later Stark), Herkimer Co, NY, and died March 14, 1865 in Herkimer Co, NY. He married ELIZABETH BELLINGER September 18, 1808 in Fort Plain, Minden Twp, Montgomery Co, NY at Reformed Dutch Church, daughter of CHRISTIAN BELLINGER and BARBARA DIEVENDORF. She was born January 10, 1787 in NY, and died July 05, 1854 in Herkimer Co, NY.

Notes for CONRAD MOWERS:

Conrad was christened on July 03, 1791 in Fonda, Montgomery Co, NY at Reformed Church of Caughnawaga. His name is sometimes spelled Coenraet Mauers or Mower. He received \$60 on his claim as a soldier in the War of

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1812 (source: Hollice and Debbie, Index of Awards, Claims of the Soldiers of the War of 1812, [www.usgennet.org/usa/ny/state/1812/l-p/moulter-muscoott.html](http://www.usgennet.org/usa/ny/state/1812/l-p/moulter-muscoott.html)). When Conrad received his War of 1812 claim he lived in Stark, Herkimer Co, NY. On Shane Mowers' database, the birthdate of Conrad is shown as about 24 June 1791. However, the 1850 census shows an earlier birthdate, and the 1860 census shows a birthdate of about 1781.

1830 census: Stark, Herkimer Co, NY: Conrad Mours lived next door to his brother, John G. Mours.

1840 census: Stark, Herkimer Co, NY: Conrad Mowers (b. 1780 - 1790), female (b. 1780-1790), male (b. 1825-1830), male (b. 1820-1830), and female (b. 1820-1830). It is presumed that the three teens are Jacob, Christian, and Elizabeth.

1850 census, Stark, Herkimer Co, NY: Conrand Mowers (65), farmer, wife Elizabeth (64), and children Elizabeth (25), Jacob (23) and Christian (22). There were also three younger children in the household, presumed to be Conrad's grandchildren: Anna E. Mowers (7), Harvey P. Mowers (5) and John H. Mowers (2) - was Irene Mowers their mother? They were living 3 doors down from widow Catherine Mowers (46) and her four children Aaron, Levi, Caty M. and Margaret - the children of Conrad's brother John Mowers.

1860 census: Conrad Mowers (79) was living with his son Christian and family in Stark, Herkimer Co, NY. He is buried in Stark, Herkimer Co, NY, Wright family Cemetery on Travis Rd (source: Gravestone of Conrad Mowers).

Aaron Mowers was reared on the home farm in his native state and educated in its public schools.

In March, 1851, he married Margaret Rickard, a native of Herkimer County, New York, and a daughter of Jacob and Mary (Oaks) Rickard, both natives of the same state, who later, with their family, moved to Illinois. About one year after their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Aaron Mowers came to Illinois and farmed near New Milford for one year. They

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then moved to DeKalb County and located in South Grove Township on Section 17, where he purchased one hundred and sixty acres of government land. Seven children were born to them, all of whom grew up on this farm two miles southeast of Esmond. Their names were Fayette, Harvey, James, Charles, Mary, Allen and Lizzie. Fayette, Harvey, Charles and Allen were married and located on farms in the same vicinity. James went to Iowa where he later married and located on a farm near Northwood, Iowa. Mary was married to Frederick J. Hueber and they located on a farm in Malta Township. Lizzie was married to Lon Adee, but passed away shortly afterward. Allen, who is the only surviving member of the family, now resides in Genoa. Mr. Mowers was regarded as one of the most substantial pioneer farmers of the county, and served as road commissioner for three years. He continued living on this original farm until his death on July 23, 1910, with the exception of a few years when he resided in Fairdale. Full name: Benjamin Nelson Cook; On some of his papers he is listed as Nelson Cook.

Enlisted in the service in Danville County of Vermilion State of Illinois, on the 3rd day of July 1861 as a private in Company F. commanded by Captain Keys in the 35th Regiment of Ills Vols. From muster To Feb 28th 1862, he is reported present; To June 30/62 absent on det service in Hosp at Capville, since March 11, 1862; July and Aug 1861 to Dec 31/62 - present; Jan and Feb 1863. Missing in action Dec 31/62. "Captured at the battle of Murfreesboro, Tenn., Dec 31/64; paroled at City Point, Va., Jany 26/63; reported at Camp Parole, Md., date not stated and was sent to Benton Bks, Mo., March 11, 1863, where he appears on muster roll as present in March and sick in Hospital April 1863 - date he rejoined company not stated" (source: Illinois GenWeb Civil War Veterans).

