

Descendants of Noah Tipton I

Generation No. 1

1. NOAH¹ TIPTON I was born Abt. 1760, and died Bef. 1850 in Probably Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA. He married UNKNOWN. She was born in Ireland?.

Notes for NOAH TIPTON I:

According to one history of the Tipton clan, Noah Tipton, the immigrant landed at Baltimore, bought four horses and drove to Dry Ridge (now West End, Bedford Co, PA). Later he settled near Glen Savage, Somerset Co, PA, where he traded two of his horses for 400 acres of land. His wife was of Irish descent. The history written by Noah Tipton (1921) states this Noah had 3 sons and 2 daughters. Edward Tipton was in Bedford Co, PA for the 1800 census, but it is not known if Edward and this Noah Tipton were related. According to a letter dated 29 Aug 1977 from Rev. Ervin C. Tipton, James B. Tipton (my ancestor) was a descendant of Edward Tipton of Bedford Co, PA ("We Tiptons and Our Kin," pp. 1172-1173). A DNA project currently underway may help establish the connections between Tipton lines.

A study of census records for 1790, 1800, 1810, and 1820 shows no Noah Tipton living in Maryland or Pennsylvania. This fact makes me wonder if this Noah Tipton went by the name Thomas or William. Note that Noah Tipton II, born about 1800, had a son named Noah Thomas. In 1820, there were two Tipton families in Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: Thomas Tipton and William Tipton. The name Noah Tipton first appears in US census records in 1830 in Somerset Co, PA. He was age 30 - 40, which fits with the son of this man. Also in 1830, Thomas Tipton, aged 30 - 40, lived in Somerset Co, PA. The children of this Noah Tipton are not proven but I'm showing the ones listed here for ease in working on these Tiptons.

Charity's husband was probably a son of Jacob Burkhardt, who raised a large family in Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA. Jacob was a weaver and assessor.

1820 census, Allegheny, Somerset Co, PA: George Frazier (16-26) lived in between William and Thomas Tipton. His household included a boy (under 10), a girl (under 10), and his presumed wife, Nellie (16-26).

2. NOAH THOMAS² TIPTON (*NOAH*¹) was born Bet. 1790 - 1794 in Maryland?, and died Abt. 1865 in Elklick, Somerset Co, PA. He married CATHERINE BURKHART Abt. 1815 in PA, daughter of JACOB BURKHART. She was born Abt. 1794 in Alleghany Twp, Somerset Co, PA, and died July 1869 in Somerset Co, PA.

Notes for NOAH THOMAS TIPTON:

Thomas Tipton (Shoemaker) was listed on the 1790 census for Philadelphia, PA.
1800 census - no Tipton in Somerset Co, PA, but there was a Thomas Tipton in Northumberland Co, PA.
1810 census - no Tipton in Somerset Co, PA, but there was a Thomas Tipton in Northumberland Co, PA.
Tho. Tipton and Gerrard Tipton lived next door to each other in Baltimore, MD.
1812 tax list, Somerset Co, PA Thomas was living with William Tipton (his father???)
1814 Allegany Twp Tax Records show a Thomas Tipton, shoemaker; he could be Thomas' father.
1820 census, Somerset Co, PA: Thomas Tipton (age 26-45) with a boy (under 10) a girl (under 10) and presumed wife (26-45). Nearby was William Tipton (45+). William could be the father or brother of Thomas.
1830 census, Somerset Co, PA: Thomas Tipton, aged 30 - 40, with a boy aged 5 - 10, and 3 boys under 5. Nearby is Noah Tipton (30-40).
1840 census, Somerset Co, PA: Thomas Tipton, aged 50-60 with 4 boys under 20, a woman, aged 50-60, and 4 girls under 20. Nearby is Noah Tipton (40-50).
1850 census, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: Thomas Typton (56), Catherine, 56; William, 23; Amanda, 18; Charlotte, 12; Joseph, 10; Elizabeth, 26.
1860 census, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: Thomas Tipton (70) and wife Catherine (70). They lived next door to Joseph and Emeline Tipton, who lived next to Noah and Elizabeth Tipton. Real estate valued at \$1000 and property valued at \$238.

Conclusions from census records:

1. This Thomas Tipton was born between 1790 - 1800.
2. He had at least four sons and 4 daughters; two of the sons were William and Joseph and two daughters were Amanda and Charlotte. Perhaps a 3rd daughter was Elizabeth. Other presumed children shown on earlier census records are listed without names.
3. Thomas died between 1860 and 1870. Is there a tombstone in Somerset County, PA?
4. Because of Thomas' proximity to Noah Tipton in 1860, there was probably a family connection; possibly they were brothers.

More research is needed to prove the name of Thomas' father; it could be William Tipton.

In the Tipton Folder at the Meyersdale Library, Somerset Co, PA was a letter from Col. Thomas Melville Davis to Eber Cockly dated 7 Dec 1965. Davis was a descendant of Catherine Burkhart Tipton and he cited her will (Orphan's Court) written in Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA 13 Sept 1869. She left property to the children of Noah Tipton, deceased: John, Samuel, George, Mey E., Leonard, Lydia and Ammeline or Emma. Col. Davis' grandmother was Emma Louise (Emmeline).

Somerset Co. Deed Book 28, p. 139 records a transaction dated 1 Jan 1857 in which Thomas Tipton deeded all of his real estate and personal property to his wife Catherine for reasons having to do with financial interests of the family."

3. NOAH² TIPTON II (*NOAH*¹)^{1,2,3} was born Abt. 1800 in Dry Ridge, PA⁴, and died Abt. 1872 in Loran Twp, Stephenson Co, IL, age 72⁵. He married ELIZABETH W. WAGAMAN⁶ 1819 in Wellersburg Lutheran & Reformed Church in Wellersburg, Somerset Co, PA, daughter of PHILIP WAGAMAN and ANNA GREISHER. She was born December 17, 1799 in Londonderry Twp, Bedford Co, PA (now Fossilville) on Philip Wagaman's farm near the town of Bridgeport (Hyndman), and died Aft. 1880 in prob. Carroll Co, IL.

Notes for NOAH TIPTON II:

The history by Noah Tipton states that this Noah was born on Fraizer & Henry Hartage Farm in PA. "It is said that Noah came to PA via Maryland (Baltimore to Frederick to Bedford County, PA)" (source: Aimee Stout Benitez). The 1860 census shows that he was born in Maryland. He and Elizabeth settled at the Jacob Tipton place at what is known as the "old place." This is probably the same Noah Tipton who approved the will of Joseph Coughenour in Allegheny Twp in 1831. Again in 1833, Noah Tipton is listed with Samuel Cochenour as approvers of Henry Imhoff's will in Alleghaney Twp. He attended Shaffer Lutheran Church, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA. Noah moved to northern Illinois with other members of his family in about 1863 to escape the Civil War. There were several Tiptons already in Illinois by then. The newspaper obituary of James B. Tipton states that his father lived to the age of 72 and that he was a farmer. Is there a tombstone for Noah Tipton in Illinois?

1830 census, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: Noah Tipton with 3 boys and 1 girl plus his wife.

1840 census, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: Noah Tipton with 4 males and 4 females in the family.

1850 census, Londonderry Twp, Bedford Co, PA: Noah Tipton (49), farmer, Elizabeth (50), James (23), William (21), Samuel (15), Noah (8), Cordela (18), Mary Ann (14), Elizabeth 7). Property valued at \$2000.

1860 census, Londonderry, Bedford Co, PA: Noah Tipton (60), wife Elizabeth (60), Noah (21), and Elizabeth (17).

1870 census, Yellow Creek PO, Loran, Stephenson Co, IL: Noah (70) and Elizabeth (71) Tipton were living with their daughter Mary Ann, her husband Jacob Cook and their 4 children.

Notes for ELIZABETH W. WAGAMAN:

Since Elizabeth was only about 10 years old when her father's estate was settled, the court appointed Richard Baker, Esqr. as her guardian on the petition of her mother, Mary. Elizabeth, and occasionally her husband Noah, attended the church of her parents and siblings, called Wills Creek (now Lybarger Lutheran).

1880 census, Cherry Grove, Carroll Co, IL: Elizabeth (80) was living with her daughter Mary Ann and her husband, Jacob Cook.