Roll of Company for May and June/63 reports him s---- Gen. Hosp. St. Louis, Mo., from Benton Bks June 6/63. His name is on a stone slab at the park at Pea Ridge, Ark., he was at this battle field during the war. The battle of Pea Ridge was fought March 7-8, 1862; it decided the fate of Missouri for the Union. Subsequently, to April 30/64,

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reported present. Wounded in the face in action at Nose Creek (Kenesaw Mountain) Ga., June 20-28, 1864-exact date cannot be stated" Mustered out with Company Sept 27, 1864. The rest was in action at Murfreesboro, Tenn., Dec 31, 1862, and engaged in actions near Kenesaw Mountain, Ga, during June, 1864. He was honorably discharged on the 1st of June 1864 in Springfield, Illinois. Nelson's papers state that while supporting a battery of men, he received a gun shot wound of the left cheek which greatly injures his left eye and painfully affects his head. The pain Nelson suffered may have very well been the cause of the marriage break up between him and his wife Amanda in 1889. She left the state, and died in 1898 possibly in Oklahoma. Nelson later married Pheobe J. Hardesty Davis, widow of Joseph Davis also of the 35th. Both were from Vermilion Co, IL. Application for Pension No. 256.571

Ora was the 7th child and youngest son of John and Margaret Cork. Nothing is known about his childhood in northern Illinois. In July 1899, Ora Cork was bound over to the grand jury for participating in a "white cap" outrage in Rossville, IL, and he was released on a \$300 bond. About a dozen men went to James Briley's house, called him outside, whipped, then covered him with tar (Daily Commercial Newspaper, Danville, IL, July 11, 1899 issue), reportedly because Briley had not taken care of his family. The men were accompanied by Henry German, brother of Briley's wife's. In a newspaper article, Ora was called a "Saloon Loafer" and was described

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as having a "lantern-jawed face" and an unforgettable chin" (Danville Daily News, 12 July, 1899). On the 1900 census, he was listed as Ora Cook, and was living with his sister, Nora Huffer. Had he skipped out on his bail and changed his name to evade the law? Soon after the "white capper" incident, his parents moved to Mississippi. Did he skip out of town before his trial? His father's obituary in 1905 indicated that Ora was living in Ridgeland, Mississippi. By 1907 he had gone to Louisiana, possibly because he was working as a Pile Driver Engineer and Assistant Bridges Foreman for Illinois Central Railroad. His 1907 marriage license lists Ora's real last name as Cork. In 1910, Ora sold his inheritance from his Uncle Henry, and family tradition is that he and Mamie went to Rossville or Danville about that time. According to his daughter-in-law, Ora and his wife had a car in Hammond before his death - perhaps he bought the car with his inheritance from his uncle Henry C. Cork who died in 1909. His WWI draft registration listed his height as medium and his build as stout, and he had gray eyes and brown hair. Ora died suddenly at the age of 49 of a skull fracture, and his son Roy always told his family that a load of lumber was dropped on him. In fact, Ora was working at a company that made strawberry boxes when he was killed by a fall from a scaffold. Ora did not die immediately, and he was taken to Presbyterian Hospital in New Orleans where he died the next day. His body was returned to Hammond, LA via the Illinois Railroad on 14 Jul 1927 at 3pm.

On 27 Aug 1927, Mamie, a widow, bought property in Hammond, LA, probably with the inheritance from her husband's estate. Less than two years later, on 8 Apr 1929, a Sheriff's sale of that property was held. Most likely, she lost the property because she could not pay the taxes. Mamie then moved with her family to a rooming house, where she worked cleaning rooms. Family tradition is that she was part Indian. Roy Lee told his family that he was raised Catholic, so it is assumed that Mamie was Catholic. In 1946, the last time her daughter-in-law saw her, she wore her hair in a bun. The informant on Mamie's death certificate was her daughter, Mrs. Charles B. Archer (either Violet or Helen). Her address at death was 107 E. Morris St., Hammond, LA, and cause of death was Gastro-intestinal hemorrhage due to carcinoma of Cecum. Ora and Mamie are buried in Ponchatoula Cemetery, Hammond, LA.

1900 census, Danville Twp, Vermilion Co, IL: Ora Cook (20) was living with his sister Dora and brother-in-law John Huffer. Note: The fact that he is clearly listed in 1900 as "Cook" might mean that he was eluding the law by using his mother's maiden name.

1920 (Jan) census, Hammond, Tangipahoa Parish, LA: Ory Cook (40), his wife Mamie (38), and children Ory Jr. (10), William (8), Charles (4), and Helen L. (22 mos). Mamie's mother, Margaret Tilson (68) was also living with the family. It appears that they lived on S. Church St. with the Timmon family. Ora's occupation looks like Laborer, Railway.

1930 census, 100 Morris Ave, Hammond, LA: Mamie Cook (48), Ory, 21, Charles, 15, Helen, 12, Violet, 9, Roy Lee, 7 years old. Roomers were Jack Jells, Virginia, and his wife Ruth. Mamie was proprietor of the rooming house where rooms rented for \$25.00 per month.