4. NOAH³ TIPTON (*NOAH THOMAS*², *NOAH*¹) was born Abt. 1827 in Buffalo Mills, Harrison Twp, Bedford Co, PA, and died 1865 in Buffalo Mills, Bedford Co, PA, buried in Burkett Cemetery, Fairhope Twp. He married ELIZABETH MAY October 01, 1848 in Bedford Co, PA by Joseph Dull⁷, daughter of LEONARD MAY and MARIA YOUNGKIN. She was born August 25, 1829 in Schellsburg, PA, and died July 14, 1883 in Bedford Co, PA.

Notes for NOAH TIPTON:

1850 census, Harrison, Bedford Co, PA: Noah (26) and Elizabeth (21) Tipton with son John (7) and Liddy Burkert (21?). Noah was a farmer.

1860 census, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: Noah Tipton (28), Elizabeth L. (25), John L. (11), James (9), Samuel (7), Charles (5), George (3), and Elizabeth (4 mos). Noah was listed as a farmer with real estate valued at \$200 and property at \$100. They lived next door to brother, Joseph and parents.

1870 census, Manns Choice, Harrison, Bedford Co, PA; Elizabeth (39) and Daniel (57) Metzgar with their daughter Elizabeth (3m). Also in the household were Elizabeth's children from her 1st marriage, Leonard (8) and Emaline (4). Her other children must have been living with relatives. For example, I found Elizabeth Tipton (8) living in Juniata Twp with John L. May (35), probably a brother of Elizabeth May. I also found George Tipton (13) in Juniata, living with Leonard (71) and Catherine (68) May, Elizabeth's parents.

1880 census - No Elizabeth Metzger in Bedford or Somerset Co, PA.

Noah was mustered into the military 26 Sept 1864 and mustered out of Co. G, 61st Regiment, PA Infantry on 20 June 1865 at the rank of Private. He had served 8 months, 24 days (source: Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA, 1906 County History, Somerset). Noah's will was probated 20 Sept 1869 with Abraham Shaffer named guardian of the minor children (source: Jeanne Houston, 2003). He is buried 1/4 mile west of the Grenke Farm, Somerset Co, PA or in the Hyndman Cemetery. Information at the Meyersdale Library gave two conflicting burial sites.

She married JOHN GROVE Abt. 1855 in Prob. Somerset Co, PA. He was born Abt. 1830 in PA, and died Bet. 1880 - 1900 in Prob. Somerset Co, PA.

Notes for AMANDA TIPTON:

1860 census, Berlin PO, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: John Grove (31), Amanda (24), and children Ann C. (4), John (2), and Amanda (6 mos). They had real estate valued at \$60. Next door was Mary Burkard (50) with 4 children.

1870 census, Millersbury, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: John Grove (42), wife Amanda (34), Catherine (17), Wilson (17), Gamima (10), Emoline (8), John (4). John was listed as a laborer.

1880 census, Southampton, Somerset Co, PA: John (50) and Manda (40) Grove with children Ellamina (19), Emma A. (18), John C. (14), and Susan (12). John's occupation was Laborer on R.R. and John's was "cooks in ____."

1900 census, Elk Lick Twp, Somerset Co, PA: Amanda Grove (65) lived with her daughter Emma Deniker.

She was born July 1843 in PA, and died April 22, 1904 in Fairhope, Somerset Co, PA, buried in Burkhart Burial Ground¹⁰.

1860 census, Allegheny Twp, Berlin PO, Somerset Co, PA: Joseph Tipton (22) and wife Emeline (14), next door to his father.

1870 census, Wellersburg PO, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: Joseph (30) and Emoline (20) Tipton with children Charles (4) and Ida B. (2). He was a farmer with property valued at \$200 and \$100.

1880 census, Allegheny, Somerset Co, PA: Joseph (40) and Emeline (38) Tipton with children Charles (14), Ann (9), and Flora (2). Nearby, Belle Tipton (12) was a servant in the home of Wm Coughenour (45). She is probably Joseph's daughter, Ida B.

1900 census, Fairhope, Somerset Co, PA: Joseph (65) and Emaline M. (56) Tipton with son Charles B. (34) and two grandsons: Clark Baker (9) and William H. Bare (6). Joseph was a day laborer who had been out of work 6 months; Charles was a brickyard laborer and he had been out of work 3 months. This record shows they had been married 39 years and she had 17 children, with 3 still living.

1910 census - not found and presumed deceased. Charles Tipton (42) was listed in Fairhope with a female servant and Oliver F. Baker (6) listed as his son.

7. JACOB³ TIPTON (*NOAH*², *NOAH*¹) was born October 09, 1820 in PA, and died January 19, 1903 in PA at the age of 82y, 8m, 10d, buried in Shaffer Lutheran Church, Glen Savage, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA¹⁰. He married LUCINDA COUGHENOUR 1844 in Isaac Darr place, PA by Squire Koon, daughter of SAMUEL COUGHENOUR and ELIZABETH SHROYER. She was born August 05, 1823 in PA, and died February 04, 1891 in PA at the age of 67y, 5m, 29d, buried in Shaffer Lutheran Church, Glen Savage, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA¹⁰.

Notes for JACOB TIPTON:

According to his son Noah, Jacob had very little opportunity to attend school. The longest period he went was 27 days, at which time he boarded with a relative. He and Lucinda moved to the old house at the "old place" previously lived in by his grandfather, later moving down where the buildings now stand. Just enough land was cleared for the house and other buildings. Game was plentiful, and deer foxes and other animals were often seen from the house. In the year 1833 when he was 13, it is said that he was out in the field and saw the falling of the stars (source: Hazel Keim Warner). They lived in Glen Savage (established 1805), Allegheny Twp, located in the county next to Bedford Co. PA. Jacob is listed in Allegheny Twp, PA in 1860. They attended a Lutheran Church.

1850 census, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA (p. 151): Jacob Tipton (29), Lucinda (24), Noah (4), Elizabeth (3), Rachel (3 mos).

1860 census, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: Jacob Tipton (40), wife Lucinda (37), and 7 children, Noah (15), Elizabeth (13), Rachel (11), Samuel (9), John (5), Ellen (3), and James (7 mos).

1870 census, Wellersburg, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: Jacob Tipton (49), wife Lucinda (46) and children

1880 census, Allegheny Twp, Somerset Co, PA: Jacob (59) and Lucinda (56) Tipton with children James (20), Annie R. (18), and Emma (15). Their grandson, James Cook (7) lived with them. Jacob was a farmer and James worked on the farm.

Notes for JOSEPH STUDEBAKER:

Joseph lived at the Josiah Coughenour place in Pennsylvania, but sold it about 1852 and moved to Illinois. Census records show that his daughter Mary was born 1853 in IL so we know he was there by that year. His previous child was born in PA.

1850 census, Harrison, Bedford Co, PA: Joseph Studabecker (22), farmer, Jemimah (24), Ephraim (2), and Elisa (6 mos). Next door to them was Henry Studabecker (29), possibly a brother of Joseph.

1860 census, Cherry Grove, Carroll Co, IL: Joseph Studebaker (33), Jamimah Studebaker (28) and their children Ephraim (12), Elijah (11), Noah (8), Mary (6), and Nancy (1). Real estate was valued at \$1505. The Jacob Royer family is shown living in the same household that year with real estate valued at \$1200.

1870 census, Kent, Stephenson Co, IL: Joseph Studebaker (42), farmer, Jemima Studebaker (47), and their children Ephraim (23), Elisa (20), Noah (18), and Jacob (8). They had a servant Rosina Ophankeiser (18) living in the household, indicating some wealth. Their real estate was worth \$8300 and personal property was valued at \$2200, showing that they were very wealthy for the times.

1880 census: Joseph was not found - his wife had died two years earlier and two of his sons had moved to Kansas. His son, Noah, was living in Jefferson, Stephenson Co, IL and the census record shows a father "George" (54) and a brother Jacob (18). This George is probably Joseph Studebaker.

9. JAMES B. "JIM"³ TIPTON (*NOAH*², *NOAH*¹) was born March 13, 1826 in Somerset Co, PA¹⁴, and died July 26, 1896 in Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS age 70. He married (1) MARY ELLEN HILL November 04, 1850 in PA prob. Bedford County¹⁴, daughter of JACOB HILL and ROSENA BYER. She was born May 18, 1827 in Bedford Co, PA, and died March 25, 1885 in South Reeder Twp, Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS age 58¹⁵. He married (2) MRS. M. J. MCCONAGHY October 15, 1887 in Anderson Co, KS¹⁶. She was born Abt. 1835, and died Aft. 1896.

Notes for JAMES B. "JIM" TIPTON:

In her Hill Family History, Hazel Keim Warner wrote, Jim's father was a farmer, and the "advantages of schooling were meager for all of the youth of their day. They attended a log school house with a huge fireplace in one end. The seats were made from logs split in two parts with holes bored for legs. The terms were from two and half to three months. They studied arithmetic, spelling, writing, and used the Bible as textbook for reading. The teachers' wages were from 9 - 10 dollars per month. The teacher was congenial enough to board around among his patrons most of the time. To these same rude structures used for instruction of the children, the people would gather to hear the earnest circuit rider preach the word of God." Jim and Ellen set up housekeeping at the Beckonire place (Hyndman, PA?). They built a house that stood along the road, that is now gone. "Grandfather [James B] Tipton moved to Hyndman, Bedford County, PA when he was a young man (about 1845) and lived there for 16 years before bringing his family overland in a covered wagon with two teams and effects to Northern Illinois in 1863. Family legend holds that before they left Bedford County, he told his sons to put their ears to the ground to hear the guns of Gettysburg. They moved west to avoid the fighting of the Civil War, and they moved on to Anderson County, Kansas in 1865. He sold property on February 10, 1860 in Harrison Twp, Bedford Co, PA for \$1300.00 (source: Bedford County PA Courthouse Records, Records Office, Deed located in 1973 by Helen Tipton Ritchey). The farm homestead was three and a half miles north and a half mile west of Westphalia " (source: Hazel Keim Warner). It is said that Jim was the first settler in Westphalia (source: Jeane Tipton). James and his wife are buried in Cherry Mound Cemetery, KS. His will was probated in August 1896 in Anderson Co, KS. His cause of death was "Dropsy."

1880 census, South Reeder, Anderson Co, KS, near the Kellerman, Studebaker, and Corley families: James Tipton (53), wife Ellen (52), and children William (25), Anna (21), Sybert (18), Charles (15), Edith (14), John (11).

Notes for MARY ELLEN HILL:

On a list of baptisms in the Old Log Church, Schellsburg, PA (Vol. IV., p. 75) she was listed as Mary Elanora. She and her brother James were both baptised 3 May 1830.

1850 census (October), Harrison Twp, Bedford Co, PA: Ellen Hefferty (25) lived in the household of Moses Laferty (34) and his 4 children ages 9-1. This could be Mary Ellen Hill except that her 1 year old daughter, Mary, is not listed.

Note: A little over a month after this census was taken, Mary Ellen Hill Halferty married James B. Tipton, who lived in the Dry Ridge area of Londonderry Twp, which touches on Harrison Twp to the north. I was not able to identify the exact location of Dry Ridge but was told it was near West End, which is in Juniata Twp. Did Ellen and James Tipton attend the same church? Her father was buried at Trinity Reformed Church on Glade Pike, in Juniata Twp, so it's reasonable to assume she also attended church there.

James B. Tipton & wife (of Juniata Twp) sold land to Adam Shirer (of Southampton Twp, Somerset Co) - Indenture dated 13 Nov 1863

101 acres was sold for \$800.00. The land record shows that James B. Tipton and wife purchased the land on 28 Apr 1860 from Noah Tipton and wife. Added to the record was the following:

Bedford County

On the 13th day of November 1863 personally appear before the undersigned a Justice of the Peace in and for said County of Bedford, Mary Ellen Tipton named in the foregoing instrument of ___ and acknowledged the same to be her act and __ and desiring it to be recorded as such. The said Mary Ellen Tipton being of full age and being by me privately examined separate and apart from her said husband and the full contents of the said instrument being by me fully made known to her acknowledged that she executed the same freely and voluntarily and without any coercion or compulsion from her said husband. Signed by James C. Devore, J.P. (Book AK, page 87)

Notes for MRS. M. J. MCCONAGHY:

Mrs. McConaghy could be the mother of Mary A. McConaghy (1871-1946) who married Charles S. Gammon. Their daughter, Delore Opal Gammon (1899-1981) must have been well known to my grandmother, Opal Keim. On the back of Delore's picture, Opal had written "Delore Gammon, cousin Wichita Kans." If I'm correct, Delore's step-grandfather was James B. Tipton. I have not been able to find her on the 1900 census.

She married JOHN CRIPE KEIM December 24, 1885 in near Westphalia, KA by Rev. J.K. Spencer⁵¹, son of TOBIAS KEIM and ANNA DOMER. He was born January 07, 1857 in Across the street from the Warner farm near Goshen, Elkhart Co, IN⁵², and died June 18, 1927 in Gravois Mills, Morgan Co, MO, buried in Cherry Mound Cemetery, Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS.

Notes for ANNA AMELIA "ANNIE" TIPTON:

Anna Tipton's newspaper obituary states her birthdate was 22 May 1860. Anna Tipton's daughter Opal wrote the following: "Things I remember my mother telling about her early life. She was born May 22, 1859. She attended country school at Cherry Mound [Kansas] N. of Westphalia. Also a United Brethren church (she attended & a long time member) that was close by the school with a cemetery, north, across the road where she, my father, grandparents Mr. & Mrs. James Tipton, uncles, aunts & our only brother who was 6 mos. old when he died of whooping cough. My mother was about 4-5 years old when her parents older brothers & sisters came by covered wagon from Penns. when they crossed the river at St. Louis by barge. She & her older brother Will were in back of wagon where they could see out when they were pointing their fingers at the first black man they had ever seen. When he spied them he said something to them. They were scared & got back in wagon where he couldn't see them. When she was a young woman her father sent her to Rich Hill, MO [in 1880] to attend a school for dressmakers. After she finished the course there she came back to Westphalia and she had a shop where she did dressmaking and the friend [Amelia] had a millinery store. She & my father were married on Christmas Eve at my grandparents home. Before marriage she had taken care of a half sister Mary Halferty who died of consumption [1880], which in our time has been called tuberculosis. When my sister Madge was 6 weeks old, April 1887, she took her on a train to Western Kans. where my father had gone some time before and took up land (claim it was

called), built a sod house. This was in Logan County" (Handwritten by Opal Keim Haymaker, March 1977).

Family legend is that during the Civil War, when Anna was only about 4 years old, the family moved to northern Illinois to get away from the fighting. Two years later, in 1865, they moved on to Anderson Co. Kansas to a farm about 3 miles north of Westphalia. Anna had 2 older brothers and an older sister, as well as 3 younger brothers and a younger sister. Anna's granddaughter Mary told this story: When Hazel was a baby, the family lived in a sod house in western Kansas. Anna entered the sod house only to find a snake crawling on the ceiling, right above baby Hazel's cradle. Opal told her granddaughter, Mary Lou, that Anna was an extraordinary dressmaker, and that Anna could look at a dress in the store, and then go home and replicate the dress without a pattern. The family of Mary L. Haymaker (Opal Keim's daughter) still has a pink and white quilt made by Anna.

It is interesting to consider the early life of Anna Tipton because she actually went to school and took up an occupation before marriage after age 26, which was fairly late for those times. I wonder if she thought she would not marry. Earlier, Anna had nursed her older half-sister, Mary Halverty, who died of consumption (tuberculosis), and Anna began to show symptoms of the disease. She had her share of other losses as her mother died in March 1885, the year she married, and her father died the next year. Anna had begun to show signs of consumption, so she took the train to western Kansas, Logan Co. near Russell Springs when her daughter Madge was 6 weeks old. The move to Kansas was thought to be advantageous for TB (called consumption at that time). She and her family lived at the Tipton homestead in Westphalia, KS for several years after her father died, and they were still there when the 1900 census was taken. By 1910, they had moved to Iola as her husband made a change from farming to hotel operation. Anna had a good singing voice, according to Gen Warner - friends would say "strike up a tune Annie."

After her husband died, she stayed for a while with her Aunt Minnie Tipton. She also spent time at all of her daughters' homes, but seemed to prefer the Warner Farm, just outside Goshen IN, probably because there was always work to be done there. From her obituary: "The writer has known the deceased well and favorably since 1884. He has always known her as a most excellent, admirable woman, always frugal and just, and one who never spoke ill of anyone. As a wife and mother there were no better, and with it was always the truest neighbor and friend. Everyone who knew her was her friend, and that is saying a great deal for or of anyone. Yes, she will be greatly missed by her family and large circle of friends..."

Notes for JOHN CRIPE KEIM:

John's family moved from Holmes Co, OH to Elkhart Co, Indiana in 1846, and John was born on a farm near Goshen. That farm is across the road from the current Warner farm, owned by his descendants. He and his twin brother were the 7th and 8th children in a large family. John's parents spoke German in the home, and he learned English only after he attended school. He had a twin brother named Sam, but as adults they were not close, since Sam lived in Dannebrog, Nebraska. John attended Valparaiso College, a teachers college, for a year. Afterwards, he taught for several years in Millersburg, IN (near Goshen). The 1880 census shows that he was age 23, still living with his parents, and teaching school. If we assume he taught in Millersburg from about 1876 - 1880, we are left with a period of time from 1881 - 1885 when nothing is known about his life, but it's likely he was teaching and farming. A note in the handwriting of Mary H. West shows that he moved to Kansas in 1884, but it is not known why he left Indiana. I wonder if he moved with a relative or friend? His uncle, Jacob S. Keim (brother of Tobias Keim) was in Westphalia in 1900 as were several other Keim families.

After marriage in 1885, at age 28, he taught and farmed in Kansas. John C. Keim moved to western Kansas (Logan Co) with his wife Anna Amelia Tipton in about 1888. They lived in a sod house in Western Kansas for a time, and the two youngest children were born there. John was a member of the United Brethren Church. The family moved back to eastern Kansas, Westphalia, in 1896 after Anna's father died, and they lived on the Tipton homestead until the early 1900's. Did Mrs. McConnaghy Tipton live with them after James B. Tipton died?

1900 census, Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS: John C. Keim (43), farmer, Anna A. Keim (40), and their daughters Madge (12), Opal (8), and Hazel (6). They also had a border named Theodore Woodsworth

living in the house. The family moved to Chanute in Neosho Co, KS after 1900. For a time John lived in Iola, Kansas and sold insurance.

1910 census, [Iola?] Allen Co, Kansas: J.C. Keim (53) real estate, Anna Keim (51), Opal Keim (18), doing housework in office, Hazel Keim (16), hotel waitress. There were three borders listed with the family including Opal's future husband, Harry Haymaker (19). They lived one block off the main street in a house that is still standing.

1920 US census, Iola, Allen Co, KS: J.C. Keim (62) and Anna Keim (59) and one male "roomer" (T625_522, p. 1404).

In 1912, at age 55, John was proprietor of the Manhattan Hotel in Iola (source: Allen Co. sections of the Polk's Kansas State Gazetteer and Business Directory, Vol XII, 1912). According to his obituary, John was a member of the I.O.O.F. (Odd Fellows) in Iola and of the Modern Woodsmen (a fraternal organization) for many years.

From a newspaper article following his death: Near the end of his life, John and Anna moved to Gravois Mills, MO and bought a small farm. He also took on duties as an overseer of land adjoining his. John had been selling timber for crossties to William B. Moore, but there had been disputes between the two. Moore, with a gun in his pocket, came to the site of the lumber and found the gate locked with a note posting no entrance. Moore went through the gate, in spite of Keim's warnings. The 70 year old Keim threw some rocks at Moore, who shot him once just above the left eye, killing him instantly. Moore was released on bail but a handwritten note on the copy of the newspaper clipping stated that Moore was found "not guilty" (Versailles, MO, "Statesman", 23 June 1927).

John's granddaughter, Mary, remembers her mother traveling by train, with sister Elsa and brother Harry "Bud," to John Keim's funeral in 1927. He is buried at Cherry Mound Cemetery, north of Westphalia, Anderson Co, KS. John is 5779 in the book DJH and 13884 in DBH & CS.
